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A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND ACKNOWLEDGING THE SERIOUSNESS OF ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND OTHER DEMENTIAS IN IDAHO BY ENDORSING THE IDAHO 4 ALZHEIMER'S PLANNING GROUP AND SUPPORTING SAID PLANNING GROUP'S COM-PREHENSIVE APPROACH TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A STATEWIDE PLAN TO ADDRESS 5 THE NEEDS OF PEOPLE WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND OTHER DEMENTIAS, THEIR 6 FAMILY MEMBERS AND CAREGIVERS. 7

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho: 8

WHEREAS, some 26,000 Idahoans are currently diagnosed with Alzheimer's 9 disease, and the number is projected to increase significantly through 2025; 10 and 11

WHEREAS, Idaho is projected to have the fifth highest increase in people 12 13 suffering from Alzheimer's disease among all of the United States over the 14 next several years; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the only major cause of death that has a 15 mortality rate that continues to increase; and 16

17 WHEREAS, Idaho's mortality rate from Alzheimer's disease is consistently higher than the national average; and 18

WHEREAS, 41% of Idahoans living in nursing homes have moderate to severe 19 20 dementia; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho Alzheimer's Planning Group is developing a plan to 21 address the problem of Alzheimer's disease and other dementias throughout 22 23 the state; and

WHEREAS, the Idaho State Plan for Alzheimer's disease and other demen-24 tias will help agencies, organizations and individuals develop specific 25 programs and strategies to meet the needs of Alzheimer's patients, their 26 families and caregivers at the state, regional and local levels. 27

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Ses-28 sion of the Sixty-first Idaho Legislature, the Senate and the House of Repre-29 sentatives concurring therein, that the State of Idaho acknowledges the se-30 riousness of the impact of Alzheimer's disease and other dementias upon the 31 state by endorsing the Idaho Alzheimer's Planning Group's community aware-32 ness, data collection and resulting statewide plan development and imple-33 mentation efforts to address the issue. 34

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the Second Regular Session 35 of the Sixty-first Idaho Legislature, the Senate and the House of Represen-36 tatives concurring therein, support the Idaho Alzheimer's Planning Group's 37 comprehensive approach toward educating the public about Alzheimer's dis-38 ease and other dementias; collecting and analyzing statewide data related to 39 current and future needs for Alzheimer's patients, families and caregivers; 40 and recommending programs and strategies for addressing those needs. 41
