Chairman Wood(35) called the meeting to order at 2:04 p.m.

DOCKET NO. Regina Phipps of ITD, summarized the rule changes that were at the request of 39-0312-1301:

the industry. 1) Allows for flashing as well as non-flashing lights for the movement of oversize loads after dark. 2) Changes to the minimum dimensions allowed for oversize load signs for towing units and loads to the same size as pilot cars. 3) Clarifies the size and/or length of vehicle combinations allowed to travel in a convoy.

to the full committee. Motion carried by voice vote.

DOCKET NO. Regina Phipps of ITD, said this rule requires excess weight permits for travel on

39-0315-1301: non-interstate highways. It will also clarify excess weight permit requirements

that apply to reducible loads and clarify the permit types required for travel on

each highway.

Regina Phipps of ITD, said the changes clarify the vehicle combinations that are DOCKET NO.

39-0322-1301: governed under this rule, and clarifies that non-interstate routes only will allow

weights above 105,500 lbs. up to 129,000 lbs. This rule specifies the operating requirements on designated routes authorized up to 129,000 lbs. and modifies the order of the information in the rule for better flow and understanding of requirements.

DOCKET NO. Regina Phipps of ITD, said this rule implements the provisions of S 1117 and
