MOTION: **Rep. Kloc** made the motion to approve the minutes for January, 12, 2017 with the correction to the spelling of **Rep. Kloc's** name. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

Dwight Johnson, State Administrator, Career and Technical Education(CTE), explained the seven CTE Student Organizations: BPA for students pursuing careers in business management, office administration, and information technology; DECA that prepares emerging leaders and entrepreneurs for careers in marketing, finance, hospitality, and management; FCCLA that promotes growth by focusing on the multiple roles of family member, wage earner, and community leader, and prepares students for careers in early childhood professions, culinary arts, hospitality services; FFA promotes careers in environmental management, food quality assurance, and horticulture; HOSA provides for future health professionals in careers in nursing, dental assistant, EMT, pharmacy tech, physical therapy, and therapy assistant; SkillsUSA encourages a partnership of students, teachers, and industry working together for a skilled workforce by providing career and technical educational programs, events, and competitions, and careers in electronics, auto and diesel technology, collision repair, information and media technologies, welding, machining, and construction; TSA is for middle and high school students who are engaged in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics(STEM). It fosters personal growth, leadership, and careers in technology, innovation, design, and engineering. All organizations were implemented for high skill, wage, and demand careers. **Mr. Johnson** then introduced three student leaders who briefly spoke on their chosen organization and the difference it has made in their lives. **MaKenzie Tiegs**, College of Southern Idaho Paramedic program; **Cheyenne Von Kostka**, College of Western Idaho Software Development program; **Eddie Celis**, University of Idaho Postsecondary Business Professionals of America.
