HOUSE BILL NO. 315

AN ACT

1 RELATING TO EDUCATION; REPEALING SECTION 33-515B, IDAHO CODE, AS ADDED BY  
2 SECTION 6 OF SENATE BILL NO. 1108, AS ENACTED BY THE FIRST REGULAR SES-  
3 SION OF THE SIXTY-FIRST IDAHO LEGISLATURE, RELATING TO REDUCED ENROLL-  
4 MENT, CONTRACT TERMINATION AND SEVERANCE STIPEND; AND AMENDING SECTION  
5 33-1003, IDAHO CODE, AS AMENDED IN SECTION 12 OF SENATE BILL NO. 1108,  
6 AS ENACTED BY THE FIRST REGULAR SESSION OF THE SIXTY-FIRST IDAHO LEGIS-  
7 LATURE, TO PROVIDE FOR SPECIAL APPLICATIONS OF EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PRO-  
8 GRAM DURING THE PERIOD JULY 1, 2011, THROUGH JUNE 30, 2012.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

11 SECTION 1. That Section 33-515B, Idaho Code, as added by Section 6 of  
12 Senate Bill No. 1108, First Regular Session of the Sixty-first Idaho Legis-  
13 lature, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

14 SECTION 2. That Section 33-1003, Idaho Code, as amended in Section 12 of  
15 Senate Bill No. 1108, as enacted by the First Regular Session of the Sixty-  
16 first Idaho Legislature, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as fol-  
17 lows:

18 33-1003. SPECIAL APPLICATIONS OF EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT PRO-  
19 GRAM. (1) Decrease in Average Daily Attendance for 2011-2012 School Year.  
20 -- For any school district which has a decrease in total average daily  
21 attendance of three percent (3%) or more of its average daily attendance  
22 in the 2011-2012 school year from the total average daily attendance used  
23 for determining the allowance in the educational support program for the  
24 2010-2011 school year, the allowance of funds from the educational support  
25 program may be based on the average daily attendance of the 2010-2011 school  
26 year, less three percent (3%). When this provision is applied, the decrease  
27 in average daily attendance shall be proportionately distributed among the  
28 various categories of support units that are appropriate for the district.  
29 The legislature hereby encourages boards of trustees to actively pursue  
30 alternative funding to offset any reduction in funds stemming from the  
31 application of the provisions of this subsection (1). The provisions of this  
32 subsection (1) shall be null and void and of no force and effect on and after  
33 July 1, 2012.

34 (2) Application of Support Program to Separate Schools/Attendance  
35 Units in District.

36 (a) Separate Elementary School. -- Any separate elementary school  
37 shall be allowed to participate in the educational support program as  
38 though the school were the only elementary school operated by the dis-  
39 trict.

40 (b) Hardship Elementary School. -- Upon application of the board of  
41 trustees of a school district, the state board of education is empow-

1       ered to determine that a given elementary school or elementary schools  
2       within the school district, not otherwise qualifying, are entitled  
3       to be counted as a separate elementary school as defined in section  
4       33-1001, Idaho Code, when, in the discretion of the state board of edu-  
5       cation, special conditions exist warranting the retention of the school  
6       as a separate attendance unit and the retention results in a substantial  
7       increase in cost per pupil in average daily attendance above the average  
8       cost per pupil in average daily attendance of the remainder of the dis-  
9       trict's elementary grade school pupils. An elementary school operating  
10      as a previously approved hardship elementary school shall continue to  
11      be considered as a separate attendance unit, unless the hardship status  
12      of the elementary school is rescinded by the state board of education.

13      (c) Separate Secondary School. -- Any separate secondary school shall  
14      be allowed to participate in the educational support program as though  
15      the school were the only secondary school operated by the district.

16      (d) Elementary/Secondary School Attendance Units. -- Elementary  
17      grades in an elementary/secondary school will be funded as a separate  
18      attendance unit if all elementary grades served are situated more than  
19      ten (10) miles distance from both the nearest like elementary grades  
20      within the same school district and from the location of the office  
21      of the superintendent of schools of such district, or from the office  
22      of the chief administrative officer of such district if the district  
23      employs no superintendent of schools. Secondary grades in an elemen-  
24      tary/secondary school will be funded as a separate attendance unit if  
25      all secondary grades served are located more than fifteen (15) miles by  
26      an all-weather road from the nearest like secondary grades operated by  
27      the district.

28      (e) Hardship Secondary School. -- Any district which operated two (2)  
29      secondary schools separated by less than fifteen (15) miles, but which  
30      district was created through consolidation subsequent to legislative  
31      action pursuant to chapter 111, laws of 1947, and which school buildings  
32      were constructed prior to 1935, shall be entitled to count the schools  
33      as separate attendance units.

34      (f) Minimum Pupils Required. -- Any elementary school having less than  
35      ten (10) pupils in average daily attendance shall not be allowed to par-  
36      ticipate in the state or county support program unless the school has  
37      been approved for operation by the state board of education.

38      (23) Remote Schools. -- The board of trustees of any Idaho school dis-  
39      trict which operates and maintains a school which is remote and isolated from  
40      the other schools of the state because of geographical or topographical con-  
41      ditions may petition the state board of education to recognize and approve  
42      the school as a remote and necessary school. The petition shall be in form  
43      and content approved by the state board of education and shall provide such  
44      information as the state board of education may require. Petitions for the  
45      recognition of a school as a remote and necessary school shall be filed annu-  
46      ally at least ninety (90) days prior to the date of the annual meeting of the  
47      board of trustees as established in section 33-510, Idaho Code.

48      Within forty-five (45) days after the receipt of a petition for the  
49      recognition of a remote and necessary school, the state board of educa-  
50      tion shall either approve or disapprove the petition and notify the board

1 of trustees of its decision. Schools which the state board of education  
2 approves as being necessary and remote shall be allowed adequate funding  
3 within the support program for an acceptable educational program for the  
4 students of the school. In the case of a remote and necessary secondary  
5 school, grades 7-12, the educational program shall be deemed acceptable  
6 when, in the opinion of the state board of education, the accreditation stan-  
7 dard relating to staff size, established in accordance with section 33-119,  
8 Idaho Code, has been met. The final determination of an acceptable program  
9 and adequate funding in the case of a remote and necessary elementary school  
10 shall be made by the state board of education.

11 (~~34~~) Support Program When District Boundaries are Changed.

12 (a) In new districts formed by the division of a district, the support  
13 program computed for the district, divided in its last year of opera-  
14 tion, shall be apportioned to the new districts created by the division,  
15 in the proportion that the average daily attendance of pupils, elemen-  
16 tary and secondary combined, residing in the area of each new district  
17 so created, is to the average daily attendance of all pupils, elementary  
18 and secondary combined, in the district divided in its last year of op-  
19 eration before the division.

20 (b) When boundaries of districts are changed by excision or annexation  
21 of territory, the support program of any district from which territory  
22 is excised for the last year of operation before such excision shall be  
23 divided, and apportioned among the districts involved, as prescribed in  
24 paragraph (a) of this subsection.

25 (c) In new districts formed by consolidation of former districts after  
26 January 1, 2007, the support program allowance, for a seven (7) year pe-  
27 riod following the formation of the new district, shall not be less than  
28 the combined support program allowances of the component districts in  
29 the last year of operation before consolidation. After the expiration  
30 of this period, the state department of education shall annually cal-  
31 culate the number of support units that would have been generated had  
32 the previous school districts not consolidated. All applicable state  
33 funding to the consolidated district shall then be provided based on a  
34 support unit number that is halfway between this figure and the actual  
35 support units, provided that it cannot be less than the actual support  
36 units.
