Chairman Palmer called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

Chairman Palmer welcomed Rep. Harold Rynearson to the Committee.

David Lincoln of the Golden Gate Highway District presented "Reports from the Front Lines - the Highway Districts." Mr. Lincoln stated there are 64 highway jurisdictions in Idaho that over see transportation infrastructure. His district consists of 223 miles of roads out of the 1,043 miles in Canyon County, with 120 bridges. He gave examples of failing culverts undermining roads, and washouts. Mr. Lincoln explained the highway districts are doing their best to maintain the roads and bridges; however the time is getting close for a major overhaul. Keeping our roads paved and in good repair helps reduce dust during the harvest time, he said. The Highway Districts are looking at new cost efficient ways to upgrade the road system with limited funds. He stated the road jurisdictions and local governments are now collaborating and planning together to meet the needs of the transportation

system which include waterways.

H 491: Rep. Gestrin provided a recap of H 491 stating the legislation addresses the

definition of a snowmobile by weight. Today many all terrain vehicles can use snow tracks to travel on groomed trails. UTVs, motorcycles, ATVs, and snowmobiles weigh more than 1,000 lb. and less than 2,000 lb., he said. The Counties have the option to allow the heavier vehicles on their trails. Stakeholders have been contacted, and he stated there has been no opposition to this increase in weight to

2.000 lb.
