7 "SECTION 1. That Chapter 51, Title 54, Idaho Code, be, and the same is  
8 hereby repealed.

9 SECTION 2. That all licenses issued under Chapter 51, Title 54, Idaho  
10 Code, as repealed by Section 1 of this act, are deemed to have expired and  
11 further are hereby declared to be null and void.

12 SECTION 3. That Title 54, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended  
13 by the addition thereto of a NEW CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chap-  
14 ter 56, Title 54, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

CHAPTER 56

NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL PHYSICIANS LICENSING ACT

17 54-5601. LEGISLATIVE PURPOSE AND INTENT. It is the intent of the Idaho  
18 legislature to regulate the practice of naturopathic medicine. Nothing in  
19 this chapter will limit the decision in State v. Smith, 81 Idaho 103, 337  
20 P.2d 938, except to the extent that certain modalities of treatment shall  
21 require a license pursuant to this chapter. Furthermore, it is not the in-  
22 tent of this chapter to prohibit the use of the term "doctor" nor to limit the  
23 practice of naturopathy as explained in State v. Smith.

24 54-5602. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

25 (1) "Approved naturopathic medical program" means a naturopathic medi-  
26 cal education program in the United States or Canada that provides the degree  
27 of doctor of naturopathy or doctor of naturopathic medicine, that includes  
28 graduate level full-time didactic and supervised clinical training and is  
29 either accredited or has achieved candidacy status for accreditation by the  
30 council on naturopathic medical education (CNME) or an equivalent federally  
31 recognized accrediting body for naturopathic medical programs. Addition-  
32 ally, the program shall be an institution, or part of an institution, of  
33 higher education that is either accredited or is a candidate for accred-

1 itation by a regional accrediting agency recognized by the United States  
2 department of education.

3 (2) "Board" means the board of naturopathic medical physicians created  
4 pursuant to section 54-5606, Idaho Code.

5 (3) "Formulary" means the lists of prescription medicines and legend  
6 drugs that naturopathic medical physicians and naturopathic physicians li-  
7 censed under this chapter may use in the practice of their profession.

8 (4) "Minor office procedures" means the methods for the repair and care  
9 incidental to superficial lacerations and abrasions, superficial lesions  
10 and the removal of foreign bodies located in the superficial tissues.

11 (5) "Naturopathic medical physician" means a person authorized and li-  
12 censed to practice naturopathic medicine under this chapter.

13 (6) "Naturopathic medicine" means a distinct and comprehensive system  
14 of primary health care practiced by naturopathic medical physicians.

15 (7) "Naturopathic physician" means a person licensed to provide natur-  
16 opathic medical services under this chapter.

17 (8) "Naturopathic medical services" means the broad range of natural  
18 and holistic treatments including, but not limited to, the administration,  
19 monitoring and prescribing of natural based minerals and vitamins as ap-  
20 proved by board rule.

21 54-5603. SCOPE OF PRACTICE. (1) Naturopathic medical physicians may  
22 use physical and laboratory examinations consistent with naturopathic med-  
23 ical education and training for diagnostic purposes. Naturopathic medical  
24 physicians may order and perform diagnostic and imaging tests consistent  
25 with naturopathic medical education and training. All diagnostic and imag-  
26 ing tests not consistent with naturopathic medical education and training  
27 must be referred for performance and interpretation by an appropriately li-  
28 censed health care professional.

29 (2) Naturopathic medical physicians licensed under this chapter are  
30 authorized to dispense, administer and prescribe prescription drugs and  
31 medical devices as determined by the formulary and authorized by board rule.

32 (3) Naturopathic medical physicians licensed under this chapter may  
33 perform minor office procedures pursuant to privileges authorized by board  
34 rule.

35 (4) A naturopathic medical physician may perform those therapies for  
36 which he has been trained and educated and that are not inconsistent with the  
37 provisions of this chapter that are authorized by board rule.

38 (5) Naturopathic physicians licensed under this chapter are authorized  
39 to provide naturopathic medical services as approved by board rules.

40 54-5604. EXEMPTIONS FOR LICENSURE. This chapter is not intended to and  
41 does not prohibit, restrict or apply to:

42 (1) The practice of a profession by individuals who are licensed, cer-  
43 tified or registered under other laws of this state and are performing ser-  
44 vices within the authorized scope of practice;

45 (2) The practice of naturopathic medicine by an individual employed by  
46 the federal government while the individual is engaged in the performance of  
47 duties prescribed by the laws and regulations of the United States;

1 (3) An individual rendering aid to a family member or in an emergency,  
2 when no fee or other consideration for the service is charged, received, ex-  
3 pected or contemplated;

4 (4) An individual engaged in the sale of vitamins, health foods, over-  
5 the-counter homeopathic products, dietary supplements, herbs or other prod-  
6 ucts of nature, the sale of which is not otherwise prohibited under state or  
7 federal law;

8 (5) The practice by a naturopathic medical physician duly licensed in  
9 another state, territory or the District of Columbia when that naturopathic  
10 medical physician is incidentally called into this state for consultation  
11 with a physician licensed pursuant to this chapter or chapter 18, title 54,  
12 Idaho Code; or

13 (6) The practice of naturopathic medical medicine by students enrolled  
14 in an approved naturopathic medical program. Services shall be performed  
15 pursuant to a course of instruction or assignments from an instructor and un-  
16 der the supervision and observation of the instructor.

17 54-5605. NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL PHYSICIAN AND NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN  
18 LICENSE REQUIRED. (1) A license shall be required for a person to utilize the  
19 formularies and perform minor office procedures authorized by rule under  
20 this chapter.

21 (2) Those practicing without a license shall disclose to their patients  
22 that they are not naturopathic medical physicians, naturopathic physicians  
23 or physicians as required in section 54-1804, Idaho Code.

24 54-5606. BOARD OF NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL PHYSICIANS -- ORGANIZATION AND  
25 MEETINGS. (1) There is hereby established in the department of self-govern-  
26 ing agencies, bureau of occupational licenses, the board of naturopathic  
27 medical physicians. The board shall consist of five (5) members appointed  
28 by the governor, two (2) of whom shall be licensed pursuant to section  
29 54-5608(1)(a), Idaho Code, one (1) of whom shall be licensed pursuant to  
30 section 54-5608(2), Idaho Code, one (1) of whom shall be a physician licensed  
31 pursuant to chapter 18, title 54, Idaho Code, and one (1) of whom shall be  
32 a pharmacist licensed pursuant to chapter 17, title 54, Idaho Code. Board  
33 members shall serve at the pleasure of the governor.

34 (2) One (1) member of the initial board shall be appointed for a one (1)  
35 year term of office; one (1) member of the initial board shall be appointed  
36 for a two (2) year term of office; one (1) member of the initial board shall  
37 be appointed for a three (3) year term of office; one (1) member of the ini-  
38 tial board shall be appointed for a four (4) year term of office; and one (1)  
39 member of the initial board shall be appointed for a five (5) year term of of-  
40 fice. Thereafter, the term of office for each board member shall be five (5)  
41 years.

42 (3) The initial two (2) licensed naturopathic medical physician  
43 board members shall be eligible to become licensed pursuant to section  
44 54-5608(1)(a), Idaho Code, and shall have been practicing naturopathic  
45 medicine in the state of Idaho for at least the two (2) years immediately  
46 preceding their appointment. The initial licensed naturopathic physi-  
47 cian board member shall be eligible to become licensed pursuant to section  
48 54-5608(2), Idaho Code, and shall have been practicing naturopathic medical

1 services in the state of Idaho for at least two (2) years immediately preced-  
2 ing their appointment.

3 (4) After initial board members are appointed, the two (2) board mem-  
4 bers who are naturopathic medical physicians shall be licensed pursuant to  
5 section 54-5608(1)(a), Idaho Code, and the one (1) board member who is a  
6 naturopathic physician shall be licensed pursuant to section 54-5608(2),  
7 Idaho Code, shall actively practice naturopathic medicine or naturopathic  
8 medical services in the state of Idaho for the duration of their appoint-  
9 ment and shall have been practicing naturopathic medicine or naturopathic  
10 medical services for at least two (2) years immediately preceding their ap-  
11 pointment.

12 (5) Upon initial appointment of the board and thereafter, whenever a  
13 term of a member of the board who is licensed pursuant to chapter 18, ti-  
14 tle 54, Idaho Code, expires or becomes vacant, the Idaho medical association  
15 shall nominate three (3) persons licensed pursuant to chapter 18, title 54,  
16 Idaho Code, for such vacancy and shall forward the nominations to the gover-  
17 nor who shall give consideration to such nominees.

18 (6) Upon initial appointment of the board and thereafter, whenever a  
19 term of a member of the board who is licensed pursuant to chapter 17, title  
20 54, Idaho Code, expires or becomes vacant, the Idaho board of pharmacy shall  
21 nominate three (3) persons licensed pursuant to chapter 17, title 54, Idaho  
22 Code, for such vacancy and shall forward the nominations to the governor who  
23 shall give consideration to such nominees.

24 (7) In the event of the death, resignation or removal of any board mem-  
25 ber before the expiration of the term to which the board member is appointed,  
26 the vacancy shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in the same  
27 manner as the original appointment.

28 (8) Within thirty (30) days after its appointment, the initial board  
29 shall hold a meeting and elect a chairperson. The board shall meet at least  
30 annually thereafter and may hold additional meetings at the call of the  
31 chairperson or at the written request of any two (2) members of the board. A  
32 majority of the board shall constitute a quorum. The vote of a majority of  
33 members present at a meeting wherein a quorum is present shall determine the  
34 action of the board, except as otherwise provided in this chapter.

35 (9) Each member of the board shall be compensated as provided in section  
36 59-509(n), Idaho Code.

37 54-5607. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD. The board shall have the au-  
38 thority and responsibility to:

39 (1) Receive applications of persons applying for licensure, determine  
40 the qualifications of persons applying for licensure and provide licenses to  
41 applicants qualified under this chapter;

42 (2) Establish by rule and collect fees from applicants for licensure  
43 and for renewal of licensure;

44 (3) Establish by rule the minimum amount and type of continuing educa-  
45 tion to be required for each licensee seeking renewal;

46 (4) Investigate complaints against persons who are licensed under this  
47 chapter and those utilizing substances on a formulary adopted under this  
48 chapter or performing minor office procedures without a license;

1 (5) Undertake, when appropriate, disciplinary proceedings and disci-  
2 plinary action against persons licensed under this chapter;

3 (6) Provide such other services and perform such other functions as are  
4 consistent with this chapter as are necessary and desirable to fulfill its  
5 purposes;

6 (7) Recover the costs and fees, including attorney's fees, incurred in  
7 the investigation and prosecution of any person who is found in violation of  
8 this chapter or the board's rules;

9 (8) Promulgate and adopt rules, pursuant to chapter 52, title 67, Idaho  
10 Code, necessary to administer the provisions of this chapter; provided, how-  
11 ever, that all rules shall be approved by the unanimous vote of the entire  
12 board;

13 (9) Establish special competency certification requirements for li-  
14 censees as deemed necessary and approved by board rule;

15 (10) The board shall establish by rule two (2) formularies. The for-  
16 mulary list for naturopathic medical physicians shall be based upon natur-  
17 opathic medical education, training and continuing education, but may not  
18 go beyond the scope of prescription medicines and medical devices covered  
19 by approved naturopathic medical education and training or board-approved  
20 continuing education. The naturopathic medical formulary shall not include  
21 medicines and devices that are inconsistent with the training provided by  
22 approved naturopathic medical programs and continuing education. The for-  
23 mulary shall be approved by board rule. The formulary list for naturopathic  
24 physicians shall be based on the education and training of naturopathic  
25 physicians and shall be approved by rule; and

26 (11) Authorize by written agreement the bureau of occupational licenses  
27 to act as agent in its interest.

28 54-5608. QUALIFICATIONS FOR LICENSURE. (1) Naturopathic medical  
29 physician. To be eligible for a license to practice as a naturopathic  
30 medical physician in the state of Idaho, the applicant shall submit an appli-  
31 cation, pay the fee and fulfill the following requirements:

32 (a) The applicant must be a graduate of an approved naturopathic medi-  
33 cal program as defined in section 54-5602(1), Idaho Code; or

34 (b) The applicant must be a graduate of a college or university in the  
35 United States or Canada, prior to 1992, that is still in existence and  
36 that offered a full-time structured curriculum in basic sciences and  
37 supervised patient care comprising a doctoral naturopathic medical ed-  
38 ucation as a prerequisite to graduation, having been not less than one  
39 hundred thirty-two (132) weeks in duration and that required completion  
40 within a period of not less than thirty-five (35) months and have been  
41 continually practicing for five (5) years immediately preceding licen-  
42 sure.

43 (2) Naturopathic physician. To be eligible for a license to practice as  
44 a naturopathic physician in the state of Idaho, the applicant shall submit an  
45 application, pay the fee and fulfill the following requirements:

46 (a) Have been issued a license by the board of naturopathic medical  
47 examiners under chapter 51, title 54, Idaho Code, as it existed at the  
48 time such licenses were issued and while the board had a contract with  
49 the bureau of occupational licenses and such license was not revoked by

1 the board of naturopathic medical examiners. Any license issued by the  
2 board of naturopathic medical examiners when it did not have a contract  
3 with the bureau of occupational licenses shall not be recognized as a  
4 valid license; or

5 (b) Been licensed as a chiropractor prior to 1993 and have received any  
6 naturopathic degree and have been providing naturopathic medical ser-  
7 vices in Idaho prior to 2011.

8 (3) Examination. Applicants for initial licensure who meet the qual-  
9 ifications of subsection (1) (a) of this section and all applicants after  
10 July 1, 2016, shall provide proof of having received a passing grade on the  
11 naturopathic physicians licensing examinations (NPLEX), administered by  
12 the North American board of naturopathic examiners (NABNE). The passing  
13 grade for each specific examination administration shall be as determined by  
14 the NABNE.

15 54-5609. LICENSE STANDARDS -- ENDORSEMENT. The board shall establish  
16 by rule the standards for licensure of applicants of a naturopathic medi-  
17 cal physician licensed in another jurisdiction. However, the standards for  
18 endorsement of licensure shall not be less than those required by section  
19 54-5608(1) (a) and (3), Idaho Code. The board shall not endorse those prac-  
20 ticing naturopathic medical services in other jurisdictions.

21 54-5610. LICENSE RENEWAL. All licenses issued under this chapter  
22 shall be for a term of one (1) year and shall expire on the birthday of the  
23 licensee unless renewed in the manner prescribed by rule. Except as set  
24 forth in this chapter, rules governing procedures and conditions for license  
25 renewal and reinstatement shall be in accordance with section 67-2614, Idaho  
26 Code.

27 54-5611. FEES. (1) The board shall establish by rule fees for licen-  
28 sure pursuant to the provisions of this chapter as follows:

29 (a) An application fee for licensure not to exceed two hundred fifty  
30 dollars (\$250);

31 (b) The fee for the initial naturopathic medical physician and naturo-  
32 pathic physician license not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000);

33 (c) The fee for the renewal of a naturopathic medical physician and  
34 naturopathic physician license not to exceed one thousand dollars  
35 (\$1,000); and

36 (d) The application fee shall be in addition to the initial license fee.

37 (2) All fees received under the provisions of this section shall be non-  
38 refundable and shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of the  
39 occupational license account in the dedicated fund, and all costs and ex-  
40 penses incurred by the board under the provisions of this chapter shall be a  
41 charge against and paid from the account for such purposes. Notwithstand-  
42 ing any other provisions of law, the funds collected pursuant to this section  
43 shall be immediately available for the administration of this chapter.

44 (3) The board of naturopathic medical physicians shall have the au-  
45 thority and responsibility to pay outstanding debts of any previous board  
46 that regulated naturopathic physicians and was administered by the depart-  
47 ment of self-governing agencies, bureau of occupational licenses. The re-

1 payment of such debt shall be deposited in the state treasury to the credit of  
2 the occupational licenses account.

3 54-5612. DENIAL OF LICENSE AND DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS. (1) The  
4 board may refuse to issue or renew a license or may revoke, suspend or other-  
5 wise discipline a license holder for any of the following grounds:

6 (a) The use of fraud or deceit in obtaining a license under this chapter  
7 or in connection with services rendered as a naturopathic physician;

8 (b) A legal finding of mental incompetence;

9 (c) Aiding or abetting a person, not duly licensed under this chap-  
10 ter, in claiming to be a naturopathic medical physician or naturopathic  
11 physician or in practicing naturopathic medicine or naturopathic med-  
12 ical services;

13 (d) Any gross negligence, incompetence or misconduct in the perfor-  
14 mance of naturopathic medicine or naturopathic medical services;

15 (e) Conviction of a felony, or a crime involving moral turpitude, or the  
16 entering of a plea of guilty or the finding of guilt by a jury or court of  
17 commission of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude;

18 (f) Practicing as a naturopathic medical physician or naturopathic  
19 physician when physical or mental abilities are impaired by the use of  
20 controlled substances or other drugs, chemicals or alcohol;

21 (g) Failure of the individual practitioner to maintain his profes-  
22 sional premises in a clean and sanitary condition;

23 (h) Any other good cause, relevant to qualifications to practice as a  
24 naturopathic medical physician or naturopathic physician. The board  
25 may not suspend, revoke or refuse to issue or renew a license based on  
26 the findings that a licensee's practice is unconventional in the ab-  
27 sence of demonstrable harm to a patient and the patient has signed a  
28 waiver to the effect that the treatment or device is considered uncon-  
29 ventional;

30 (i) Failure to demonstrate compliance with continuing education re-  
31 quirements as determined by the board;

32 (j) Violating any law or rule pursuant to this chapter;

33 (k) Having been convicted of any crime that reflects adversely on the  
34 person's fitness to be licensed or registered pursuant this chapter;

35 (l) Having a license to practice naturopathic medicine or other health  
36 care license or certificate refused, revoked or suspended or otherwise  
37 disciplined by any state, territory, district of the United States or  
38 Canada for reasons that relate to the applicant's ability to skillfully  
39 and safely practice naturopathic medicine or naturopathic medical ser-  
40 vices, or other health care profession, unless that license or certifi-  
41 cation has been restored to good standing by that jurisdiction;

42 (m) Prescribing, dispensing or administering any controlled substance  
43 or device identified under the uniform controlled substances act, chap-  
44 ter 27, title 37, Idaho Code, or identified in the federal controlled  
45 substances act, 21 U.S.C. sections 801 through 971 (1988), as amended,  
46 except as authorized by this chapter;

47 (n) Performing surgical procedures, except for naturopathic medical  
48 physicians, those minor office procedures authorized by board rule;

1 (o) For naturopathic physicians, performing surgical procedures or mi-  
2 nor office procedures;

3 (p) Practicing or claiming to practice as a medical doctor, osteopath,  
4 dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, psychologist, advanced practice  
5 professional nurse, physician assistant, chiropractor, physical ther-  
6 apist, acupuncturist or any other health care professional not autho-  
7 rized in this chapter unless licensed by the state of Idaho to do so;

8 (q) Using general or spinal anesthetics;

9 (r) Administering ionizing radioactive substances for therapeutic  
10 purposes;

11 (s) Performing minor office procedures using a laser device;

12 (t) Inducing or performing an abortion;

13 (u) Performing minor office procedures involving the eye, ear, ten-  
14 dons, nerves, veins or arteries extending beyond superficial tissue;

15 (v) Treating any lesion suspicious of malignancy or requiring surgical  
16 removal. Lesions suspicious of malignancy or requiring surgical re-  
17 moval shall be referred to a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 18,  
18 title 54, Idaho Code, naturopathic medical physicians may comanage this  
19 care with a physician licensed pursuant to chapter 18, title 54, Idaho  
20 Code;

21 (w) Performing chiropractic adjustments as defined in section 54-704,  
22 Idaho Code, unless licensed to do so;

23 (x) Performing physical therapy as defined in section 54-2203, Idaho  
24 Code; or

25 (y) Failure to comply with a board order.

26 (2) The board may reinstate any revoked or suspended license upon such  
27 terms as it may determine.

28 (3) The board may by rule provide a procedure for an applicant to re-  
29 quest an exemption review for a felony or lesser crime conviction. The ap-  
30 plicant shall bear the burden and financial responsibility of providing all  
31 evidence, documentation and proof of suitability for licensure required by  
32 the board for exemption review.

33 54-5613. CERTAIN ACTS PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for any person  
34 to engage in any of the following acts:

35 (1) To violate any of the provisions of this chapter and any rules pro-  
36 mulgated pursuant thereto;

37 (2) It shall be a misdemeanor to utilize the formularies or practice mi-  
38 nor office procedures without having at the time of so doing, a valid, unex-  
39 pired, unrevoked and unsuspended license issued under this chapter; or

40 (3) It shall be a misdemeanor to represent one's self or assume or  
41 use the title or designation "physician" in association with the prac-  
42 tice of naturopathic medicine, or naturopathic medical services or the  
43 abbreviations "NMD" or any other title, designations, words, letters, ab-  
44 breviations, sign, card or device to indicate to the public that such person  
45 is licensed to practice naturopathic medicine or naturopathic medical ser-  
46 vices pursuant to this chapter unless such person is so licensed under this  
47 chapter.



1           54-5614.   PREEMPTION OF LOCAL REGULATIONS. Beginning July 1, 2016, a  
2 local unit of government shall not establish or maintain professional li-  
3 censing requirements for a naturopathic medical physician or a naturopathic  
4 physician licensed pursuant to this chapter.

5           54-5615.   SEVERABILITY. The provisions of this chapter are hereby de-  
6 clared to be severable, and if any provision of this chapter or the applica-  
7 tion of such provision to any person or circumstance is declared invalid for  
8 any reason, such declaration shall not affect the validity of the remaining  
9 portions of this chapter.

10           SECTION 4. That Section 67-2601, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby  
11 amended to read as follows:

12           67-2601.   DEPARTMENT CREATED -- ORGANIZATION -- DIRECTOR -- BUREAU OF  
13 OCCUPATIONAL LICENSES CREATED. (1) There is hereby created the department of  
14 self-governing agencies. The department shall, for the purposes of section  
15 20, article IV, of the constitution of the state of Idaho, be an executive  
16 department of the state government.

17           (2) The department shall consist of the following:

18           (a) Agricultural commodity commissions: Idaho apple commission, as  
19 provided by chapter 36, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho bean commission,  
20 as provided by chapter 29, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho beef council, as  
21 provided by chapter 29, title 25, Idaho Code; Idaho cherry commission,  
22 as provided by chapter 37, title 22, Idaho Code; Idaho dairy products  
23 commission, as provided by chapter 31, title 25, Idaho Code; Idaho pea  
24 and lentil commission, as provided by chapter 35, title 22, Idaho Code;  
25 Idaho potato commission, as provided by chapter 12, title 22, Idaho  
26 Code; the Idaho wheat commission, as provided by chapter 33, title 22,  
27 Idaho Code; the Idaho aquaculture commission, as provided by chapter  
28 44, title 22, Idaho Code; and the Idaho alfalfa and clover seed commis-  
29 sion, as provided in chapter 42, title 22, Idaho Code.

30           (b) Professional and occupational licensing boards: Idaho state board  
31 of certified public accountancy, as provided by chapter 2, title 54,  
32 Idaho Code; board of acupuncture, as provided by chapter 47, title 54,  
33 Idaho Code; board of architectural examiners, as provided by chapter  
34 3, title 54, Idaho Code; office of the state athletic director, as pro-  
35 vided by chapter 4, title 54, Idaho Code; board of barber examiners, as  
36 provided by chapter 5, title 54, Idaho Code; board of commissioners of  
37 the Idaho state bar, as provided by chapter 4, title 3, Idaho Code; board
