BY APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE

1 AN ACT  
 2 APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES FOR FISCAL YEAR  
 3 2015; LIMITING THE NUMBER OF AUTHORIZED FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSI-  
 4 TIONS; APPROPRIATING AND TRANSFERRING MONEYS; EXEMPTING APPROPRIATION  
 5 OBJECT AND PROGRAM TRANSFER LIMITATIONS; AND PROVIDING GUIDANCE FOR  
 6 EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

8 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Water Re-  
 9 sources, the following amounts to be expended according to the designated  
 10 programs and expense classes, from the listed funds for the period July 1,  
 11 2014, through June 30, 2015:

35 SECTION 2. FTP AUTHORIZATION. In accordance with Section 67-3519,  
36 Idaho Code, the Department of Water Resources is authorized no more than one  
37 hundred fifty-two (152) full-time equivalent positions at any point during

1 the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015, unless specifically autho-  
2 rized by the Governor. The Joint Finance-Appropriations Committee will be  
3 notified promptly of any increased positions so authorized.

4 SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated to the Department of Water Re-  
5 sources and the State Controller shall transfer \$716,000 from the Revolving  
6 Development Fund to the Secondary Aquifer Planning, Management, and Imple-  
7 mentation Fund, on July 1, 2014, or as soon thereafter as practicable, for  
8 the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015.

9 SECTION 4. EXEMPTIONS FROM OBJECT AND PROGRAM TRANSFER LIMITATIONS.  
10 For fiscal year 2015, the Department of Water Resources is hereby exempted  
11 from the provisions of Section 67-3511(1), (2) and (3), Idaho Code, allow-  
12 ing unlimited transfers between object codes and between programs, for all  
13 moneys appropriated to it for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015.  
14 Legislative appropriations shall not be transferred from one fund to another  
15 fund unless expressly approved by the Legislature.

16 SECTION 5. EMPLOYEE COMPENSATION. It is the intent of the Legislature,  
17 working cooperatively with the Governor's Office, the Division of Human Re-  
18 sources, and the Division of Financial Management, to progress toward the  
19 goal of funding a competitive salary and benefit package that will attract  
20 qualified applicants, retain employees committed to public service excel-  
21 lence, motivate employees to maintain high standards of productivity, and  
22 reward employees for outstanding performance by:

- 23 1) Adjusting the compensation schedule upwards by 1% to move the salary  
24 structure toward market; and
- 25 2) Continuing the job classifications that are currently on payline  
26 exception to address specific recruitment or retention issues; and
- 27 3) Funding an ongoing 1% salary increase for state employees, and funding  
28 the equivalent of a one-time 1% bonus for state employees, based upon  
29 employee merit, with flexibility in distribution as determined by  
30 the agency directors.

31 The Legislature also finds that investing in state employee compensa-  
32 tion should remain a high priority even in tough economic times, and there-  
33 fore strongly encourages agency directors, institution executives and the  
34 Division of Financial Management to approve the use of salary savings to pro-  
35 vide either one-time or ongoing merit increases for deserving employees and  
36 also to target employees who are below policy compensation. Such salary sav-  
37 ings could result from turnover and attrition, or be the result of innova-  
38 tion and reorganization efforts that create savings. Such savings should be  
39 reinvested in employees. Agencies are cautioned to use one-time funding for  
40 one-time payments and ongoing funding for permanent pay increases.
