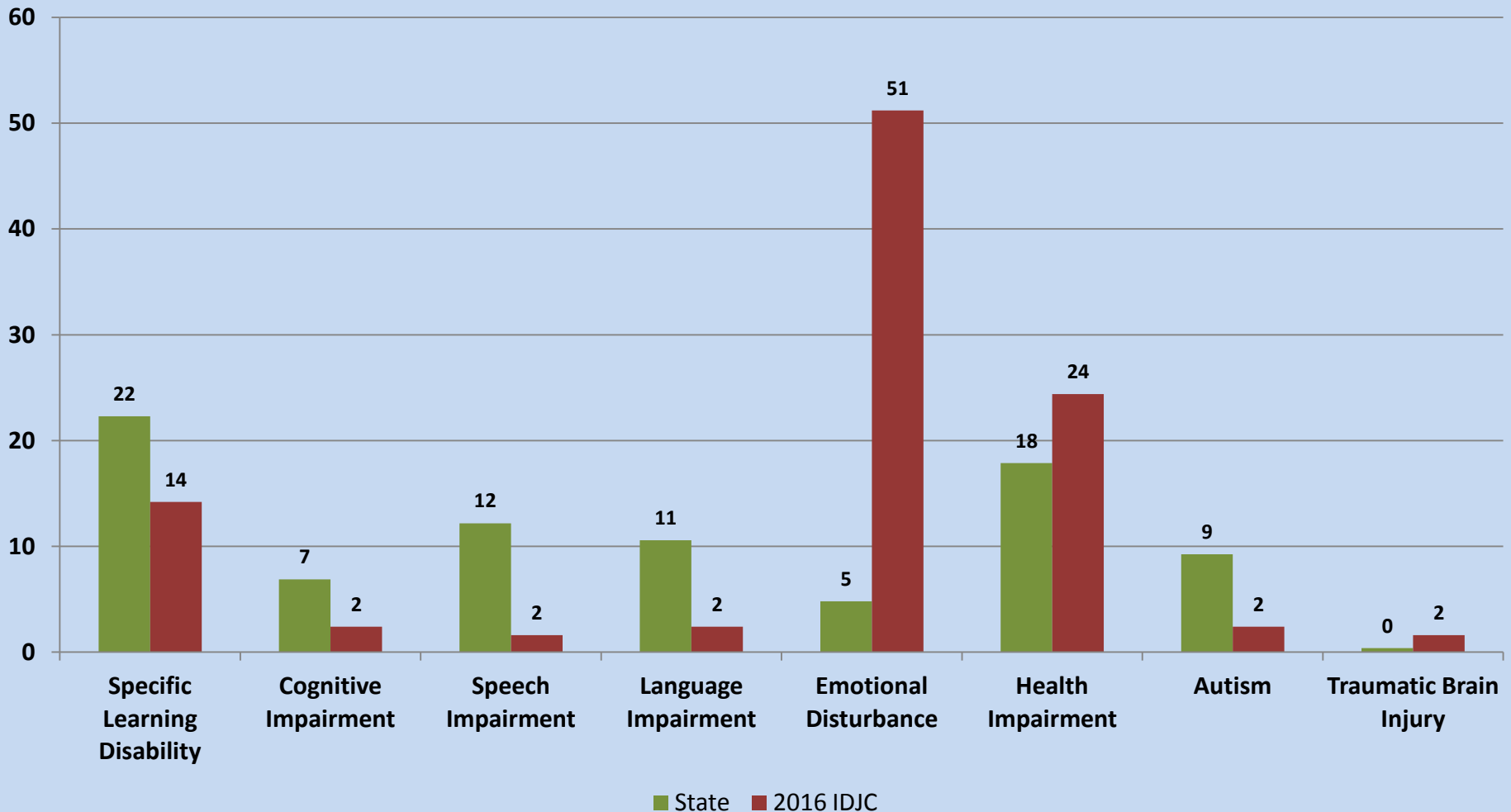

- Improving the academic, career, and technical skills of IDJC students



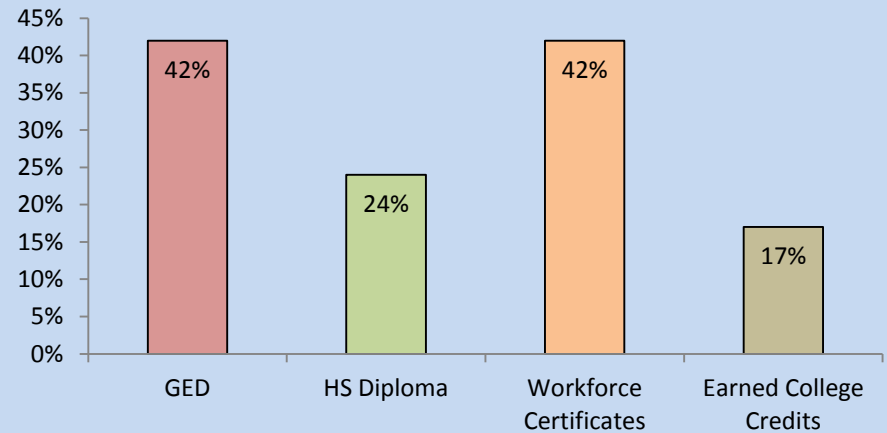

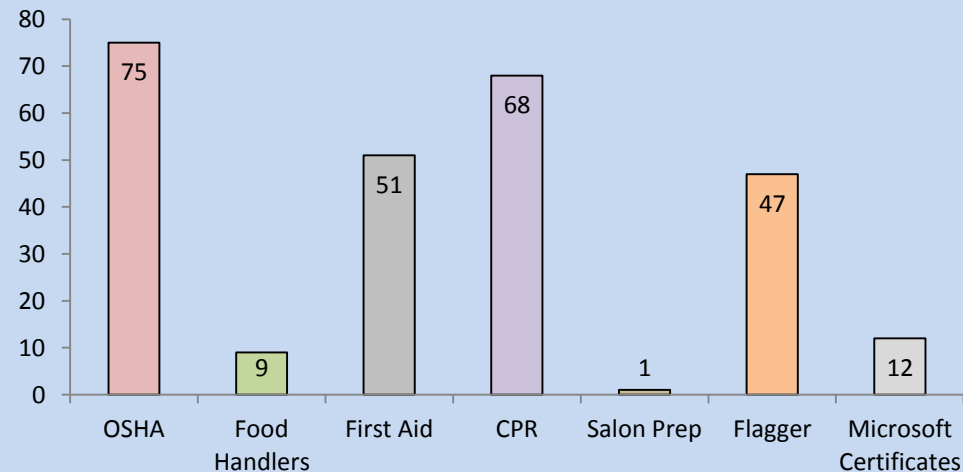
Positive Youth Outcomes

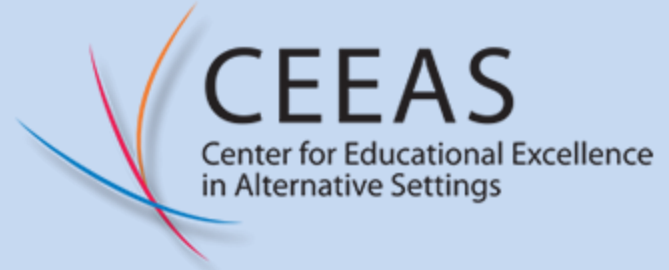

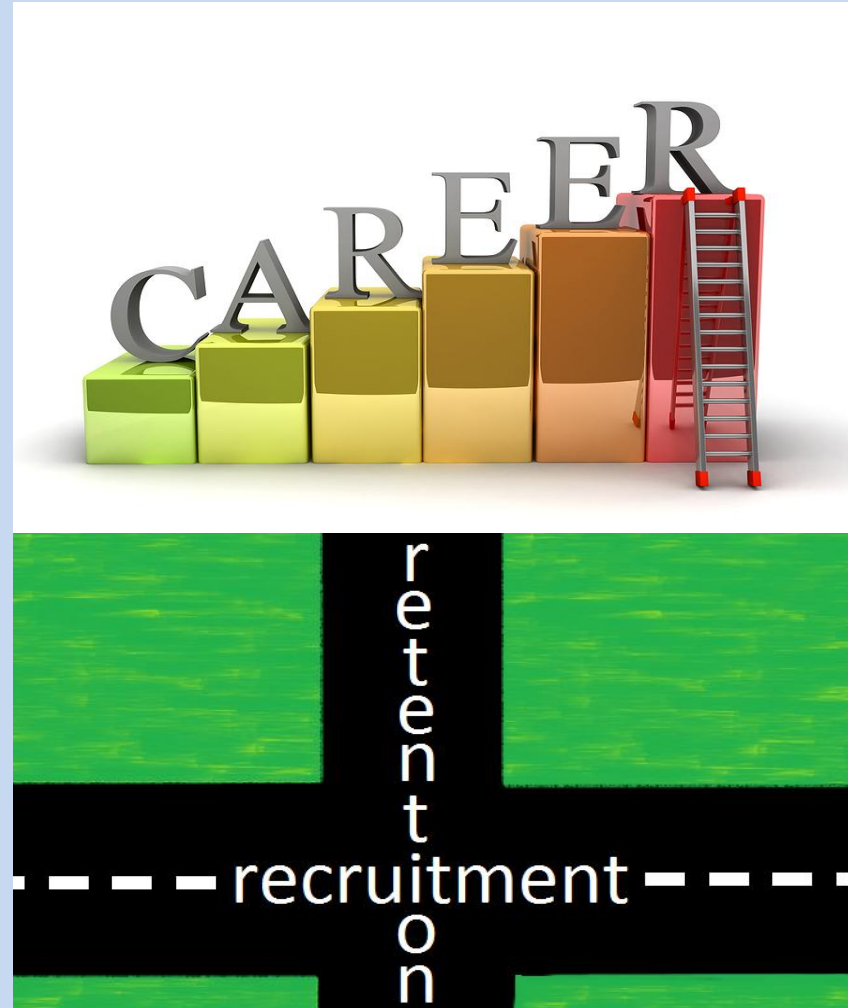

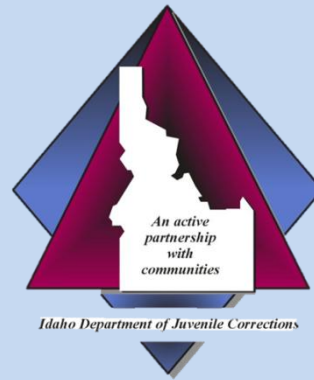


Adaptive Career Ladder
