SENATE BILL NO. 1194

AN ACT

2 RELATING TO THE FISCAL YEAR 2014 APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
3 AND WELFARE FOR THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES DIVISION; PROVIDING FOR  
4 REAPPROPRIATION OF GENERAL FUNDS; CLARIFYING USE OF REAPPROPRIATED  
5 FUNDS; AND PROVIDING FOR TRANSFER OF REAPPROPRIATED FUNDS IN EXCESS OF  
6 TEN PERCENT FOR THE CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM AND THE ADULT MEN-  
7 TAL HEALTH PROGRAM.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

9 SECTION 1. GENERAL FUND REAPPROPRIATION AUTHORITY. There is hereby  
10 reappropriated to the Department of Health and Welfare for the Mental Health  
11 Services Division any unexpended and unencumbered balance of General Fund  
12 moneys in the Cooperative Welfare Fund as appropriated to the Children's  
13 Mental Health Program and the Adult Mental Health Program for fiscal year  
14 2013, to be made available for the period July 1, 2013, to June 30, 2014. The  
15 reappropriation shall be computed by the Department of Health and Welfare  
16 and, for budgeting purposes, any General Fund portion of the balance in the  
17 Cooperative Welfare Fund from the programs identified herein, shall be iden-  
18 tified as part of the General Fund.

19 SECTION 2. CLARIFYING USE OF REAPPROPRIATED FUNDS. It is the intent of  
20 the Legislature that General Fund moneys appropriated to the Children's Men-  
21 tal Health Program and the Adult Mental Health Program be used to provide  
22 or administer mental health services. Subsequently, moneys reappropriated  
23 in Section 1 of this act shall be used for mental health services, includ-  
24 ing one-time start-up funds for regional behavioral health boards as identi-  
25 fied in Senate Bill No. 1114 of the First Regular Session of the Sixty-second  
26 Idaho Legislature.

27 SECTION 3. MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding the provi-  
28 sions of Section 67-3511, Idaho Code, amounts reappropriated from the Chil-  
29 dren's Mental Health Program and the Adult Mental Health Program for fiscal  
30 year 2014 may be transferred between the Children's Mental Health Program  
31 and the Adult Mental Health Program in amounts that exceed ten percent cumu-  
32 lative change from the appropriated amount for either program.
