AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPENSATION OF ELECTIVE OFFICERS; AMENDING SECTION 59-501, 2 IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR ELECTIVE OFFICERS COMMENCING 3 4 ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2011 UNTIL THE FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2012, TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR ELECTIVE OFFICERS COMMENCING ON THE 5 FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2012 UNTIL THE FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2013, 6 TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR THE GOVERNOR AND TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION 7 FOR CERTAIN OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICERS AS A PERCENTAGE OF THE GOVERNOR'S 8 COMPENSATION COMMENCING ON THE FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2013 UNTIL THE 9 FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2014, TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR THE GOVERNOR 10 AND TO PROVIDE COMPENSATION FOR CERTAIN OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICERS AS 11 A PERCENTAGE OF THE GOVERNOR'S COMPENSATION COMMENCING ON THE FIRST 12 MONDAY IN JANUARY 2014 UNTIL THE FIRST MONDAY IN JANUARY 2015. 13

15 SECTION 1. That Section 59-501, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 16 amended to read as follows:

59-501. SALARIES OF STATE ELECTIVE OFFICERS -- REGULAR PAYMENT - TRAVELING EXPENSES -- FEES PROPERTY OF STATE. (1) The governor, lieutenant
 governor, secretary of state, state controller, state treasurer, attorney
 general and superintendent of public instruction shall, during their con tinuance in office, receive for their services compensation as follows:

22 Commencing on the first Monday in January 2002 2011, until the first 23 Monday in January 2007 2012:

24 Governor, \$<del>101,500</del> <u>110,734</u> per annum;

25 Lieutenant governor, \$26,750 29,184 per annum;

26 Secretary of state, \$<del>82,500</del> <u>90,006</u> per annum;

27 State controller, \$<del>82,500</del> <u>90,006</u> per annum; said salary compensation to 28 be audited by the legislative council;

29 Attorney general, \$<del>91,500</del> <u>99,825</u> per annum;

30 State treasurer, \$<del>82,500</del> <u>90,006</u> per annum; and

State superintendent of public instruction, \$<del>82,500</del> 90,006 per annum.

32 (2) The governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state con-

33 troller, state treasurer, attorney general and superintendent of public in-

34 struction shall, during their continuance in office, receive for their ser-35 vices compensation as follows:

36 <u>Commencing on the first Monday in January 2012, until the first Monday</u> 37 <u>in January 2013:</u>

Governor, \$115,348 per annum;

40 Secretary of state, \$93,756 per annum;

4	(3) Commencing on the first Monday in January 2007 2013, until the first
5	Monday in January 2014, the salary then in effect for governor shall receive
6	for his services compensation of \$117,000 per annum; and each officer named
7	in subsection $(\frac{12}{2})$ of this section shall be increased by four percent (4%)
8	per annum, and then again by three percent (3%) per annum on each of the first
9	Mondays in January of 2008, 2009 and 2010, except for the governor, shall re-
10	ceive the following compensation for their services:
11	Lieutenant governor, thirty percent (30%) of the governor's compensa-
12	tion as provided for in this subsection, per annum;
13	Secretary of state, eighty-five percent (85%) of the governor's compen-
14	sation as provided for in this subsection, per annum;
15	State controller, eighty-five percent (85%) of the governor's compen-
16	sation as provided for in this subsection, per annum; said compensation to be
17	audited by the legislative council;
18	Attorney general, ninety percent (90%) of the governor's compensation
19	as provided for in this subsection, per annum;
20	State treasurer, eighty-five percent (85%) of the governor's compensa-
21	tion as provided for in this subsection, per annum; and
22	State superintendent of public instruction, eighty-five percent (85%)
23	of the governor's compensation as provided for in this subsection, per an-
24	num.
25	(4) Commencing on the first Monday in January 2014, until the first Mon-
26	day in January 2015, the governor shall receive for his services compensa-
27	tion of \$119,000 per annum; and each officer named in subsection (3) of this
28	section, except for the governor, shall receive the following compensation
29	for their services:
30	Lieutenant governor, thirty percent (30%) of the governor's compensa-
31	tion as provided for in this subsection, per annum;
32	Secretary of state, eighty-five percent (85%) of the governor's compen-
33	sation as provided for in this subsection, per annum;
34	State controller, eighty-five percent (85%) of the governor's compen-
35	sation as provided for in this subsection, per annum; said compensation to be
36	audited by the legislative council;
37	Attorney general, ninety percent (90%) of the governor's compensation
38	as provided for in this subsection, per annum;
39	State treasurer, eighty-five percent (85%) of the governor's compensa-
40	tion as provided for in this subsection, per annum; and
41	State superintendent of public instruction, eighty-five percent (85%)
42	of the governor's compensation as provided for in this subsection, per an-
43	num.
44	$(\frac{3}{5})$ Such compensation shall be paid on regular pay periods as due out
45	of the state treasury, and shall be in full for all services by said officers
46	respectively rendered in any official capacity or employment whatever dur-
47	ing their respective terms of office; but no increase in the rate of compen-
48	sation shall be made during the terms of such officers; provided, however,
49	that the actual and necessary expenses of the governor, lieutenant governor,
50	secretary of state, attorney general, state controller, state treasurer,

and superintendent of public instruction while traveling within the state,
or between points within the state, in the performance of official duties,
shall be allowed and paid by the state; not however, exceeding such sum as
shall be appropriated for such purpose.

5 (46) Actual and necessary subsistence expenses of the governor while
6 traveling in connection with the performance of official duties are hereby
7 expressly exempted from the provisions of sections 67-2007 and 67-2008,
8 Idaho Code. (Standard Travel Pay and Allowance Act of 1949).

9 (57) No officer named in this section shall receive, for the perfor10 mance of any official duty any fee for his own use, but all fees fixed by law
11 for the performance by either of them, of any official duty, shall be col12 lected in advance and deposited with the state treasurer to the credit of the
13 state.
