2 IDAHO CODE, TO DEFINE A TERM, TO REVISE A DEFINITION AND TO REMOVE A CODE
3 REFERENCE; AMENDING SECTION 18-1507, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE LEGISLATIVE
4 FINDINGS, TO REMOVE A DEFINITION, TO REVISE A DEFINITION, TO REVISE
5 PROVISIONS RELATING TO SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF A CHILD AND PENALTIES
6 AND TO MAKE A TECHNICAL CORRECTION; REPEALING SECTION 18-1507A, IDAHO
7 CODE, RELATING TO POSSESSION OF SEXUALLY EXPLOITATIVE MATERIAL FOR
8 OTHER THAN A COMMERCIAL PURPOSE; AMENDING SECTION 18-8304, IDAHO CODE,
9 TO REMOVE A CODE REFERENCE AND TO MAKE A TECHNICAL CORRECTION; AMENDING
10 SECTION 19-3004A, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE A CODE REFERENCE; AMENDING SEC-

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15 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

16 SECTION 1. That Section 18-1505B, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
17 amended to read as follows:

18 18-1505B. SEXUAL ABUSE AND EXPLOITATION OF A VULNERABLE ADULT. (1) It
19 is a felony for any person, with the intent of arousing, appealing to or grat-
20 ifying the lust, passion or sexual desires of such person, a vulnerable adult
21 or a third party, to:

22 (a) Commit any lewd or lascivious act or acts upon or with the body or
23 any part or member thereof of a vulnerable adult including, but not lim-
24 ited to: genital-genital contact, oral-genital contact, anal-genital
25 contact, oral-anal contact, manual-anal contact or manual-genital con-
26 tact, whether between persons of the same or opposite sex;

27 (b) Involve a vulnerable adult in any act of bestiality or sado-
28 masochism as defined in section 18-1507, Idaho Code; or

29 (c) Cause or have sexual contact with a vulnerable adult, not amounting
30 to lewd conduct as defined in paragraph (a) of this subsection.

31 (2) For the purposes of this section:

32 (a) "Commercial purpose" means the intention, objective, anticipation
33 or expectation of monetary gain or other material consideration, com-
34 penensation, remuneration or profit.

35 (b) "Sexual contact" means any physical contact between a vulnerable
36 adult and any person or between vulnerable adults, which is caused by
37 the actor, or the actor causing the vulnerable adult to have self-con-
38 tact;

39 (b~~c~~) "Sexually exploitative material" means any image, photograph, mo-
40 tion picture, videotape, print, negative, slide or other mechanically,
41 electronically, digitally or chemically produced or reproduced visual
42 material that depicts shows a vulnerable adult engaged in, participat-

ing in, observing or being used for explicit sexual conduct ~~as defined in section 18-1507, Idaho Code,~~ or showing a vulnerable adult engaging in, participating in, observing or being used for explicit sexual conduct, in actual time, including, but not limited to, video chat, webcam sessions or video calling; and

(ed) "Vulnerable adult" is as defined in section 18-1505, Idaho Code.

(3) Sexual abuse of a vulnerable adult is a felony and shall be punishable by imprisonment in the state prison for a period not to exceed twenty-five (25) years or by a fine not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

(4) It shall be a felony for any person to commit sexual exploitation of a vulnerable adult if, for any commercial purpose, ~~as defined in section 18-1507, Idaho Code,~~ he knowingly:

(a) Causes, induces or permits a vulnerable adult to engage in or be used in any explicit sexual conduct as defined in section 18-1507, Idaho Code; or

(b) Prepares, arranges for, publishes, produces, promotes, makes, sells, finances, offers, exhibits, advertises, deals in, possesses or distributes sexually exploitative material.

(5) The possession by any person of three (3) or more identical copies of any sexually exploitative material shall create a presumption that such possession is for a commercial purpose.

(6) Sexual exploitation of a vulnerable adult shall be punishable by imprisonment in the state prison for a period not to exceed fifteen (15) years or by a fine not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 2. That Section 18-1507, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

18-1507. DEFINITIONS -- SEXUAL EXPLOITATION OF A CHILD -- PENALTIES. (1) ~~The legislature hereby finds and declares that the commercial sexual exploitation of children constitutes a wrongful invasion of the child's right of privacy and results in social, developmental, and emotional injury to the child; that a child below the age of eighteen (18) years is incapable of giving informed consent to the use of his or her body for a commercial purpose; and that to protect children from commercial sexual exploitation it is necessary to prohibit the production for trade or commerce of material which involves or is derived from such exploitation and to exclude all such material from the channels of trade and commerce.~~

~~(2)~~ As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) "Bestiality" means a sexual connection in any manner between a human being and any animal.

(b) "Child" means a person who is less than eighteen (18) years of age.

~~(c) "Commercial purpose" means the intention, objective, anticipation, or expectation of monetary gain or other material consideration, compensation, remuneration, or profit.~~

~~(d)~~ "Erotic fondling" means touching a person's clothed or unclothed genitals or pubic area, developing or undeveloped genitals or pubic area (if the person is a child), buttocks, breasts (if the person is a female), or developing or undeveloped breast area (if the person is a

1 female child), for the purpose of real or simulated overt sexual gratification or stimulation of one (1) or more of the persons involved.
 2 "Erotic fondling" shall not be construed to include physical contact,
 3 even if affectionate, which is not for the purpose of real or simulated
 4 overt sexual gratification or stimulation of one (1) or more of the persons involved.
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6 (ed) "Erotic nudity" means the display of the human male or female genitals or pubic area, the undeveloped or developing genitals or pubic area of the human male or female child, the human female breasts, or the undeveloped or developing breast area of the human female child, for the purpose of real or simulated overt sexual gratification or stimulation of one (1) or more of the persons involved.
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13 (ef) "Explicit sexual conduct" means sexual intercourse, erotic fondling, erotic nudity, masturbation, sadomasochism, sexual excitement, or bestiality.
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16 (gf) "Masturbation" means the real or simulated touching, rubbing, or otherwise stimulating of a person's own clothed or unclothed genitals or pubic area, developing or undeveloped genitals or pubic area (if the person is a child), buttocks, breasts (if the person is a female), or developing or undeveloped breast area (if the person is a female child), by manual manipulation or self-induced or with an artificial instrument, for the purpose of real or simulated overt sexual gratification or arousal of the person.
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24 (hg) "Sadomasochism" means:

25 (i) Real or simulated flagellation or torture for the purpose of real or simulated sexual stimulation or gratification; or
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27 (ii) The real or simulated condition of being fettered, bound, or otherwise physically restrained for sexual stimulation or gratification of a person.
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30 (ih) "Sexual excitement" means the real or simulated condition of human male or female genitals when in a state of real or simulated overt sexual stimulation or arousal.
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33 (ji) "Sexual intercourse" means real or simulated intercourse, whether genital-genital, oral-genital, anal-genital, or oral-anal, between persons of the same or opposite sex, or between a human and an animal, or with an artificial genital.
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37 (kj) "Sexually exploitative material" means any image, photograph, motion picture, videotape, print, negative, slide, or other mechanically, electronically, digitally or chemically produced or reproduced visual material which depicts shows a child engaged in, participating in, observing, or being used for explicit sexual conduct, or showing a child engaging in, participating in, observing or being used for explicit sexual conduct, in actual time, including, but not limited to, video chat, webcam sessions or video calling.
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45 (32) A person commits sexual exploitation of a child if, ~~for any commercial purpose,~~ he knowingly and willfully:
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47 (a) Possesses or accesses through any means including, but not limited to, the internet, any sexually exploitative material; or
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1 (b) Causes, induces, or permits a child to engage in, or be used for, any
 2 explicit sexual conduct for the purpose of producing or making sexually
 3 exploitative material; or

4 (bc) Promotes, prepares, arranges for, publishes, produces,
 5 promotes, makes, sells, finances, offers, exhibits, or advertises,
 6 deals in, possesses, or distributes any sexually exploitative mate-
 7 rial; or

8 (d) Distributes through any means including, but not limited to, mail,
 9 physical delivery or exchange, use of a computer or any other electronic
 10 or digital method, any sexually exploitative material. Distribution
 11 of sexually exploitative material does not require a pecuniary transac-
 12 tion or exchange of interests in order to complete the offense.

13 ~~(4) The possession by any person of three (3) or more identical copies~~
 14 ~~of any sexually exploitative material shall create a presumption that such~~
 15 ~~possession is for a commercial purpose.~~

16 (3) The sexual exploitation of a child pursuant to subsection (2) (a) of
 17 this section is a felony and shall be punishable by imprisonment in the state
 18 prison for a period not to exceed ten (10) years or by a fine not to exceed ten
 19 thousand dollars (\$10,000), or by both such imprisonment and fine.

20 (54) The sexual exploitation of a child pursuant to subsections (2) (b),
 21 (c) and (d) of this section is a felony and shall be punishable by imprison-
 22 ment in the state prison for a term not to exceed thirty (30) years or by a
 23 fine not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) or by both such fine and
 24 imprisonment.

25 (65) If any provision of this section or the application thereof to any
 26 person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect
 27 other provisions or applications of this section which can be given effect
 28 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
 29 of this section are declared to be severable.

30 SECTION 3. That Section 18-1507A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 31 repealed.

32 SECTION 4. That Section 18-8304, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
 33 amended to read as follows:

34 18-8304. APPLICATION OF CHAPTER -- RULEMAKING AUTHORITY. (1) The pro-
 35 visions of this chapter shall apply to any person who:

36 (a) On or after July 1, 1993, is convicted of the crime, or an attempt, a
 37 solicitation, or a conspiracy to commit a crime provided for in section
 38 18-909 (assault with intent to commit rape, infamous crime against na-
 39 ture, or lewd and lascivious conduct with a minor, but excluding mayhem,
 40 murder or robbery), 18-911 (battery with intent to commit rape, infa-
 41 mous crime against nature, or lewd and lascivious conduct with a minor,
 42 but excluding mayhem, murder or robbery), 18-919 (sexual exploitation
 43 by a medical care provider), 18-1505B (sexual abuse and exploitation
 44 of a vulnerable adult), 18-1506 (sexual abuse of a child under six-
 45 teen years of age), 18-1506A (ritualized abuse of a child), 18-1507
 46 (sexual exploitation of a child), ~~18-1507A (possession of sexually~~
 47 ~~exploitative material for other than a commercial purpose),~~ 18-1508
 48 (lewd conduct with a minor child), 18-1508A (sexual battery of a minor

1 child sixteen or seventeen years of age), 18-1509A (enticing a child
2 over the internet), 18-4003(d) (murder committed in perpetration of
3 rape), 18-4116 (indecent exposure, but excluding a misdemeanor conviction), 18-4502 (first degree kidnapping committed for the purpose of
4 rape, committing the infamous crime against nature or for committing
5 any lewd and lascivious act upon any child under the age of sixteen, or
6 for purposes of sexual gratification or arousal), 18-4503 (second degree
7 kidnapping where the victim is an unrelated minor child), 18-5605
8 (detention for prostitution), 18-5609 (inducing person under eighteen
9 years of age into prostitution), 18-5611 (inducing person under eighteen
10 years of age to patronize a prostitute), 18-6101 (rape, but excluding
11 18-6101(1) where the defendant is eighteen years of age or where the
12 defendant is exempted under subsection (4) of this section), 18-6108
13 (male rape, but excluding 18-6108(1) where the defendant is eighteen
14 years of age or where the defendant is exempted under subsection (4) of
15 this section), 18-6110 (sexual contact with a prisoner), 18-6602 (incest),
16 18-6605 (crime against nature), 18-6608 (forcible sexual penetration by use of a foreign object), 18-6609 (video voyeurism where the
17 victim is a minor or upon a second or subsequent conviction), 18-7804
18 (if the racketeering act involves kidnapping of a minor) or 18-8602(1),
19 Idaho Code, (sex trafficking).

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22 (b) On or after July 1, 1993, has been convicted of any crime, an attempt,
23 a solicitation or a conspiracy to commit a crime in another jurisdiction
24 or who has a foreign conviction that is substantially equivalent to the offenses
25 listed in subsection (1) (a) of this section and enters this state to establish
26 residence or for employment purposes or to attend, on a full-time or part-time
27 basis, any public or private educational institution including any secondary school,
28 trade or professional institution or institution of higher education.

29
30 (c) Has been convicted of any crime, an attempt, a solicitation or a
31 conspiracy to commit a crime in another jurisdiction, including military courts,
32 that is substantially equivalent to the offenses listed in subsection (1) (a)
33 of this section and was required to register as a sex offender in any other
34 state or jurisdiction when he established residency in Idaho.

35
36 (d) Pleads guilty to or has been found guilty of a crime covered in this
37 chapter prior to July 1, 1993, and the person, as a result of the offense,
38 is incarcerated in a county jail facility or a penal facility or is under
39 probation or parole supervision, on or after July 1, 1993.

40 (e) Is a nonresident regularly employed or working in Idaho or is a student
41 in the state of Idaho and was convicted, found guilty or pleaded guilty to
42 a crime covered by this chapter and, as a result of such conviction, finding
43 or plea, is required to register in his state of residence.

44
45 (2) An offender shall not be required to comply with the registration
46 provisions of this chapter while incarcerated in a correctional institution
47 of the department of correction, a county jail facility, committed to the
48 department of juvenile corrections or committed to a mental health institution
49 of the department of health and welfare.

1 (3) A conviction for purposes of this chapter means that the person has
2 pled guilty or has been found guilty, notwithstanding the form of the judg-
3 ment or withheld judgment.

4 (4) When a defendant is convicted of rape under section 18-6101(2) or
5 18-6108(2), Idaho Code, and at the time of the offense the defendant is nine-
6 teen (19) or twenty (20) years of age and not more than three (3) years older
7 than the victim of the rape, the court may order that the defendant is exempt
8 from the requirements of this chapter upon a finding by the court that:

9 (a) All parties have stipulated to the exemption; or

10 (b) The defendant has demonstrated by clear and convincing evidence
11 that he is not a risk to commit another crime identified in subsection
12 (1) of this section and in the case there were no allegations by the
13 victim of any violation of section 18-6101(3) through (9) or 18-6108(3)
14 through (7), Idaho Code.

15 (5) The department shall have authority to promulgate rules to imple-
16 ment the provisions of this chapter.

17 SECTION 5. That Section 19-3004A, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
18 amended to read as follows:

19 19-3004A. ADMINISTRATIVE SUBPOENA -- ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION AND
20 REMOTE COMPUTING SERVICES. (1) A provider of an electronic communication
21 service or remote computing service that is transacting or has transacted
22 any business in the state shall disclose the following to a prosecuting at-
23 torney or the attorney general pursuant to an administrative subpoena issued
24 by the prosecuting attorney or attorney general:

25 (a) Records and information in its possession containing the name, ad-
26 dress, local and long distance telephone connection records, or records
27 of session times and durations, length of service, including the start
28 date; and

29 (b) Records and information in its possession containing the types of
30 service utilized, telephone or instrument number or other subscriber
31 number or identity, including any temporarily assigned network ad-
32 dress; and

33 (c) Records and information in its possession relating to the means and
34 source of payment for such service pertaining to a subscriber to or cus-
35 tomer of such service.

36 The provider of an electronic communication service or remote computing
37 service shall deliver the records to the prosecuting attorney or attorney
38 general within fourteen (14) days of receipt of the subpoena.

39 (2) For the purpose of this section, the following definitions shall
40 apply:

41 (a) "Electronic communication service" has the same meaning as pro-
42 vided in section 18-6701(13), Idaho Code.

43 (b) "Remote computing service" means the provision to the public of
44 computer storage or processing service by means of an electronic commu-
45 nications system as defined in section 18-6701(12), Idaho Code.

46 (3) In order to obtain the records or information, the prosecuting
47 attorney or attorney general shall certify on the face of the subpoena that
48 there is reason to believe that the records or information being sought are
49 relevant to a legitimate law enforcement investigation concerning a viola-

1 tion of section 18-1505B, 18-1506, 18-1506A, 18-1507, ~~18-1507A~~, 18-1508,
2 18-1508A, 18-1509, 18-1509A, 18-1515, 18-2202 or 18-6609, Idaho Code.

3 (4) No subpoena issued pursuant to this section shall demand records
4 that disclose the content of electronic communications or subscriber
5 account records disclosing internet locations which have been accessed in-
6 cluding, but not limited to, websites, chat channels and news groups, but
7 excluding servers used to initially access the internet. No recipient of a
8 subpoena issued pursuant to this section shall provide any such content or
9 records accessed, in response to the subpoena.

10 (5) On a motion made by the electronic communication service or remote
11 computing service provider prior to the time for appearance or the produc-
12 tion of documents under the subpoena issued pursuant to this section, a court
13 of competent jurisdiction may quash or modify the administrative subpoena if
14 the provider establishes that the records or other information requested are
15 unusually voluminous in nature or if compliance with the subpoena would oth-
16 erwise cause an undue burden on the service provider.

17 (6) No cause of action shall lie in any court against an electronic
18 communication service or remote computing service provider, its officers,
19 employees, agents or other specified persons for providing information,
20 facilities or assistance in accordance with the terms of an administrative
21 subpoena issued under this section.

22 (7) A person who is subpoenaed under this section and who fails to ap-
23 pear or produce materials as required by the subpoena, or who refuses to be
24 sworn or give testimony, may be found to be in contempt of court. Proceed-
25 ings to hold a person in contempt under this subsection may be brought in the
26 county where the subpoena was issued.

27 (8) Nothing in this section shall limit the right of a prosecuting at-
28 torney or the attorney general to otherwise obtain records or information
29 from a provider of electronic communication service or remote computing ser-
30 vice pursuant to a search warrant, a court order or a grand jury or trial sub-
31 poena.

32 SECTION 6. That Section 19-5506, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
33 amended to read as follows:

34 19-5506. SCOPE OF LAW -- OFFENDERS SUBJECT TO SAMPLE COLLECTION --
35 EARLY COLLECTION OF SAMPLES -- RESTITUTION. (a) Any person, including any
36 juvenile tried as an adult, who is convicted of, or pleads guilty to, any of
37 the following crimes, regardless of the form of judgment or withheld judg-
38 ment, and regardless of the sentence imposed or disposition rendered, shall
