



Selway-Middle Fork Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program (CFLRP)

Summary of Accomplishments Fiscal Years 2010-2012

OVERVIEW -- The purpose of the Collaborative Forest Landscape Restoration Program is to encourage the collaborative, science-based ecosystem restoration of priority forest landscapes. The Selway-Middle Fork proposal is a product of collaboration. It is based on sound science and restoration strategies developed at the forest, county, state, regional and national levels. All outputs are a product of ecological restoration activities.

PROJECT FUNDING - From fiscal years (FY) 2010-2012, the Selway-Middle Fork project has netted roughly \$8.4 million in appropriated CFLR funds and another \$7.7 million in matching contributions to accomplish restoration work in the Selway-Middle Fork area. During this time 43 contracts totaling roughly \$4 million have been awarded, primarily to local contractors. Another \$2.2 million has been allocated through agreements. fy 13 - 2.5 fy 13 - 2.5

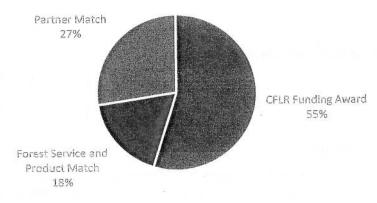

Significant accomplishments FY 13²

Timber

Nearing completion of Interface Fuels sale (sold in FY 11 ~7.5 MMBF)

Started work on the Lodge Point sale (sold in FY 12 ~3.5MMBF)

NEPA

Signed decision for the Iron Mountain project (~9MMBF). Received one appeal and decision affirmed by RO.

Released Draft Environmental Impact Statement for the Clear Creek project. Final EIS and draft ROD scheduled for late fall.

Data collection and preparing for scoping on Middle Fork veg. project and Clear Ridge road across fines helicoper decom project.

Presentations/field trips

- Approx. 6 field trips with CBC, WO, other environmental organizations
- NEPA/collaboration/Clear Creek presentation at the Idaho Forest Restoration Partnership Boise
- CFLRP / Clear Creek presentation to the Nez Perce Tribal Executive Committee's Natural Resources Subcommittee.
- Clear Creek presentation to Idaho Forest Group's annual contractor meeting in Lewiston
- Clear Creek presentation to the Idaho Roadless Commission in Coeur d'Alene

Fire/fuels
