


American Red Cross of Greater Idaho

Gave 708 people food, shelter and other services after disasters, mostly home fires



Installed 1,648 free smoke alarms, making 710 homes safer



62,846 units of blood donated at 2,473 Idaho blood drives



Provided support and emergency services for 1,110 Idaho military families and veterans



Trained 12,875 people in CPR, first aid and AED




Reconnected 17,825 families separated by war, conflict and natural disaster, including 9 cases for people who live in Idaho



539 Volunteers contributed 34,247 hours valued at \$870,901.21



- Chartered in 1914
- Unfunded mandate
- Reach over 100,000 Idahoans each year
- Volunteers respond to a house fire every other day
- 20 staff in Idaho and Montana, 951 volunteers
- 90 cents of every dollar donated goes toward program and services



House Fires

Fort Hall

Since November 2019, volunteers helped 13 people including 6 children and 1 elderly person recover from home fires

Lapwai

Over the last 3 years, volunteers helped 11 people recover from home fires







Clearwater Complex Wildfire 68 homes in the area sustained damage or were lost

- 54 volunteers deployed.
- 111 overnight stays; 181 clients served
- 3,482 meals and snacks served
- Multi Agency Resource Center
- Long-term recovery group convened and coordinated 81 agencies, companies and partners.
