AN ACT

1 RELATING TO FISH AND GAME; AMENDING SECTION 36-409, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE
2 REFERENCE TO WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREAS, TO PROVIDE FOR HUNTING UPLAND
3 GAME BIRDS ON DEPARTMENT-OWNED LANDS, LANDS MANAGED UNDER AGREEMENT
4 WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH AND GAME, AND CERTAIN PRIVATE LAND, AND TO
5 MAKE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS; AMENDING SECTION 36-416, IDAHO CODE, TO
6 REVISE THE NAME OF A SPORT PERMIT; AND AMENDING SECTION 36-1401, IDAHO
7 CODE, TO REMOVE REFERENCE TO A WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA AND TO PROVIDE
8 FOR HUNTING LOCATIONS WHERE PHEASANTS ARE STOCKED AND THE FISH AND GAME
9 COMMISSION REQUIRES AN UPLAND GAME BIRD PERMIT.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

12 SECTION 1. That Section 36-409, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
13 amended to read as follows:

14 36-409. GAME TAGS -- PERMITS -- FEES -- PENALTY. (a) Resident Game
15 Tags. A resident who has obtained authorization to hunt, as provided in
16 section 36-401, Idaho Code, or has purchased or obtained a license to hunt,
17 as provided in section 36-406, Idaho Code, upon payment of the fees provided
18 ~~herein in this chapter~~ shall be eligible to receive a resident game tag to
19 hunt and kill a moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat, elk, deer, antelope,
20 mountain lion, black bear, grizzly bear, wolf, sandhill crane or turkey in
21 accordance with the laws of this state and rules promulgated by the commis-
22 sion; provided further, that any person who holds a senior resident combina-
23 tion license or any person who holds a junior combination or hunting license
24 or any disabled American veteran who holds a disabled combination license,
25 may be issued a black bear, deer, elk, or turkey tag for a fee as specified in
26 section 36-416, Idaho Code; provided further, that resident game tags may
27 be issued only to those persons who meet residency requirements of section
28 36-202(s), Idaho Code. In the event an emergency is declared to open a season
29 to protect private property as provided in section 36-106(e)6.(B), Idaho
30 Code, the affected landowner or his designee shall be eligible to receive a
31 resident deer, elk or antelope tag without charge; provided further, that
32 resident game tags may be issued only to persons who qualify as residents
33 pursuant to section 36-202, Idaho Code.

34 (b) Nonresident Game Tags. A nonresident who has purchased a license to
35 hunt, as provided in section 36-407(a) or (k), Idaho Code, or has obtained a
36 license to hunt, as provided in section 36-406(e), Idaho Code, or a resident
37 who has purchased or obtained a license or authorization to hunt, as pro-
38 vided in section 36-401 or 36-406, Idaho Code, upon payment of the fees pro-
39 vided ~~herein in this chapter~~, shall be eligible to receive a nonresident tag
40 to hunt and kill a moose, bighorn sheep, mountain goat, elk, deer, antelope,
41 mountain lion, black bear, grizzly bear, wolf, sandhill crane or turkey in
42 accordance with the laws of this state and rules promulgated by the commis-

1 sion; provided further, that a nonresident who has purchased a license to
2 hunt, as provided in section 36-407(k) and (l), Idaho Code, shall be eligible
3 to receive a junior mentored or disabled American veteran deer, elk, black
4 bear, or turkey tag for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

5 (c) Game Tags Required. The appropriate tag must be had for the hunt-
6 ing or taking of each and every one of the aforementioned wildlife. The
7 commission shall promulgate rules to allow exception from tag possession
8 to take wildlife for a disabled hunter companion who is assisting a hunter
9 possessing the appropriate tag and a valid disabled combination license or a
10 disabled archery permit or a disabled hunt motor vehicle permit or who is a
11 disabled veteran participating in a hunt as provided in section 36-408(7),
12 Idaho Code. Provided, that the commission may promulgate rules to allow a
13 nonresident deer or elk tag to be used to hunt and kill ~~either~~ a black bear, a
14 wolf, or a mountain lion during the open season for deer or elk in that area,
15 unit or zone as may be specified by the commission. All of said tags are to
16 bear and have serial numbers.

17 (d) Game Tag to Be Validated and Attached to Carcass. As soon as any
18 person kills any wildlife for which a tag is required, said tag, belonging to
19 him, must be validated and attached to said wildlife in a manner provided by
20 commission rule.

21 (e) Archery Permits. In addition to meeting the license and tag re-
22 quirements provided in this chapter, any person participating in any con-
23 trolled or general game season that has been specifically designated as an
24 archery hunt must have in his possession an archery hunt permit, which may be
25 purchased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

26 (f) Muzzleloader Permit. In addition to meeting the license and tag re-
27 quirements provided in this chapter, any person participating in any con-
28 trolled or general game season that has been specifically designated as a
29 muzzleloader hunt must have in his possession a muzzleloader permit, which
30 may be purchased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

31 (g) Hound Hunter Permit -- Resident -- Nonresident. Any person using a
32 dog for the purpose of hunting or for taking, as defined in section 36-202,
33 Idaho Code, big game or furbearing animals must have in his possession a
34 valid hound hunter permit, which may be purchased by resident and nonresi-
35 dent license holders for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

36 (h) Nonresident Bird of Prey Capture Permit. The commission may, un-
37 der rules as it may prescribe, issue a nonresident bird of prey capture per-
38 mit. This capture permit may be purchased by any licensed nonresident fal-
39 coner for capturing birds of prey in Idaho. The fee for the permit shall be as
40 specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code, and the permit shall be issued un-
41 der the condition that the nonresident's home state allows reciprocal raptor
42 capturing privileges for Idaho falconers.

43 (i) ~~Wildlife Management Area (WMA)~~ Upland Game Bird Permit. The
44 commission may, under rules as it may prescribe, issue a ~~wildlife manage-~~
45 ~~ment area~~ an upland game bird permit that must be purchased by all persons
46 over seventeen (17) years of age prior to hunting stocked upland game
47 birds on ~~state wildlife management areas designated by the commission~~
48 department-owned lands, lands managed under agreement with the department,
49 and private lands enrolled in a department-sponsored public access program

1 with written permission of the land owner. The fee for the permit shall be as
2 specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

3 (j) Black Bear Baiting Permit. The commission may, under rules as it
4 may prescribe, issue a black bear baiting permit. Any person placing or us-
5 ing bait as may be allowed by rule for the purpose of attracting black bear
6 must have in his possession a valid black bear baiting permit, which may be
7 purchased by a license holder for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho
8 Code.

9 (k) Migratory Bird Harvest Information Program Permit. The commission
10 may, as provided by federal laws or regulations and under rules as it may pre-
11 scribe, issue a migratory bird harvest information program permit that must
12 be purchased by all persons prior to hunting migratory game birds as required
13 by federal law or regulations. The fee for the permit shall be as specified
14 in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

15 (l) Dog Field Trial Permit. The commission may, under rules as it may
16 prescribe, issue a dog field trial permit to any person using birds for dog
17 field trials or training as may be allowed by rule. The permit may be pur-
18 chased for a fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

19 (m) Idaho Nursing Home Facility Resident Fishing Permit. The commis-
20 sion may, under rules as it may prescribe, issue an Idaho nursing home fa-
21 cility resident fishing permit that must be purchased by an Idaho nursing
22 home facility to allow residents of its facility to fish during the open sea-
23 son. Facilities eligible to purchase this permit are: intermediate care
24 facilities providing twenty-four (24) hour skilled nursing care, assisted
25 living facilities providing twenty-four (24) hour extensive assistance, and
26 skilled nursing facilities providing twenty-four (24) hour skilled nursing.
27 By purchasing this permit, the facility assumes full responsibility for and
28 control over the facility residents while using the permit. All laws, rules
29 and proclamations apply to the use of this permit and it is the responsibil-
30 ity of the facility to assure compliance with all laws, rules and proclama-
31 tions. In case of a violation, the facility shall be held accountable and any
32 citations shall be issued to the facility. The permit may be purchased for a
33 fee as specified in section 36-416, Idaho Code.

34 SECTION 2. That Section 36-416, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
35 amended to read as follows:

36 36-416. SCHEDULE OF LICENSE FEES. As used in this section, "N/A" means
37 "not available."

22 SECTION 3. That Section 36-1401, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby
23 amended to read as follows:

24 36-1401. VIOLATIONS. (a) Infractions. Any person who pleads guilty to
25 or is found guilty of a violation of the following provisions of the fish
26 and game code or the following rules or proclamations promulgated pursuant
27 thereto is guilty of an infraction:

28 1. Statutes.

29 (A) Take, transport, use or have in possession bait fish as set
30 forth in section 36-902(d), Idaho Code.

31 (B) Chumming as set forth in section 36-902(e), Idaho Code.

32 (C) Nonresident child under the age of fourteen (14) years fish-
33 ing without a valid license and not accompanied by a valid license
34 holder as set forth in section 36-401(a)2., Idaho Code.

35 (D) Use or cut a hole larger than ten (10) inches in the ice for ice
36 fishing as set forth in section 36-1509(a), Idaho Code.

37 (E) Store fish without required tags/permits/statements as set
38 forth in section 36-503, Idaho Code.

39 (F) Own, possess or harbor any dog found running loose and which
40 is tracking, pursuing, harassing or attacking a big game animal as
41 set forth in section 36-1101(b)7.(B), Idaho Code.

1 (G) Hunt migratory waterfowl without having in possession a
 2 signed federal migratory bird hunting stamp as set forth in sec-
 3 tion 36-1102(b)2., Idaho Code.

4 (H) Hunt migratory game birds without having in possession a li-
 5 cense validated for the federal migratory bird harvest informa-
 6 tion program permit as set forth in section 36-409(k), Idaho Code.

7 (I) Trap in or on, destroy or damage any muskrat house as provided
 8 in section 36-1103(c), Idaho Code.

9 (J) Hunt migratory game birds with a shotgun capable of holding
 10 more than three (3) shells as provided and incorporated in section
 11 36-1102(b), Idaho Code.

12 (K) Fail to purchase a muzzleloader permit as set forth in section
 13 36-409(f), Idaho Code.

14 (L) Fail to purchase an archery permit as set forth in section
 15 36-409(e), Idaho Code.

16 2. Rules or Proclamations.

17 (A) Fish from a raft or boat with motor attached in waters where
 18 motors are prohibited.

19 (B) Fish with hooks larger than allowed in that water.

20 (C) Fish with barbed hooks in waters where prohibited.

21 (D) Exceed any established bag limit for fish by one (1) fish, ex-
 22 cept bag limits for anadromous fish, landlocked chinook salmon,
 23 kamloops rainbow trout, lake trout, or bull trout.

24 (E) Fish with more than the approved number of lines or hooks.

25 (F) Fail to leave head and/or tail on fish while fish are in pos-
 26 session or being transported.

27 (G) Snag or hook fish other than in the head and fail to release,
 28 excluding anadromous fish.

29 (H) Fail to attend fishing line and keep it under surveillance at
 30 all times.

31 (I) Fail to comply with mandatory check and report requirements.

32 (J) Fail to leave evidence of sex or species attached as required
 33 on game birds.

34 (K) Hunt or take migratory game birds or upland game birds with
 35 shot exceeding the allowable size.

36 (L) Fail to release, report or turn in nontarget trapped animals.

37 (M) Fail to complete required report on trapped furbearer.

38 (N) Fail to present required furbearer animal parts for inspec-
 39 tion.

40 (O) Fail to attach identification tags to traps.

41 (P) Possess not more than one (1) undersized bass.

42 (Q) Park or camp in a restricted area, except length of stay viola-
 43 tions.

44 (R) Fail to leave evidence of sex attached as required on game ani-
 45 mals.

46 (S) Fail to purchase sage grouse or sharp-tailed grouse hunting
 47 permit when hunting for sage grouse or sharp-tailed grouse any-
 48 where within the state, except licensed shooting preserves.

1 (T) Fail to wear at least thirty-six (36) square inches of visible
2 hunter orange above the waist when hunting ~~on wildlife management~~
3 ~~areas~~ locations where pheasants are stocked and the commission re-
4 quires an upland game bird permit.

5 (U) Fail to comply with upland game bird shooting hours restric-
6 tions established by commission rule or proclamation.

7 (V) Public use restrictions. Activities prohibited unless
8 specifically authorized by the commission or under lease, permit,
9 contract or agreement issued by the director, regional supervisor
10 or other authorized agent:

11 (i) Use watercraft on any waters that are posted against
12 such use;

13 (ii) Conduct dog field trials of any type during the period
14 of October 1 through July 31. All dog field trials and dog
15 training with the use of artificially propagated game birds
16 between August 1 and September 30 will be under department
17 permit as authorized by the director;

18 (iii) Construct blinds, pits, platforms or tree stands where
19 the soil is disturbed, trees are cut or altered, and arti-
20 ficial fasteners such as wire, rope or nails are used. All
21 blinds shall be available to the public on a first-come,
22 first-served basis. Portable manufactured blinds and tree
23 stands are allowed but may not be left overnight;

24 (iv) Shoot within, across or into posted safety zones;

25 (v) Leave decoys unattended. Decoys cannot be put in place
26 any earlier than two (2) hours prior to official shooting
27 hours for waterfowl, and all decoys must be picked up and re-
28 moved from the hunting site no later than two (2) hours after
29 official shooting hours for waterfowl that particular day;

30 (vi) Discharge any paintball guns;

31 (vii) Place a geocache;

32 (viii) Use for group events of more than fifteen (15) people;

33 (ix) Use or transport any hay, straw or mulch that is not
34 weed seed free certified.

35 (W) Evidence of species. In seasons restricted to mule deer
36 only or white-tailed deer only, if the head is removed, the
37 fully-haired tail must be left naturally attached to the carcass.

38 (X) Continue to fish on Henry's lake after reaching limit.

39 (b) Misdemeanors. Any person who pleads guilty to, is found guilty
40 or is convicted of a violation of the provisions of this title or rules or
41 proclamations promulgated pursuant thereto, or orders of the commission,
42 except where an offense is expressly declared to be an infraction or felony,
43 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

44 (c) Felonies. Any person who pleads guilty to, is found guilty or
45 is convicted of a violation of the following offenses shall be guilty of a
46 felony:

47 1. Knowingly and intentionally selling or offering for sale or
48 exchange, or purchasing or offering to purchase or exchange, any
49 wildlife, or parts thereof, which has been unlawfully killed, taken or
50 possessed.

- 1 2. Releasing into the wild, without a permit from the director, any of
2 the following wildlife, whether native or exotic: ungulates, bears,
3 wolves, large felines, swine, or peccaries.
- 4 3. Unlawfully killing, possessing or wasting of any combination of
5 numbers or species of wildlife within a twelve (12) month period which
6 has a single or combined reimbursable damage assessment of more than one
7 thousand dollars (\$1,000), as provided in section 36-1404, Idaho Code.
- 8 4. Conviction within ten (10) years of three (3) or more violations of
9 the provisions of this title, penalties for which include either or both
10 a mandatory license revocation or a reimbursable damage assessment.
