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Arizona Sunset Review Hierarchy

Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 5 Senate members appointed by the President• 5 House members appointed by the Speaker• No more than 3 appointees from each chamber may be members of the same political party• President and Speaker are ex-officio members• Chairmanship alternates chambers each year• Required to meet quarterly or at call of the chair• Senate and House staff also alternate supporting committee each year• Oversees all sunset, performance, special, and financial audits• Has legislative subpoena power and is authorized to require agency compliance
Auditor General
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Appointed by JLAC for 5 year term, may be reappointed• Approved by concurrent resolution of the legislature• Must be a CPA licensed with the state Board of Accountancy• Conducts in-depth, on-site audits of agencies as assigned by JLAC
Committees of Reference (CORs)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Subcommittee of 5 - acts as proxy for a standing committee• No more than 3 members may be from the same political party• Standing germane committee chairs appoint members and COR chair• During sunset hearings, House and Senate CORs meet as a single committee• Conducts sunset reviews assigned by JLAC

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
