2 RELATING TO GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS; AMENDING SECTION 33-119, IDAHO CODE,
3 TO PROVIDE FOR AN ALTERNATE ROUTE TO QUALIFY FOR GRADUATION FROM AN AC-
4 CREDITED SECONDARY SCHOOL.

5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

6 SECTION 1. That Section 33-119, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
7 amended to read as follows:

8 33-119. ACCREDITATION OF SECONDARY SCHOOLS -- STANDARDS FOR ELEMEN-
9 TARY SCHOOLS -- GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS AND ALTERNATE ROUTES. (1) The state
10 board shall establish standards for accreditation of any secondary school
11 and set forth minimum requirements to be met by public, private and parochial
12 secondary schools, and those in chartered school districts, for accredited
13 status; and the board may establish such standards for all public elementary
14 schools as it may deem necessary.

15 (2) The board may withdraw accreditation from any secondary school af-
16 ter such period as it may establish when it has been determined that such
17 school has failed or neglected to conform to accreditation standards; and it
18 may reinstate such school as accredited when in its judgment such school has
19 again qualified for accredited status.

20 (3) The board may ~~further~~ establish minimum requirements which any
21 pupil shall meet to qualify for graduation from an accredited secondary
22 school. If any such requirement includes the passage of a standards achieve-
23 ment test, then the student, with parent or guardian approval, may, in lieu
24 of such test, choose an alternate route to meet this requirement offered by
25 the school district or charter district in which the pupil attends secondary
26 school.

27 (4) "Secondary school" for the purposes of this section shall mean a
28 school which, for operational purposes, is organized and administered on the
29 basis of grades seven (7) through twelve (12), inclusive, or any combination
30 thereof.

31 (5) "Elementary school" for the purposes of this section shall mean a
32 school which, for operational purposes, is organized and administered on the
33 basis of grades one (1) through six (6), inclusive, one (1) through eight
34 (8), inclusive, or any combination of grades one (1) through eight (8), in-
35 clusive.
