RS 23416C1: David Ripley, Idaho Chooses Life, presented RS 23416C1, proposed legislation

that requires a physician to conduct an in-person examination and counseling of a

pregnant woman prior to prescribing abortion inducing drugs.

In response to committee questions, Mr. Ripley stated the legislation has nothing

to do with FDA regulations.

as voting NAY.

RS 23435C1: Greg Pruett, Idaho Second Amendment Alliance, presented RS 23435C1,

proposed legislation that would further enforce law-abiding citizens' Second

Amendment rights to carry concealed weapons without a permit.

In response to committee questions, **Mr. Pruett** stated there are five other states with the same law. They are Vermont, Montana, Alaska, Arizona and Wyoming. He stated no training will be required to carry concealed weapons under this legislation and it is difficult to gauge when someone has had sufficient training to protect

themselves.

vote. Reps. Jordan, McCrostie, Smith and Wintrow requested they be recorded

as voting NAY.

RS 23319: Cally Younger, Office of the Governor, presented RS 23319, proposed legislation

that moves existing public record, open meeting, ethics of government, and prohibition against contracts with officers statutes into a new title of the Idaho Code

called "Transparent and Ethical Government".

In response to committee questions, **Ms. Younger** stated her office came to the conclusion that it would be easier for the public to find the information in the Idaho Code if it was centrally located. She stated as far as she knows there is no fiscal impact because every year the Code Commission prints new copies of the Idaho

Code.
