SENATE BILL NO. 1307

AN ACT

1 RELATING TO DRIVER'S LICENSES AND IDENTIFICATION CARDS; AMENDING SECTION
2 49-319, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS RELATING TO A DRIVER'S
3 LICENSE ISSUED TO CERTAIN PERSONS WORKING IN A FOREIGN COUNTRY AND RE-
4 LATING TO IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBERS; AMENDING SECTION 49-2444, IDAHO
5 CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS RELATING TO AN IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED
6 TO CERTAIN PERSONS WORKING IN A FOREIGN COUNTRY AND RELATING TO IMMEDI-
7 ATE FAMILY MEMBERS AND TO PROVIDE A CORRECT CODE REFERENCE; AND AMENDING
8 SECTION 49-2444, IDAHO CODE, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 2, CHAPTER 92, LAWS
9 OF 2013, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS RELATING TO AN IDENTIFICATION CARD
10 ISSUED TO CERTAIN PERSONS WORKING IN A FOREIGN COUNTRY AND RELATING TO
11 IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBERS AND TO PROVIDE A CORRECT CODE REFERENCE.

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

14 SECTION 1. That Section 49-319, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
15 amended to read as follows:

16 49-319. EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL OF DRIVER'S LICENSE. (1) Every noncom-
17 mercial Idaho driver's license issued to a driver shall expire and be renew-
18 able as follows:

19 (a) Twenty-one (21) years of age or older shall expire on the licensee's
20 birthday in the fourth year following the issuance of the driver's li-
21 cense.

22 (b) At the option of the applicant, for drivers twenty-one (21) years of
23 age through sixty-two (62) years of age, the driver's license shall ex-
24 pire either on the licensee's birthday in the fourth year or the eighth
25 year following the issuance of the driver's license.

26 (c) Except for the provisions found in subsections (1)(e) and (3) of
27 this section, every driver's license issued to a driver under eighteen
28 (18) years of age shall expire five (5) days after the licensee's eigh-
29 teenth birthday.

30 (d) Except for the provisions found in subsections (1)(e) and (3) of
31 this section, every driver's license issued to a driver eighteen (18)
32 years of age but under twenty-one (21) years of age shall expire five (5)
33 days after the licensee's twenty-first birthday.

34 (e) Every driver's license that is not, as provided by law, suspended,
35 revoked or disqualified in this state or any other jurisdiction shall
36 be renewable on or before its expiration, but not more than twenty-five
37 (25) months before, upon application, payment of the required fee, and
38 satisfactory completion of the required vision screening.

39 (2) Except for the provisions found in subsection (3) of this section,
40 every commercial driver's license issued to a person twenty-one (21) years
41 of age or older shall expire on the licensee's birthday in the fourth year
42 following issuance of the license, and any class A, B or C license issued to a

1 person eighteen (18), nineteen (19) or twenty (20) years of age shall expire
2 five (5) days after the licensee's twenty-first birthday. There shall be no
3 option for an eight-year class A, B or C license.

4 (3) Every driver's license issued to a person who is not a citizen or
5 permanent legal resident of the United States shall have an expiration date
6 that is the same date as the end of lawful stay in the United States as indi-
7 cated on documents issued and verified by the department of homeland secu-
8 rity, provided however, that the expiration date shall not extend beyond the
9 expiration date for the same category of license issued to citizens. Persons
10 whose department of homeland security documents do not state an expiration
11 date shall be issued a driver's license with an expiration date of one (1)
12 year from the date of issuance. Fees shall be in accordance with the expira-
13 tion periods and classes listed in section 49-306(1), Idaho Code.

14 (4) An applicant who is issued a driver's license in another jurisdic-
15 tion after an Idaho driver's license has been issued is not eligible for re-
16 newal or a duplicate of the Idaho driver's license. The applicant may apply
17 for a new Idaho driver's license as provided in section 49-306, Idaho Code.

18 (5) No knowledge test shall be required for renewal of a driver's li-
19 cense, except for renewal of a hazardous material endorsement. Appropriate
20 knowledge and skill tests shall be required for an upgrade in a driver's li-
21 cense class or an endorsement addition. In the case of a name change, the ap-
22 plicant shall provide legal documentation to verify the change in accordance
23 with department rules.

24 (6) Applicants for a hazardous material endorsement shall provide ei-
25 ther proof of United States citizenship or proof of lawful, permanent United
26 States residence and a valid federal bureau of citizenship and immigration
27 services alien registration number. A security background records check and
28 federal transportation security administration clearance shall be required
29 for issuance, renewal or transfer of a hazardous material endorsement in ac-
30 cordance with 49 CFR part 383, subject to procedures established by the fed-
31 eral transportation security administration.

32 (7) When a driver's license has been expired for fewer than twenty-five
33 (25) months, the renewal of the driver's license shall start from the orig-
34 inal date of expiration regardless of the year in which the application for
35 renewal is made. If the driver's license is expired for twenty-five (25)
36 months or more, the applicant shall be required to take the appropriate
37 knowledge test(s) and skills test(s) for the class of license or endorsement
38 being applied for, and vision screening. The license shall expire on the
39 licensee's birthday in the fourth year following issuance of the driver's
40 license for drivers twenty-one (21) years of age or older, except as other-
41 wise provided in subsections (1) (e) and (3) of this section. At the option
42 of the applicant, for drivers twenty-one (21) years of age through sixty-two
43 (62) years of age, the renewed license shall expire either on the licensee's
44 birthday in the fourth year or the eighth year following issuance, except as
45 otherwise provided in subsections (1) (e) and (3) of this section.

46 (8) (a) If a driver's license has expired or will expire and the li-
47 censee is temporarily out of state, except on active military duty, and
48 the driver's license has not, as provided by law, been suspended, re-
49 voked, canceled, denied, refused or disqualified, the licensee may re-
50 quest in writing on a form prescribed by the department an extension of

1 the driver's license. The request shall be accompanied by the fee fixed
2 in section 49-306, Idaho Code, and the extension shall be no more than a
3 twelve (12) month period. If the department determines that an exten-
4 sion of the driver's license is necessary, it may issue a license show-
5 ing the date to which the expired driver's license is extended. License
6 extensions are limited to two (2) consecutive extensions per licensee.

7 (b) Upon returning to the state of Idaho, the licensee shall, within ten
8 (10) days, apply for a renewal of the expired driver's license and sur-
9 render the extended license and the expired driver's license.

10 (c) A hazardous material endorsement cannot be extended.

11 (9) An Idaho driver's license issued to any person prior to serving
12 on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, or a member of the
13 immediate family accompanying such a person, if valid and in full force and
14 effect upon entering active duty, shall remain in full force and effect, ~~and~~
15 ~~shall, upon application, be extended for a period of four (4) years so long~~
16 ~~as active duty continues, or shall be renewed upon application in person~~
17 ~~without the requirement to take a knowledge or skills test~~ If their Idaho
18 driver's license expired expires while on active duty, if the driver's li-
19 icense and is not suspended, denied, disqualified, canceled or revoked, as
20 provided by law, during the active duty, and the license shall, upon applica-
21 tion, accompanied by the fee fixed in section 49-306, Idaho Code, be extended
22 for a period of four (4) years so long as active duty continues, or shall be
23 renewed upon application in person without the requirement to take a knowl-
24 edge or skills test. The driver's license shall also remain in full force and
25 effect sixty (60) days following the date the holder is released from active
26 duty.

27 (10) An Idaho driver's license, issued to any person prior to becom-
28 ing employed by the United States government and working in a foreign coun-
29 try or a member of the immediate family accompanying that person, if valid
30 and in full force and effect upon employment, shall remain in full force and
31 effect. If the Idaho driver's license expires while the person is employed
32 by the United States government and is not suspended, denied, disqualified,
33 canceled or revoked as provided by law, the license shall, upon application,
34 accompanied by the fee fixed in section 49-306, Idaho Code, be extended for
35 a period of four (4) years so long as employment continues while working in a
36 foreign country, or shall be renewed upon application in person without the
37 requirement to take a knowledge or skills tests. The driver's license shall
38 also remain in full force and effect sixty (60) days following the date the
39 holder is released from employment.

40 (11) The department may use a mail renewal process for four-year class D
41 licenses based on criteria established by rule.

42 (11~~2~~) A seasonal driver's license is only valid for a one hundred eighty
43 (180) day period from the date of issuance. Only one (1) seasonal driver's
44 license may be obtained in any twelve (12) month period, and may only be ob-
45 tained twice in a driver's lifetime.

46 (12~~3~~) A person who applies for renewal of a license may request that the
47 notation "permanently disabled" be imprinted on the license and the depart-
48 ment shall imprint "permanently disabled" on the license if:

49 (a) The person has a permanent disability; and

1 (b) The person presents written certification from a licensed physi-
2 cian, licensed physician assistant, or licensed advanced practice
3 professional nurse verifying that the person's stated impairment qual-
4 ifies as a permanent disability as provided in section 49-117, Idaho
5 Code; and

6 (c) The department determines that the person meets the requirements
7 for issuance of a license as specified in section 49-313, Idaho Code.

8 SECTION 2. That Section 49-2444, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
9 amended to read as follows:

10 49-2444. IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED -- FOUR-YEAR OR EIGHT-YEAR. (1)
11 The department shall issue a distinguishing identification card that shall
12 set forth the information contained in the application, in a form as pre-
13 scribed by the department. All identification cards issued on or after Jan-
14 uary 1, 1993, shall not contain the applicant's social security number. An
15 applicant's social security number shall be exempt from disclosure except
16 for inquiries from agencies or institutions authorized to obtain such infor-
17 mation by federal law or regulation, from peace officers or from jury com-
18 missioners. Each card shall have printed on it the applicant's full name,
19 date of birth, Idaho residence address, sex, weight, height, eye color, hair
20 color, and shall be issued a distinguishing number assigned to the appli-
21 cant. If an applicant has submitted an application pursuant to the provi-
22 sions of chapter 58, title 19, Idaho Code, then the applicant's identifica-
23 tion card shall contain his or her alternative Idaho mailing address in place
24 of his or her Idaho residence address. Each card shall also have printed on
25 it the name of this state, the date of issuance, and the date of expiration.
26 An identification card shall not be valid until it has been signed on the sig-
27 nature line by the applicant. Each card shall bear upon it a color photograph
28 of the applicant which shall be taken by the examiner at the time of appli-
29 cation. The photograph shall be taken without headgear or other clothing or
30 device that disguises or otherwise conceals the face or head of the appli-
31 cant. A waiver may be granted by the department allowing the applicant to
32 wear headgear or other head covering for medical, religious or safety pur-
33 poses so long as the face is not disguised or otherwise concealed. At the re-
34 quest of the applicant, an identification card may contain a statement or in-
35 dication of the medical condition of the applicant.

36 No person shall receive an identification card unless and until he sur-
37 renders to the department all identification cards in his possession issued
38 to him by Idaho or any other jurisdiction, or any driver's license issued by
39 any other jurisdiction within the United States, or until he executes an af-
40 fidavit that he does not possess an identification card or any driver's li-
41 cense.

42 Identification cards issued to persons under eighteen (18) years of age
43 shall include a notation "under 18 until (month, day, year)," and identifi-
44 cation cards issued to persons eighteen (18) years of age to twenty-one (21)
45 years of age shall include a notation "under 21 until (month, day, year)."
46 The nonrefundable fee for a four-year identification card issued to persons
47 twenty-one (21) years of age or older shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) of which
48 five dollars (\$5.00) shall be retained by the county and credited to the cur-
49 rent expense fund, and five dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the state

1 treasury to the credit of the highway distribution account. The nonrefund-
2 able fee for identification cards issued to persons under twenty-one (21)
3 years of age shall be ten dollars (\$10.00), of which five dollars (\$5.00)
4 shall be retained by the county and credited to the current expense fund, and
5 five dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit
6 of the highway distribution account. The nonrefundable fee for an eight-
7 year identification card shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00) of which ten dol-
8 lars (\$10.00) shall be retained by the county and credited to the current ex-
9 pense fund, and ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be deposited in the state treasury
10 to the credit of the highway distribution account. At the option of the ap-
11 plicant, the identification card issued to a person twenty-one (21) years of
12 age or older shall expire either on the cardholder's birthday in the fourth
13 year or the eighth year following issuance of the card, except as otherwise
14 provided in subsection (3) of this section. Every identification card is-
15 sued to a person under eighteen (18) years of age shall expire five (5) days
16 after the person's eighteenth birthday, except as otherwise provided in sub-
17 section (3) of this section. Every identification card issued to a person
18 eighteen (18) years of age but under twenty-one (21) years of age shall ex-
19 pire five (5) days after the person's twenty-first birthday, except as oth-
20 erwise provided in subsection (3) of this section.

21 Individuals required to register in compliance with section 3 of the
22 federal military selective service act, 50 U.S.C. App. 451 et seq., as
23 amended, shall be provided an opportunity to fulfill such registration re-
24 quirements in conjunction with an application for an identification card.
25 Any registration information so supplied shall be transmitted by the depart-
26 ment to the selective service system.

27 (2) Every identification card, except those issued to persons under
28 twenty-one (21) years of age, shall be renewable on or before its expiration,
29 but not more than twenty-five (25) months before, and upon application and
30 payment of the required fee.

31 (3) Every identification card issued to a person who is not a citizen or
32 permanent legal resident of the United States shall have an expiration date
33 that is the same date as the end of lawful stay in the United States as indi-
34 cated on documents issued and verified by the department of homeland secu-
35 rity, provided however, that the expiration date shall not extend beyond the
36 expiration date for the same category of identification card issued to citi-
37 zens. Persons whose department of homeland security documents do not state
38 an expiration date shall be issued an identification card with an expiration
39 date of one (1) year from the date of issuance.

40 (4) When an identification card has been expired for less than twenty-
41 five (25) months, the renewal of the identification card shall start from
42 the original date of expiration regardless of the year in which the applica-
43 tion for renewal is made. If the identification card is expired for more than
44 twenty-five (25) months, the application shall expire, at the option of the
45 applicant, on the applicant's birthday in the fourth year or the eighth year
46 following reissuance of the identification card, except as otherwise pro-
47 vided in subsection (3) of this section.

48 (5) (a) If an Idaho identification card has expired or will expire and
49 the identification cardholder is temporarily out of state except on ac-
50 tive military duty, the identification cardholder may request in writ-

1 ing on a form prescribed by the department an extension of the identifi-
2 cation card. The request shall be accompanied by the fee fixed in sec-
3 tion 49-306, Idaho Code, and the extension shall be no more than a twelve
4 (12) month period. If the department determines that an extension of
5 the identification card is necessary, it may issue an identification
6 card showing the date to which the expired identification card is ex-
7 tended. Identification card extensions are limited to two (2) consecu-
8 tive extensions per identification cardholder.

9 (b) Upon returning to the state of Idaho, the identification cardholder
10 shall, within ten (10) days, apply for a renewal of the expired iden-
11 tification card and surrender the extended identification card and the
12 expired identification card.

13 (6) An Idaho identification card issued to any person prior to serv-
14 ing on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, or a member of
15 the immediate family accompanying such a person, if valid and in full force
16 and effect upon entering active duty, shall remain in full force and effect
17 and shall, upon application, accompanied by the fee fixed in section 49-306,
18 Idaho Code, be extended for a period of four (4) years so long as active duty
19 continues, and the identification card shall remain in full force and ef-
20 fect sixty (60) days following the date the cardholder is released from ac-
21 tive duty.

22 (7) An Idaho identification card issued to any person prior to becom-
23 ing employed by the United States government and working in a foreign country
24 or a member of the immediate family accompanying that person, if valid and in
25 full force and effect upon employment, shall remain in full force and effect
26 and shall, upon application, accompanied by the fee fixed in section 49-306,
27 Idaho Code, be extended for a period of four (4) years so long as employment
28 continues while working in a foreign country, or shall be renewed upon appli-
29 cation in person if their Idaho identification card expired while employed
30 by the United States government, and the identification card shall remain in
31 full force and effect sixty (60) days following the date the cardholder is
32 released from employment.

33 (8) A person possessing an identification card who desires to donate
34 any or all organs or tissue in the event of death, and who has completed a
35 document of gift pursuant to the provisions for donation of anatomical gifts
36 as set forth in chapter 34, title 39, Idaho Code, may, at the option of the
37 donor, indicate this desire on the identification card by the imprinting of
38 the word "donor" on the identification card. The provisions of this subsec-
39 tion shall apply to persons possessing an identification card who are six-
40 teen (16) years of age or older but less than eighteen (18) years of age if
41 the requirements provided in chapter 34, title 39, Idaho Code, have been com-
42 plied with.

43 (89) A person possessing an identification card or an applicant for an
44 identification card who is a person with a permanent disability may request
45 that the notation "permanently disabled" be imprinted on the identification
46 card, provided the person presents written certification from a licensed
47 physician verifying that the person's stated impairment qualifies as a per-
48 manent disability according to the provisions of section 49-117, Idaho Code.

49 (910) In the case of a name change, the applicant shall provide legal
50 documentation to verify the change in accordance with department rules.

1 (101) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving an identifi-
2 cation card, shall move from the address shown on the application or on the
3 identification card issued, that person shall, within thirty (30) days, no-
4 tify the transportation department in writing of the old and new addresses.

5 (112) The department shall cancel any identification card upon deter-
6 mining that the person was not entitled to the issuance of the identification
7 card, or that the person failed to give the required and correct information
8 in his application or committed fraud in making the application. Upon can-
9 cellation, the person shall surrender the canceled identification card to
10 the department.

11 (123) If any person shall fail to return to the department the identifi-
12 cation card as required, the department may direct any peace officer to se-
13 cure its possession and return the identification card to the department.

14 (134) The department may issue a no-fee identification card to an indi-
15 vidual whose driver's license has been canceled and voluntarily surrendered
16 as provided in section 49-322 (5), Idaho Code. The identification card may be
17 renewed at no cost to the applicant as long as the driver's license remains
18 canceled.

19 (145) It is an infraction for any person to fail to notify the department
20 of a change of address as required by the provisions of subsection (101) of
21 this section.

22 SECTION 3. That Section 49-2444, Idaho Code, as amended by Section 2,
23 Chapter 92, Laws of 2013, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as fol-
24 lows:

25 49-2444. IDENTIFICATION CARD ISSUED -- FOUR-YEAR OR EIGHT-YEAR. (1)
26 The department shall issue a distinguishing identification card that shall
27 set forth the information contained in the application, in a form as pre-
28 scribed by the department. All identification cards issued on or after Jan-
29 uary 1, 1993, shall not contain the applicant's social security number. An
30 applicant's social security number shall be exempt from disclosure except
31 for inquiries from agencies or institutions authorized to obtain such infor-
32 mation by federal law or regulation, from peace officers or from jury com-
33 missioners. Each card shall have printed on it the applicant's full name,
34 date of birth, Idaho residence address, sex, weight, height, eye color, hair
35 color, and shall be issued a distinguishing number assigned to the appli-
36 cant. If an applicant has submitted an application pursuant to the provi-
37 sions of chapter 58, title 19, Idaho Code, then the applicant's identifica-
38 tion card shall contain his or her alternative Idaho mailing address in place
39 of his or her Idaho residence address. Each card shall also have printed on
40 it the name of this state, the date of issuance, and the date of expiration.
41 An identification card shall not be valid until it has been signed on the sig-
42 nature line by the applicant. Each card shall bear upon it a color photograph
43 of the applicant which shall be taken by the examiner at the time of appli-
44 cation. The photograph shall be taken without headgear or other clothing or
45 device that disguises or otherwise conceals the face or head of the appli-
46 cant. A waiver may be granted by the department allowing the applicant to
47 wear headgear or other head covering for medical, religious or safety pur-
48 poses so long as the face is not disguised or otherwise concealed. At the re-

1 quest of the applicant, an identification card may contain a statement or in-
2 dication of the medical condition of the applicant.

3 No person shall receive an identification card unless and until he sur-
4 renders to the department all identification cards in his possession issued
5 to him by Idaho or any other jurisdiction, or any driver's license issued by
6 any other jurisdiction within the United States, or until he executes an af-
7 fidavit that he does not possess an identification card or any driver's li-
8 cense.

9 Identification cards issued to persons under eighteen (18) years of age
10 shall include a notation "under 18 until (month, day, year)," and identifi-
11 cation cards issued to persons eighteen (18) years of age to twenty-one (21)
12 years of age shall include a notation "under 21 until (month, day, year)."
13 The nonrefundable fee for a four-year identification card issued to persons
14 twenty-one (21) years of age or older shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) of which
15 five dollars (\$5.00) shall be retained by the county and credited to the cur-
16 rent expense fund, and five dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the state
17 treasury to the credit of the highway distribution account. The nonrefund-
18 able fee for identification cards issued to persons under twenty-one (21)
19 years of age shall be ten dollars (\$10.00), of which five dollars (\$5.00)
20 shall be retained by the county and credited to the current expense fund, and
21 five dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit
22 of the highway distribution account. The nonrefundable fee for an eight-
23 year identification card shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00) of which ten dol-
24 lars (\$10.00) shall be retained by the county and credited to the current ex-
25 pense fund, and ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be deposited in the state treasury
26 to the credit of the highway distribution account. At the option of the ap-
27 plicant, the identification card issued to a person twenty-one (21) years of
28 age or older shall expire either on the cardholder's birthday in the fourth
29 year or the eighth year following issuance of the card, except as otherwise
30 provided in subsection (3) of this section. Every identification card is-
31 sued to a person under eighteen (18) years of age shall expire five (5) days
32 after the person's eighteenth birthday, except as otherwise provided in sub-
33 section (3) of this section. Every identification card issued to a person
34 eighteen (18) years of age but under twenty-one (21) years of age shall ex-
35 pire five (5) days after the person's twenty-first birthday, except as oth-
36 erwise provided in subsection (3) of this section.

37 Individuals required to register in compliance with section 3 of the
38 federal military selective service act, 50 U.S.C. App. 451 et seq., as
39 amended, shall be provided an opportunity to fulfill such registration re-
40 quirements in conjunction with an application for an identification card.
41 Any registration information so supplied shall be transmitted by the depart-
42 ment to the selective service system.

43 (2) Every identification card, except those issued to persons under
44 twenty-one (21) years of age, shall be renewable on or before its expiration,
45 but not more than twenty-five (25) months before, and upon application and
46 payment of the required fee.

16 tive military duty, the identification cardholder may request in writ-
17 ing on a form prescribed by the department an extension of the identifi-
18 cation card. The request shall be accompanied by the fee fixed in sec-
19 tion 49-306, Idaho Code, and the extension shall be no more than a twelve
20 (12) month period. If the department determines that an extension of
21 the identification card is necessary, it may issue an identification
22 card showing the date to which the expired identification card is ex-
23 tended. Identification card extensions are limited to two (2) consecu-
24 tive extensions per identification cardholder.

25 (b) Upon returning to the state of Idaho, the identification cardholder
26 shall, within ten (10) days, apply for a renewal of the expired iden-
27 tification card and surrender the extended identification card and the
28 expired identification card.

29 (6) An Idaho identification card issued to any person prior to serv-
30 ing on active duty in the armed forces of the United States, or a member of
31 the immediate family accompanying such a person, if valid and in full force
32 and effect upon entering active duty, shall remain in full force and effect
33 and shall, upon application, accompanied by the fee fixed in section 49-306,
34 Idaho Code, be extended for a period of four (4) years so long as active duty
35 continues, and the identification card shall remain in full force and ef-
36 fect sixty (60) days following the date the cardholder is released from ac-
37 tive duty.

38 (7) An Idaho identification card issued to any person prior to becom-
39 ing employed by the United States government and working in a foreign country
40 or a member of the immediate family accompanying that person, if valid and in
41 full force and effect upon employment, shall remain in full force and effect
42 and shall, upon application, accompanied by the fee fixed in section 49-306,
43 Idaho Code, be extended for a period of four (4) years so long as employment
44 continues while working in a foreign country, or shall be renewed upon appli-
45 cation in person if their Idaho identification card expired while employed
46 by the United States government, and the identification card shall remain in
47 full force and effect sixty (60) days following the date the cardholder is
48 released from employment.

49 (8) A person possessing an identification card who desires to donate
50 any or all organs or tissue in the event of death, and who has completed a

1 document of gift pursuant to the provisions for donation of anatomical gifts
2 as set forth in chapter 34, title 39, Idaho Code, may, at the option of the
3 donor, indicate this desire on the identification card by the imprinting of
4 the word "donor" on the identification card. The provisions of this subsec-
5 tion shall apply to persons possessing an identification card who are six-
6 teen (16) years of age or older but less than eighteen (18) years of age if
7 the requirements provided in chapter 34, title 39, Idaho Code, have been com-
8 plied with.

9 (~~89~~) A person possessing an identification card or an applicant for an
10 identification card who is a person with a permanent disability may request
11 that the notation "permanently disabled" be imprinted on the identification
12 card, provided the person presents written certification from a licensed
13 physician verifying that the person's stated impairment qualifies as a per-
14 manent disability according to the provisions of section 49-117, Idaho Code.

15 (~~910~~) A person who is a veteran may request that his or her status as
16 such be designated on an identification card at no additional cost. Any such
17 request shall be accompanied by proof of being a current or former member of
18 the United States armed forces. Upon request and submission of satisfactory
19 proof, the department shall indicate such person's status as a veteran on any
20 identification card issued pursuant to the provisions of this section. Such
21 designation shall be made upon original issuance or renewal of an identifi-
22 cation card. Designation shall also be made on any duplicate identification
23 card issued, provided that the fee for such duplicate card is paid in accor-
24 dance with this section.

25 Satisfactory proof of being a current or former member of the United
26 States armed forces must be furnished by an applicant to the department be-
27 fore a designation of veteran status will be indicated on any identification
28 card. Acceptable proof shall be a copy of form DD214 or an equivalent docu-
29 ment or statement from the department of veterans affairs that identifies a
30 character of service upon separation as "honorable" or "general under hon-
31 orable conditions."

32 (~~101~~) In the case of a name change, the applicant shall provide legal
33 documentation to verify the change in accordance with department rules.

34 (~~112~~) Whenever any person, after applying for or receiving an identifi-
35 cation card, shall move from the address shown on the application or on the
36 identification card issued, that person shall, within thirty (30) days, no-
37 tify the transportation department in writing of the old and new addresses.

38 (~~123~~) The department shall cancel any identification card upon deter-
39 mining that the person was not entitled to the issuance of the identification
40 card, or that the person failed to give the required and correct information
41 in his application or committed fraud in making the application. Upon can-
42 cellation, the person shall surrender the canceled identification card to
43 the department.

44 (~~134~~) If any person shall fail to return to the department the identifi-
45 cation card as required, the department may direct any peace officer to se-
46 cure its possession and return the identification card to the department.

47 (~~145~~) The department may issue a no-fee identification card to an indi-
48 vidual whose driver's license has been canceled and voluntarily surrendered
49 as provided in section 49-322(5), Idaho Code. The identification card may be

1 renewed at no cost to the applicant as long as the driver's license remains
2 canceled.

3 (156) It is an infraction for any person to fail to notify the department
4 of a change of address as required by the provisions of subsection (142) of
5 this section.
