A HOUSE RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND PROVIDING FOR THE AMENDMENT OF RULE 64 OF THE RULES OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives deems it necessary and desirable that Rule 64 of the Rules of the House of Representatives be amended.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the House of Representatives, assembled in the First Regular Session of the Sixty-second Idaho Legislature, that Rule 64 of the Rules of the House of Representatives shall be amended to read as follows:

RULE 64

Chief Clerk, and Custodian of Papers Records. -- (1) Neither the Chief Clerk nor his assistant shall permit any records or papers belonging to the House to be taken out of their custody otherwise than in the regular course of business, and doing so, shall be subject to reprimand by the Speaker; and such further penalty as the House may impose. The Chief Clerk shall report any missing papers to the Speaker; shall have general supervision of all clerical duties appertaining to the business of the House; shall perform under the direction of the Speaker, all duties pertaining to the business of his office.

(2) The Speaker shall designate a custodian of public records for the House for the limited purpose of complying with the Idaho Public Writings Law. The custodian shall coordinate and prepare all responses to requests for public records on behalf of the House, its committees and its individual members. All public records requests shall be directed to the House custodian, who will respond in accordance with House Rules and Idaho Public Writings Law. An individual member, on his written notice to the Speaker, may individually respond to requests for his public records; however, the custodian shall respond with public records, including an individual member's, within the custodian's limited designated custody and control.
