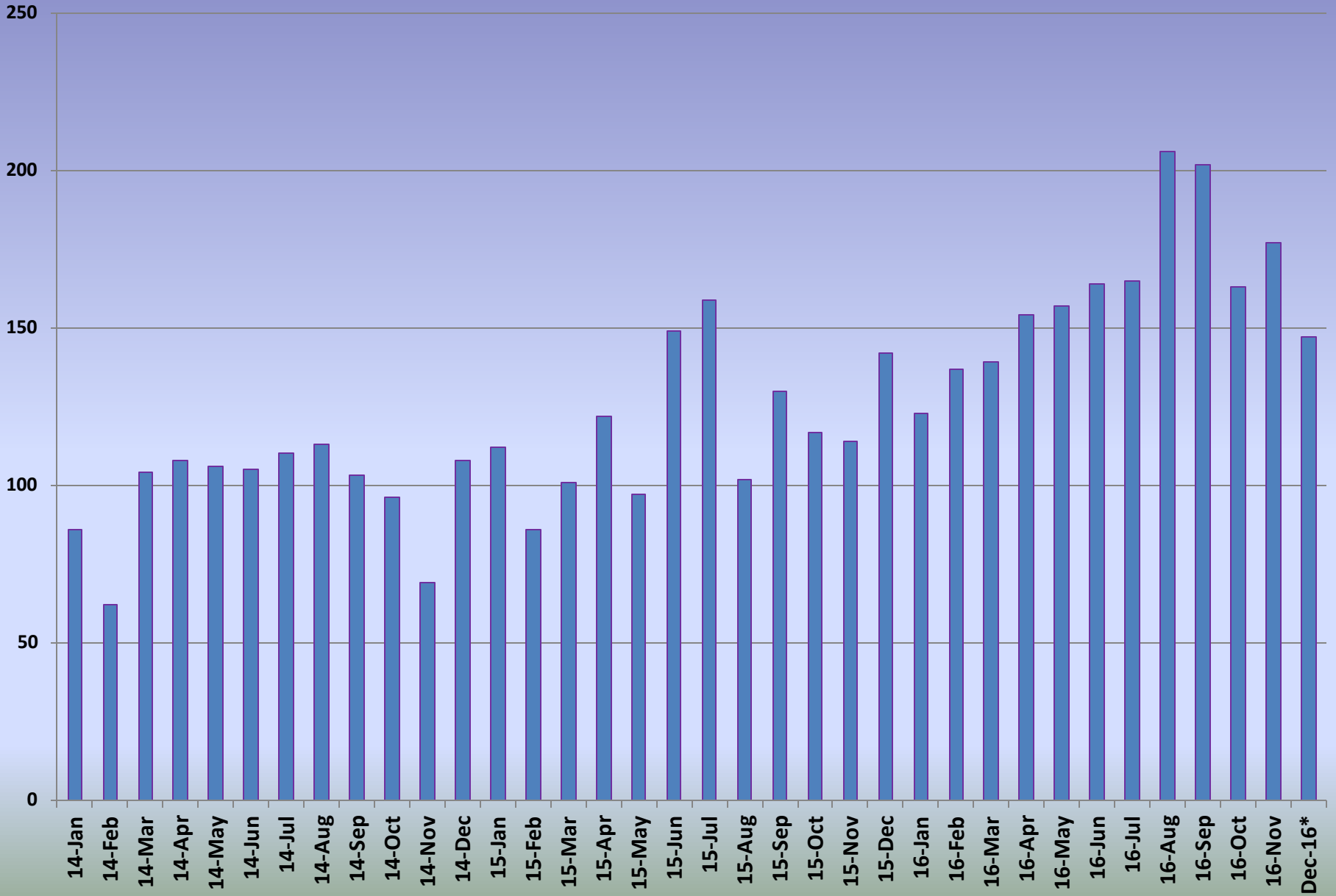

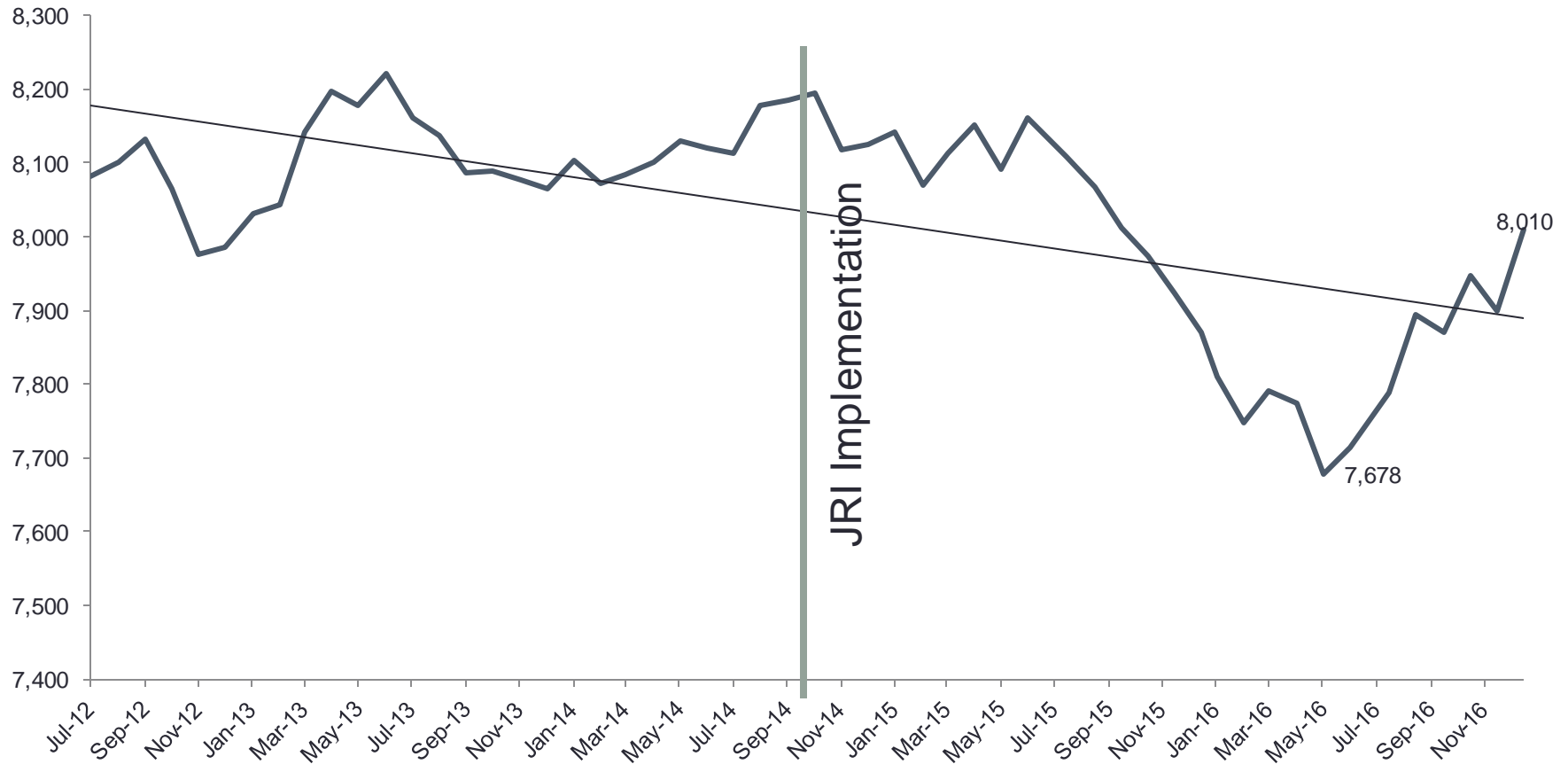
Parole Release Trends



New Violations Admissions per Month



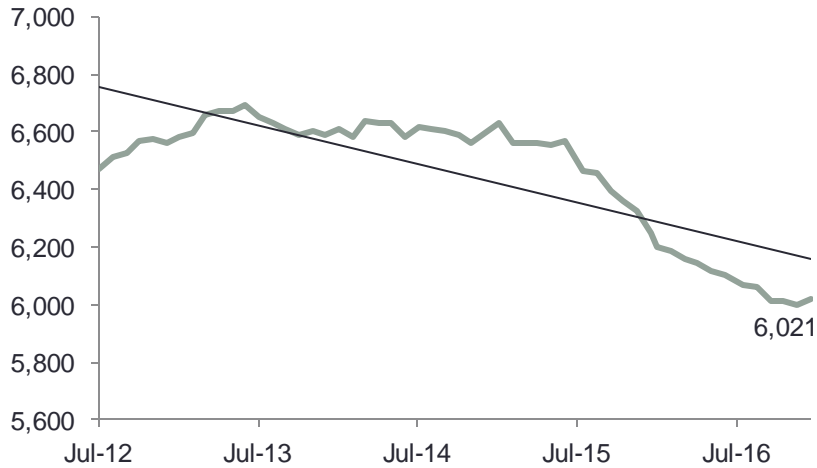
Total Incarcerated Population



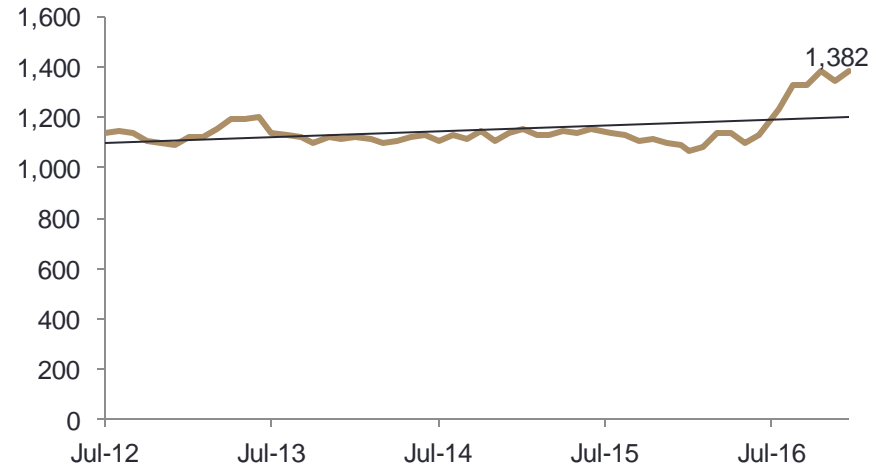
Population has rebounded after a dip between Sept. 2015 – Sept 2016.

Trend in populations

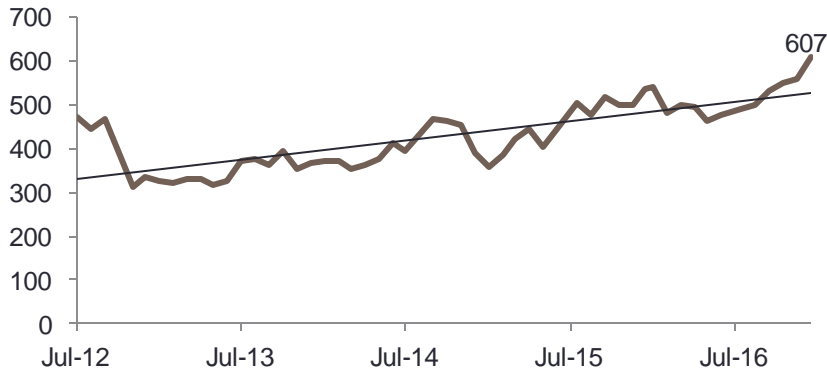

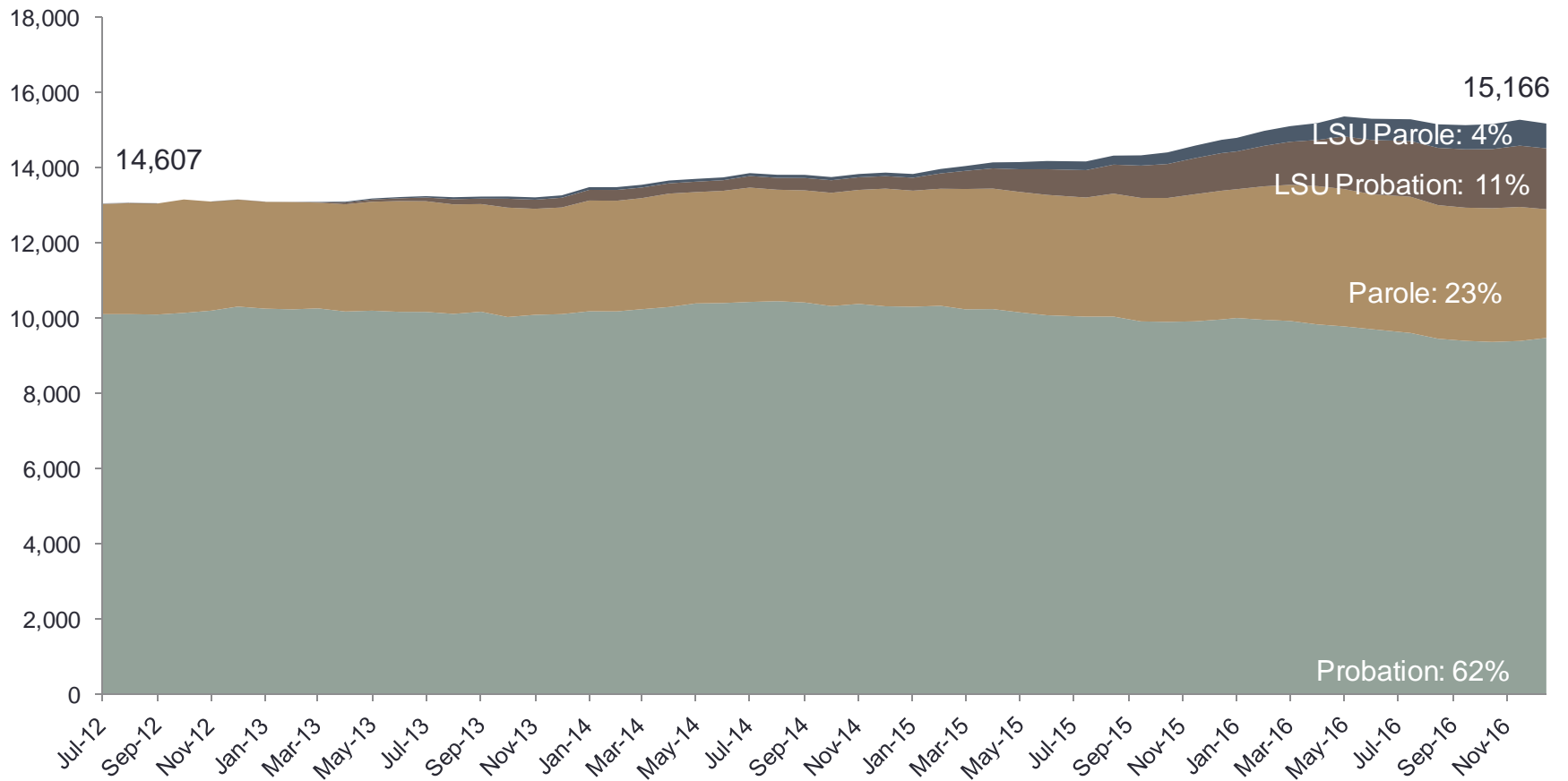
Parole Violator

- Parole violators are up 179 from average

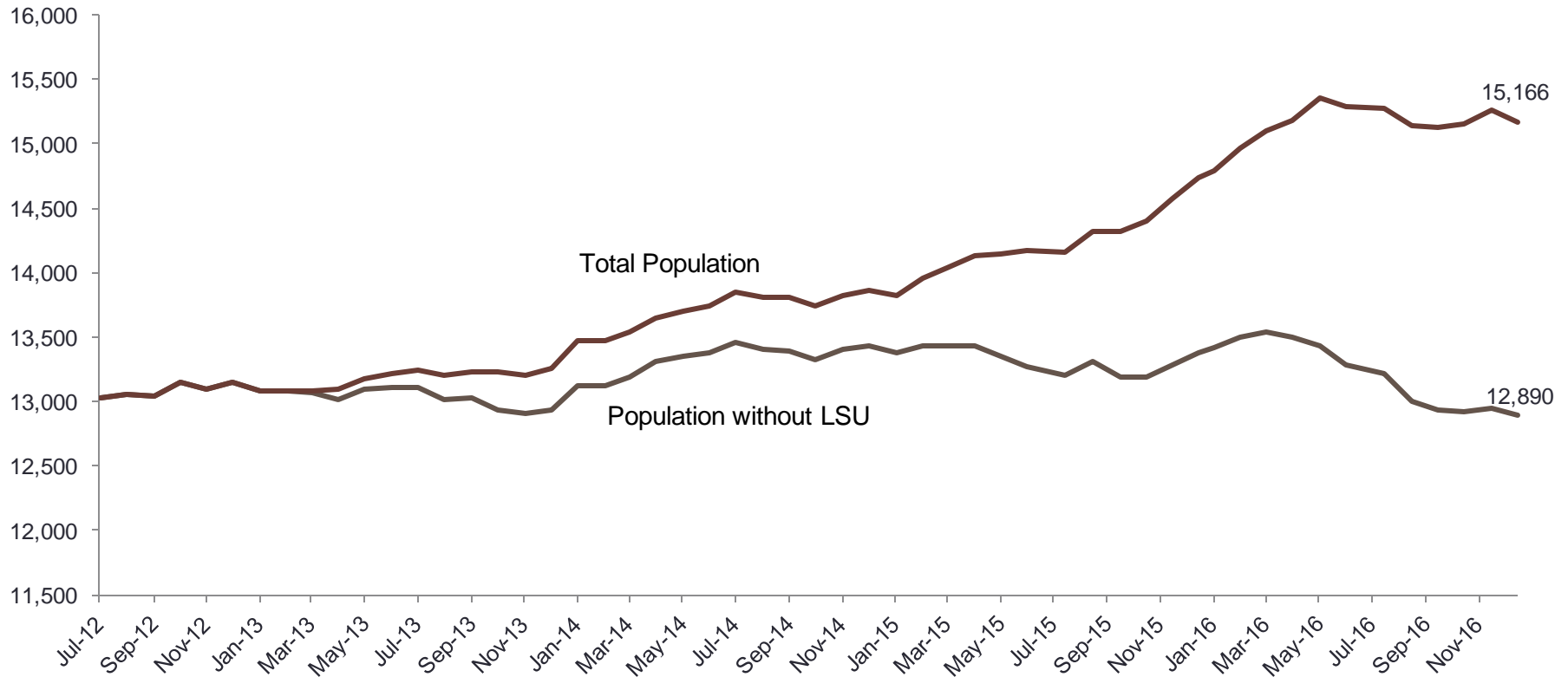
Community Corrections Population : 2012-2016

Concerns with SB1357

- Sanctions for parole violators are prescribed in statute with little flexibility. Concerns about public safety
- Required reporting with a “marker” of 150% of fixed time
- Transparency of rewards and sanctions matrix
- Possible creation of a “right” to programming or parole
