SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 139

BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2 STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL
3 TO APPOINT A COMMITTEE TO REVIEW AND UNDERSTAND PROFESSIONAL-TECHNICAL
4 EDUCATION IN IDAHO.

5 Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

6 WHEREAS, professional-technical education (PTE) is designed to provide
7 Idaho's youth and adults with technical skills, knowledge and attitudes nec-
8 essary for successful performance in a highly effective workplace; and

9 WHEREAS, according to the Idaho Division of Professional-Technical
10 Education, in 2013, just over 10,000 students were enrolled in 14 profes-
11 sional-technical schools offering 99 programs; and

12 WHEREAS, 64% of high school students who completed a PTE program en-
13 rolled in college as compared to 46% of the general student population; and

14 WHEREAS, 94% of high school students who completed a PTE program suc-
15 cessfully found jobs or continued their education; and

16 WHEREAS, 7,760 full-time and part-time students enrolled in technical
17 college degree or certificate programs; and

18 WHEREAS, 1,859 students graduated from technical colleges with post-
19 secondary degrees and certificates; and

20 WHEREAS, professional-technical education is becoming an increasingly
21 important part of the education of Idahoans.

22 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Ses-
23 sion of the Sixty-second Idaho Legislature, the Senate and the House of Rep-
24 resentatives concurring therein, that the Legislative Council is authorized
25 to appoint a committee to review and understand professional-technical edu-
26 cation in Idaho including, but not limited to, such institutions' finances,
27 curricula, problems and accomplishments and any other relevant information
28 relating to professional-technical education. The Legislative Council
29 shall determine the number of legislators and membership from each house
30 appointed to the committee and shall authorize the committee to receive in-
31 put, advice and assistance from interested and affected parties who are not
32 members of the Legislature.

33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any advisors to the committee who are not
34 legislative members shall not be reimbursed from legislative funds for per
35 diem, mileage or other expenses and shall not have voting privileges regard-
36 ing the committee's recommendations and proposed legislation.

37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall report to the First Reg-
38 ular Session of the Sixty-third Idaho Legislature and detail its findings,
39 recommendations and proposed legislation, if any.
