2 RELATING TO THE IDAHO REAL ESTATE APPRAISERS ACT; AMENDING SECTION 54-4113,  
3 IDAHO CODE, TO GRANT THE REAL ESTATE APPRAISER BOARD THE AUTHORITY TO  
4 COLLECT CONTINUING EDUCATION PROVIDER APPLICATION FEES AND TO MAKE A  
5 TECHNICAL CORRECTION.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

7 SECTION 1. That Section 54-4113, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby  
8 amended to read as follows:

9 54-4113. FEES -- ISSUANCE OF LICENSES OR CERTIFICATES. (1) Every per-  
10 son applying for examination or reexamination under this chapter shall pay  
11 a fee equal to that charged by the national examining entity. If the result  
12 of the examination of any applicant shall be satisfactory to the board, under  
13 its rules, it shall issue to such applicant a license or certificate setting  
14 forth the fact that he is a state licensed or certified real estate appraiser  
15 and authorized to practice his profession in this state. The fee for obtain-  
16 ing a license or certificate under the provisions of this chapter shall be an  
17 amount not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500). The annual fee for renewal  
18 or reinstatement of a license or certificate shall be an amount not to exceed  
19 five hundred dollars (\$500), which shall be paid to the bureau. The board  
20 shall adopt all fees by rule.

21 (2) In addition to those fees described ~~above~~ in this section, the board  
22 may collect from applicants for licensure or certification and holders of  
23 state licenses or certificates of appraisal and remit to the appropriate  
24 agency or instrumentality of the federal government, any additional fees as  
25 may be required to render Idaho state licensed residential, certified resi-  
26 dential and general real estate appraisers eligible to perform appraisals in  
27 connection with federally-related transactions.

28 (3) The board may collect continuing education provider application  
29 fees in an amount not to exceed one hundred dollars (\$100) as established by  
30 board rule.
