Chairman Loertscher called the meeting to order at 9:06 a.m.

MOTION: Rep. Sims made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 18, 19, 20, 2015

meetings. Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 23928: Rep. Wintrow presented RS 23928, a joint memorial that urges the government of

Turkey to respect the rights and religious freedoms of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of the Eastern Orthodox Church. The Ecumenical Patriarch is the leader of the second largest Christian faith worldwide with approximately 300 million followers. The seat of the church has been centered in Constantinople/Istanbul for the past 2,000 years. However, Christians in Turkey have experienced great persecution which includes the government's interference with the selection of their leader, the closing of their seminary where clergy are trained, confiscation of property, physical

violence, and the inability to worship in public.

MOTION: Rep. McCrostie made a motion to introduce RS 23928 and recommend it be sent

directly to the Second Reading Calendar. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep.

Wintrow will sponsor the bill on the floor.

S 1146aa: Senator McKenzie presented S 1146aa, a bill, known as Alexis' Law, that provides

a limited affirmative defense for the possession of or use of cannabidiol (CBD) oil, a type of hemp oil containing only trace amounts of tetrahydrocannabidiol, which can reduce the number and duration of seizures in children and adults living with epilepsy. Alexis' Law is named for a 10 year-old girl living in Idaho who suffers from

Dravet Syndrome, a form of intractable epilepsy.

In response to committee questions, **Senator McKenzie** stated the legislation was created to assist parents who have children suffering from intractable seizures and who do not want to use many of the medications approved by the FDA because they have very negative effects such as brain damage and liver damage and are not safe for long term use. He stated there is federal legislation pending for a similar law to come into effect. He stated there is no danger for abuse with the oil because it is not addictive and does not give the high effect like marijuana.

Elisha Figuerroa, Governors Office of Drug Policy, spoke **in opposition** to **S 1146aa** and stated the oil is illegal according to federal law. She stated the oil needs to go through the FDA process to get the oil approved before it should be used. She stated the lab reports mentioned in the bill can be created by anyone and the bill does not specify what type of lab. She stated **S 1156** offers an alternative without breaking the law. She stated the parents can get into trouble

for transporting the oil over state lines.
