Chairman Holtzclaw called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

Dennis Stevenson, Rules Coordinator, Department of Administration, gave the subcommittee an overview of the role legislators play in reviewing Administrative Rules.

DOCKET NO. 31-0201-1401: **Paul Kjellander**, Commissioner, Public Utilities Commission, presented **Docket No. 31-0201-1401**. He stated the pending Rules eliminate a small set of the Public Utilities Commission's Public Records Rules and replace them with Public Records Guidelines. He also stated the Guidelines are substantially the same as the existing Rules in IDAPA 31.02.01.

In response to committee questions, **Mr. Kjellander** stated there is no fiscal impact of the pending Rules.

MOTION: **Rep. Bateman** made a motion to recommend that the full committee approve **Docket No. 31-0201-1401. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 15-1001-1401: **Tony Faraca**, Chief Deputy, Idaho State Liquor Division, presented **Docket No. 15-1001-1401**. He stated the pending Rules allow manufacturers of distilled spirits to provide limited retail sales to their visitors and offer sample tasting consumption on the premises of the distillery/distributing station.

In response to committee questions, **Tim Davis**, Deputy Attorney General, stated the term "distillery station" is not in the Idaho Code but there are many terms throughout the Administrative Rules that are not in the Idaho Code. He also stated that the Liquor Division has the authority to make such a Rule.

MOTION: **Rep. Wintrow** made a motion to recommend that the full committee approve **Docket No. 15-1001-1401. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 38-0404-1401: **Jennifer Pike**, Public Information Specialist, Department of Administration, presented **Docket No. 38-0404-1401**. She stated the Capitol Mall Parking Rules were created to amend the existing Rules to make possible the utilization, management, and collection of fees for the newly constructed parking garage located on the Capitol Mall. The Rules update the parking locations and adds a reference to the newly constructed garage at 7th Street and Washington Street, increases the cap on the number of reserved spaces from 15% to 25%, defines legislative parking, defines visitor parking at the Capitol Mall Annex, clarifies eligibility requirements for specific permits, and increases the monthly parking fees for reserved and general parking permits.

In response to committee questions, **Ms. Pike** stated that fees for the Capitol Mall parking garages is very comparative and the other garages in the area are generally \$30-50 more per permit. She stated that security in the garages is provided by an outside security company who monitor and secure the garages and have direct contact with Idaho State Police and Boise City Police in case of any emergencies.

MOTION: **Rep. Cheatham** made a motion to recommend that the full committee approve **Docket No. 38-0404-1401. Motion carried by voice vote.**

ADJOURN: There being no further business to come before the subcommittee, the meeting was adjourned at 9:40 a.m.
