HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 59

BY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

STATING FINDINGS OF THE LEGISLATURE AND AUTHORIZING THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL TO APPOINT A COMMITTEE TO UNDERTAKE AND COMPLETE A STUDY OF SUICIDE BY TEENS IN IDAHO.

Be It Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

WHEREAS, Idaho is consistently among the states with the highest suicide rates, 57% higher than the national average; and

WHEREAS, suicide is the second leading cause of death for Idahoans ages 15 to 34 and for males ages 10 to 14; and

WHEREAS, between 2012 and 2016, one hundred five Idaho school children, age 18 and under, died by suicide. Twenty-seven of these were age 14 or younger; and

WHEREAS, one in seven high school students and one in four 9th-grade females have reported seriously considering suicide in the previous 12 months; and

WHEREAS, 13% of high school students have reported having made a plan about how they would attempt suicide; and

WHEREAS, teens committing suicide is an ongoing problem in Idaho that requires study and input in order to find solutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Sixty-fourth Idaho Legislature, the House of Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that the Legislative Council is authorized to appoint a committee to undertake and complete a study of suicide by teens in Idaho and to make recommendation for how to prevent teen suicide. The Legislative Council shall determine the number of legislators and membership from each house appointed to the committee and shall authorize the committee to receive input, advice and assistance from interested and affected parties who are not members of the Legislature.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nonlegislative members of the committee may be appointed by the cochairs of the committee who are appointed by the Legislative Council. Nonlegislative members of the advisory committee shall not be reimbursed from legislative funds for per diem, mileage or other expenses and shall not have voting privileges regarding the committee's recommendations or proposed legislation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the committee shall report its findings, recommendations and proposed legislation, if any, to the First Regular Session of the Sixty-fifth Idaho Legislature.
