1 RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS, DISTRIBUTIONS AND TRANSFERS OF IDAHO MILLENNIUM
2 FUNDS; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE STATE TREASURER FOR DISTRIBUTION TO
3 THE IDAHO ACADEMY OF FAMILY PHYSICIANS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRI-
4 ATING MONEYS TO THE STATE TREASURER FOR DISTRIBUTION TO THE AMERICAN
5 LUNG ASSOCIATION OF IDAHO FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO
6 THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE CORRECTIONS FOR THE YOUTH PREVENTION
7 AND CESSATION PROGRAMS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO
8 THE STATE TREASURER FOR DISTRIBUTION TO THE SUPPORTIVE HOUSING AND IN-

14 PUBLIC HEALTH DISTRICT MILLENNIUM FUND CESSATION PROGRAM FOR FISCAL
15 YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE STATE TREASURER FOR DISTRIBUTION
16 TO THE IDAHO DRUG FREE YOUTH PROGRAM FOR PARENT AND TEEN PREVENTION ED-
17 UCATION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO BOISE STATE UNI-
18 VERSITY FOR THE IDAHO REGIONAL ALCOHOL DRUG AWARENESS RESOURCE CENTER
19 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH
20 AND WELFARE FOR THE PHYSICAL HEALTH SERVICES PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR
21 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND WELFARE FOR
22 THE WOMEN'S HEALTH CHECK PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING
23 MONEYS TO THE STATE TREASURER FOR DISTRIBUTION TO THE IDAHO METH PROJECT
24 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING MONEYS TO THE IDAHO DEPARTMENT OF
25 CORRECTION FOR THE COMMUNITY-BASED SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT SERVICES
26 PROGRAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN UNEXPENDED AND
27 UNENCUMBERED BALANCE OF MONEYS SHALL REVERT TO THE IDAHO MILLENNIUM IN-
28 COME FUND AT THE END OF FISCAL YEAR 2015; AND TRANSFERRING ANY REMAINING
29 UNEXPENDED AND UNENCUMBERED BALANCE OF MONEYS IN THE IDAHO MILLENNIUM
30 INCOME FUND TO THE IDAHO MILLENNIUM FUND AT THE END OF FISCAL YEAR 2015.

32 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

33 SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated \$70,400 from the Idaho Millen-
34 nium Income Fund to the State Treasurer for distribution to the Idaho Academy
35 of Family Physicians for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The
36 purpose of this grant is for the TAR WARS Program, which is designed to teach
37 children how to make positive decisions regarding their health. Tar Wars is
38 a tobacco-free education program for fourth-grade and fifth-grade students.
39 In Idaho, the program focuses on fifth-grade students but will incorporate
40 fourth-grade students when the need arises. The program is designed to teach
41 children about the short-term health effects, financial aspects and image-
42 based consequences of tobacco use; and about being tobacco-free by providing
43 them tools to make positive decisions regarding their health and to promote

1 personal responsibility for their well-being. The program is implemented
2 in classrooms by volunteers. It uses a community-based approach to mobilize
3 family physicians, dentists, educators and other health care professionals
4 to take an active part in their community's health education and encourages
5 overall community support for tobacco-free education.

6 SECTION 2. There is hereby appropriated \$159,000 from the Idaho Mil-
7 lennium Income Fund to the State Treasurer for distribution to the Ameri-
8 can Lung Association in Idaho for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30,
9 2015. The purpose of this grant is to provide youth tobacco prevention ser-
10 vices to Idaho youth through participation in three American Lung Associa-
11 tion programs statewide: Teens Against Tobacco Use (TATU), to train teens
12 in grades 8 through 12 to provide tobacco prevention presentations in grades
13 4 through 7; Support Teens Against Nicotine Dependency (STAND), which pro-
14 vides mini-grants, training and technical support to Idaho youth groups to
15 engage in community awareness and policy improvement projects regarding to-
16 bacco; and adult facilitator training for Not-On-Tobacco (N-O-T), a smoking
17 cessation program designed specifically for youth under the age of 18 years.

18 SECTION 3. There is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the State
19 Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$1,088,600 from the Idaho
20 Millennium Income Fund to the Department of Juvenile Corrections for the
21 Youth Prevention and Cessation programs for the period July 1, 2014, through
22 June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant is to support programs that prevent
23 and reduce the use of tobacco and other substances by youth.

24 SECTION 4. There is hereby appropriated \$160,100 from the Idaho Mil-
25 lennium Income Fund to the State Treasurer for distribution to the Support-
26 ive Housing and Innovative Partnerships Inc, for the period July 1, 2014,
27 through June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant is to promote prescrip-
28 tion drug safety through a trademarked but free mobile application titled,
29 "The Amazing Adventures of Pharmacist Phil." The application provides medi-
30 cal professionals, teachers and counselors with an easy way to start the dis-
31 cussion about prescription drug safety.

32 SECTION 5. There is hereby appropriated \$328,800 from the Idaho Millen-
33 nium Income Fund to the State Treasurer for distribution to the Boys & Girls
34 Club of Idaho for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The purpose
35 of this grant is for the Youth Empowerment Project, which is a comprehensive
36 approach to reduce the likelihood of current or future abuse of alcohol, to-
37 bacco and other drugs by at-risk youth, ages 6-18, served by the Boys & Girls
38 Clubs in Idaho.

39 SECTION 6. There is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the State
40 Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$94,000 from the Idaho Mil-
41 lennium Income Fund to the Idaho State Police for tobacco permittee compli-
42 ance inspections to be expended for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30,
43 2015. The purpose of this grant is to assist the Idaho State Police and the
44 Department of Health and Welfare with the cost of tobacco permittee compli-
45 ance inspections as required by law.

1 SECTION 7. There is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the State
2 Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$750,000 from the Idaho Mil-
3 lennium Income Fund to the Idaho Public Health Districts for the period July
4 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant is to continue the
5 Public Health District Millennium Fund cessation program. Through this pro-
6 gram, high-quality, best practice tobacco cessation programs are provided
7 statewide at no cost to Idahoans who want to quit smoking, with a primary em-
8 phasis on youth and pregnant women.

9 SECTION 8. There is hereby appropriated \$179,800 from the Idaho Millen-
10 nium Income Fund to the State Treasurer for distribution to the Idaho Drug
11 Free Youth Program for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The
12 purpose of this grant is to continue a multifaceted parent and teen preven-
13 tion education program called i2i to educate Idaho parents, together with
14 their teens, about alcohol and other drugs and the damage that substances can
15 do to the underdeveloped teen brain.

16 SECTION 9. There is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the State
17 Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$65,000 from the Idaho Mil-
18 lennium Income Fund to the Boise State University for the Idaho Regional Al-
19cohol Drug Awareness Resource (RADAR) Center for the period July 1, 2014,
20 through June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant is to provide free substance
21 abuse prevention and addiction treatment resources to Idahoans. The grant
22 will be used to support salaries, travel and to purchase print and video re-
23 sources. The print and video resources purchased for dissemination or loan
24 will be tracked by these categories: tobacco prevention and cessation, un-
25 derage drinking prevention and general drug abuse prevention and addiction
26 treatment.

27 SECTION 10. There is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the
28 State Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$2,500,000 from the
29 Idaho Millennium Income Fund to the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare
30 for the Physical Health Services Program for the period July 1, 2014, through
31 June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant is to provide free nicotine replace-
32 ment therapy medication (nicotine patches, gum and lozenges), web-based
33 cessation services and telephonic cessation counseling services to assist
34 people in quitting tobacco use. These funds will help residents who are at-
35 tempting to quit tobacco use and who cannot afford to pay for these services
36 and medications on their own. This funding will also be used to promote the
37 services through television, radio and print. It will help reduce the burden
38 tobacco use places on taxpayers and reduce tobacco-related illnesses and
39 deaths. The grant will also be used for a counter-marketing program that
40 includes social media, grassroots marketing and other activities such as
41 sponsorships and community outreach.

42 SECTION 11. On behalf of the American Cancer Society, Cancer Action
43 Network, there is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the State
44 Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$325,000 from the Idaho Mil-
45 lennium Income Fund to the Idaho Department of Health and Welfare for the
46 Division of Public Health, Bureau of Clinical and Preventive Services, for

1 the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant
2 is to support breast and cervical cancer early detection efforts of the
3 Idaho Women's Health Check Program for qualifying low-income, uninsured or
4 underinsured women. It will also be used to assess tobacco use history of
5 all enrolled clients, referring those who use tobacco to Idaho's QuitLine,
6 QuitNet or other tobacco cessation resources.

7 SECTION 12. There is hereby appropriated \$264,000 from the Idaho Mil-
8 lennium Income Fund to the State Treasurer for distribution to the Idaho Meth
9 Project for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The purpose of
10 this grant is to continue the "Not Even Once" campaign to discourage the use
11 of methamphetamine and to add a prescription drug educational component.
12 The request would be used for continued aggressive teen outreach through
13 digital media, school presentations and community engagement activities.

14 SECTION 13. There is hereby appropriated and, at the request of the
15 State Treasurer, the State Controller shall transfer \$1,859,200 from the
16 Idaho Millennium Income Fund to the Idaho Department of Correction for the
17 Community-Based Substance Abuse Treatment Services Program, for the period
18 July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015. The purpose of this grant is to continue
19 coordination, assessment and community-based substance abuse treatment and
20 recovery support services for felony offenders in lieu of incarceration in a
21 state facility.

22 SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
23 on June 30, 2015, or as soon thereafter as is practicable, any remaining un-
24 expended and unencumbered balance of moneys appropriated in Sections 3, 6,
25 7, 9, 10, 11 and 13 of this act shall be reverted to the Idaho Millennium In-
26 come Fund.

27 SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
28 on June 30, 2015, or as soon thereafter as is practicable, the State Con-
29 troller, at the request of the State Treasurer, shall transfer any remaining
30 unexpended and unencumbered balance of moneys in the Idaho Millennium Income
31 Fund to the Idaho Millennium Fund.
