2 RELATING TO HEALTH CARE; AMENDING TITLE 39, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF
3 A NEW CHAPTER 92, TITLE 39, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE A SHORT TITLE, TO
4 DECLARE PUBLIC POLICY AND TO PROVIDE THAT DIRECT PRIMARY CARE AGREE-
5 MENTS DO NOT CONSTITUTE INSURANCE, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO SPECIFY THAT
6 DIRECT PRIMARY CARE AGREEMENTS INCLUDE CERTAIN PROVISIONS, TO PROHIBIT
7 MEDICAL PROVIDERS FROM BILLING INSURERS FOR DIRECT PRIMARY CARE, TO
8 PROVIDE THAT DIRECT PRIMARY CARE AGREEMENTS SHALL NOT BE REGULATED AS
9 INSURANCE, TO PROVIDE THAT DIRECT PRIMARY CARE AGREEMENTS INCLUDE A
10 DISCLAIMER AND TO RESTRICT SALES OR TRANSFERS OF DIRECT PRIMARY CARE
11 AGREEMENTS.

12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

13 SECTION 1. That Title 39, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended
14 by the addition thereto of a NEW CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chap-
15 ter 92, Title 39, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

16 CHAPTER 92
17 IDAHO DIRECT PRIMARY CARE ACT

18 39-9201. SHORT TITLE. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as
19 the "Idaho Direct Primary Care Act."

20 39-9202. PUBLIC POLICY. It is the policy of the state of Idaho to
21 promote personal responsibility for health care and the cost-effective
22 delivery of medical services by encouraging innovative use of direct pa-
23 tient-provider practices for primary medical care. Direct patient-provider
24 practices utilize a model of periodic fees for provider access and medical
25 management over time, rather than simply a fee for visit or procedure service
26 model. Some patients and individual primary care providers may wish to es-
27 tablish direct agreements with one another as an alternative to traditional
28 fee-for-service care financed through health insurance. The purpose of this
29 act is to confirm that direct patient-provider agreements that satisfy the
30 provisions of this chapter do not constitute insurance.

31 39-9203. DEFINITIONS. For purposes of this chapter, the following
32 definitions apply:

33 (1) "Direct primary care agreement" means a written contract between a
34 primary care provider and an individual patient or a patient's representa-
35 tive in which the primary care provider agrees to provide direct primary care
36 services to the patient over a specified period of time for payment of a di-
37 rect fee.

1 (2) "Direct fee" means an agreed-upon fee charged by a primary care
2 provider as consideration for providing and being available to provide di-
3 rect primary care services described in a direct primary care agreement.

4 (3) "Direct primary care services" means those services that a primary
5 care provider is licensed or otherwise legally authorized to provide and may
6 include, but are not limited to, such services as screening, assessment, di-
7 agnosis and treatment for the purpose of promoting health, and detection,
8 management and care of disease or injury, which services are rendered in the
9 primary care provider's office or the patient's home.

10 (4) "Primary care provider" means a natural person licensed or other-
11 wise legally authorized to provide health care services in the state of Idaho
12 in the field of pediatrics, family practice or internal medicine, who pro-
13 vides such services either alone or in professional association with others
14 in a form and within a scope permitted by such licensure or legal authoriza-
15 tion for the provision of such services, and who enters into a direct primary
16 care agreement.

17 (5) "Patient" means a person who is entitled to receive direct primary
18 care services under a direct care agreement.

19 (6) "Patient's representative" means a person identified in section
20 39-4504(1) (a) through (g), Idaho Code.

21 39-9204. DIRECT PRIMARY CARE AGREEMENT PROVISIONS. (1) A direct pri-
22 mary care agreement shall identify:

23 (a) The primary care provider and the patient;

24 (b) The general scope of services as well as the specific services to be
25 provided by the primary care provider;

26 (c) The location or locations where services are to be provided;

27 (d) The amount of the direct fee and the time interval at which it is to
28 be paid; and

29 (e) The term of the agreement and the conditions upon which it may be
30 terminated by the primary care provider. The agreement shall be ter-
31 minable at will by written notice from the patient to the primary care
32 provider.

33 (2) If a party provides written notice of termination of the direct pri-
34 mary care agreement, the primary care provider shall refund to the patient
35 all unearned direct fees within thirty (30) days following the notice of ter-
36 mination.

37 39-9205. INSURANCE BILLING PROHIBITED. Neither the patient nor the
38 primary care provider shall submit a bill to an insurer for the services pro-
39 vided under a direct primary care agreement.

40 39-9206. AGREEMENTS NOT CLASSIFIED AS INSURANCE. Direct primary care
41 agreements are not subject to regulation as insurance under title 41, Idaho
42 Code.

43 39-9207. DISCLAIMER. A direct primary care agreement shall include
44 the following disclaimer: "This agreement does not provide health insurance
45 coverage, including the minimal essential coverage required by applicable
46 federal law. It provides only the services described herein. It is recom-

1 mended that health care insurance be obtained to cover medical services not
2 provided for under this direct primary care agreement."

3 39-9208. RESTRICTIONS ON TRANSFER. A direct primary care agreement
4 may not be sold or transferred by the primary care provider without the
5 written consent of the patient and may be transferred only to another pri-
6 mary care provider. A direct primary care agreement may not be sold to a
7 group, employer or group of subscribers because it is an individual agree-
8 ment between a primary care provider and a patient. These limitations do
9 not prohibit the presentation of marketing materials to groups of potential
10 patients or their representatives but said marketing materials are subject
11 to chapter 6, title 48, Idaho Code.
