AN ACT

1 RELATING TO JUSTICE REINVESTMENT; APPROPRIATING ADDITIONAL MONEYS TO THE
2 DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; REDUCING THE APPROPRIA-
3 TION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FOR COMMUNITY SUPERVISION FOR FIS-
4 CAL YEAR 2015; AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS
5 FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTION FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; APPROPRIATING
6 ADDITIONAL MONEYS TO THE COMMISSION FOR PARDONS AND PAROLE FOR FISCAL
7 YEAR 2015; AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL FULL-TIME EQUIVALENT POSITIONS FOR
8 THE COMMISSION FOR PARDONS AND PAROLE FOR FISCAL YEAR 2015; EXPRESSING
9 LEGISLATIVE INTENT REGARDING SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT SERVICES; AND
10 EXPRESSING LEGISLATIVE INTENT REGARDING INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY IM-
11 PROVEMENTS AT THE COMMISSION FOR PARDONS AND PAROLE.

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

14 SECTION 1. In addition to the appropriation made in Section 1 of Senate
15 Bill No. 1421, as enacted by the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-second
16 Idaho Legislature, there is hereby appropriated to the Department of Correc-
17 tion the following amounts to be expended according to the designated pro-
18 grams and expense classes from the listed funds for the period July 1, 2014,
19 through June 30, 2015:

1 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
 2 the appropriation made to the Department of Correction for the Community
 3 Supervision Program in Section 1 of Senate Bill No. 1421, as enacted by
 4 the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-second Idaho Legislature from the
 5 Parolee Supervision Fund is hereby reduced by \$1,192,600 for personnel
 6 costs, for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015.

7 SECTION 3. FTP AUTHORIZATION. The full-time equivalent position autho-
 8 rization provided to the Department of Correction in Section 2 of Senate Bill
 9 No. 1421, as enacted by the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-second Idaho
 10 Legislature, is increased by seven and five-tenths (7.5) for the period July
 11 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015.

12 SECTION 4. In addition to the appropriation made in Section 1 of House
 13 Bill No. 627, as enacted by the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-second
 14 Idaho Legislature, there is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to
 15 the Commission for Pardons and Parole the following amounts to be expended
 16 according to the designated expense classes for the period July 1, 2014,
 17 through June 30, 2015:

23 SECTION 5. FTP AUTHORIZATION. The full-time equivalent position au-
 24 thorization provided to the Commission for Pardons and Parole in Section
 25 2 of House Bill No. 627, as enacted by the Second Regular Session of the
 26 Sixty-second Idaho Legislature, is increased by one (1) for the period July
 27 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015.

28 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the Legislature that
 29 all moneys appropriated to the Department of Correction for the Community-
 30 Based Substance Abuse Treatment Services Program for fiscal year 2015 shall
 31 be used for treatment, drug testing and cognitive programming designed to
 32 reduce offender criminality and recidivism.

33 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is legislative intent that moneys ap-
 34 propriated in Section 4 of this act shall be used to hire a qualified in-
 35 formation technology position to assess commission needs; provide hardware,
 36 software and network support; and design, install, program and maintain all
 37 necessary automated systems. This position will also work with the Depart-
 38 ment of Correction to integrate with their information systems, where appro-
 39 priate, to expedite and improve the flow of information and data between the
 40 commission and the department. In addition to hiring a qualified informa-
 41 tion technology position, moneys may also be expended for contractual ser-
 42 vices, if required, and for the purchase of reasonable and necessary com-
 43 puter equipment and software.
