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- During the next 10 years, state and county savings’ offsets total \$649.7 million*. The federal match in 2017 is 95%, eventually dropping to 90% in 2020. The 10-year net cost is estimated at \$186.9 million.
- Provides healthcare access for 117,644 Idaho adults and veterans
