Chairman Dixon called the meeting to order at 1:34 p.m.

MOTION: **Rep. Green(18)** made a motion to approve the minutes of January 9, 2020. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 24-2001-1900: **Director Kelley Packer**, (IBOL), explained these rules primarily govern the process for inquiries into licensees and registrants, and supplement the contested case procedures for each of the boards the Bureau serves. Allowing these rules to expire would disrupt the uniform process the Bureau uses for each of the boards it serves, adding an unnecessary burden on licensees and registrants.

MOTION: **Rep. Raymond** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-2001-1900**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 24-0201-1900F: **Director Packer** stated the State Athletic Commission rules establish and govern standards and practices of the Idaho Athletic Commission, which oversees boxing, mixed martial arts, and wrestling contests. Allowing these rules to expire would deny the Commission the ability to sanction permits and admit licensees; and elimination of the standards protecting combatants in sanctioned contests would harm the health, safety, and welfare of combatants.

MOTION: **Rep. Smith** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-0201-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 24-0101-1900F: **Director Packer** said the Architectural Examiners pending fee rule removes redundant and unnecessary language, moves fees into an easier to read tabular format, and adds the phrase "not to exceed" before fee amounts, allowing for flexibility in decreasing and increasing board fees within authorized limits to maintain Board liquidity.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-0101-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 24-0401-1900F: **Director Packer** explained the rules govern qualifications for registered geologists who protect public health, safety and welfare by providing reasoned input in minimizing potential danger from geologic hazards during construction projects; alerting the public to potential danger in areas of seismic risk; defining impacts of human activities and natural occurrences on aquifers, recharge areas, and other water resources; and outlining steps in geohazard mitigation for features such as: fault zones, landslides, and unstable foundation areas. Not reauthorizing these rules would hinder the Board's ability to admit new applicants, to renew current licenses, and would affect registered geologists' ability to affix their stamp.

- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-0401-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- DOCKET NO. 24-0701-1900F:** **Director Packer** said the rules govern the qualifications to practice landscape architecture and ensure that an individual has demonstrated the knowledge, skills, and abilities to practice landscape architecture without endangering the health, safety or welfare of the public.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-0701-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- DOCKET NO. 24-0801-1900F:** **Director Packer** explained the State Board of Morticians is charged with the duty to regulate, license, and supervise funeral homes, crematories, Morticians, and Funeral Directors in the State of Idaho. The Board's primary responsibility is to protect public health, safety, and welfare through licensure and enforcement of Idaho law. Failure to renew these rules would harm public health and safety through eliminating requirements of licensees and licensed facilities to safely, compassionately, and ethically prepare and make final disposition of the deceased.
- MOTION:** **Rep. Berch** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-0801-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- DOCKET NO. 24-1801-1900F:** **Director Packer** explained the clarifications for an applicant's log book, through specific requirements for the signature and license number of the supervising appraiser. The pending fee rule clarifies the number of hours a registered trainee must obtain in Idaho within a minimum period of time, allowing applicants flexibility while ensuring familiarity with Idaho markets, and adds that the Board will only consider experience gained in jurisdictions with substantially equal requirements to those of Idaho, providing clarity to applicants, and ensure all applicants are held to the same standards.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-1801-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- DOCKET NO. 24-2501-1900F:** **Director Packer** explained the Idaho Driving Businesses Licensure Board rules govern the credentials required to instruct Idaho's student drivers and protect the public sharing the roadways with student drivers. Allowing these rules to expire would mean the dissolution of the curriculum standards for students in private driving schools, suspension of the standards driving instructors and driving businesses are required to maintain, and removal of an alternative form of driver's education for Idaho students and their families.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-2501-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- DOCKET NO. 24-2801-1900F:** **Director Packer** stated the rules govern the qualifications and standards for licensees in the barber and cosmetology services industry, as well as hygiene and sanitation standards of establishments which offer those services. Failing to reauthorize these rules would deprive the Board of the ability to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of citizens of Idaho.
- MOTION:** **Rep. Berch** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-2801-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- DOCKET NO. 24-2901-1900F:** **Director Packer** said the Idaho Certified Shorthand Reporters Board pending fee rule moves fees into an easier to read tabular format, and adds the phrase "not to exceed" before fee amounts, allowing flexibility in decreasing and increasing board fees within authorized limits to maintain Board liquidity. The pending fee rule replaces the moral turpitude and good moral character requirements regarding criminal history with the request for disclosure of any crime other than a minor traffic offense, providing clarity to applicants and other potential licensees.

MOTION: Rep. DeMordaunt made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-2901-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 24-2101-1900F: **Robert H. McQuade, Jr.**, (IBOL), stated the Idaho State Contractors Board pending fee rule removes redundant language, moves fees into an easier to read tabular format, and adds the phrase "not to exceed" before fee amounts, allowing for flexibility in decreasing and increasing board fees within authorized limits to maintain Board liquidity.

MOTION: **Rep. Berch** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 24-2101-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 24-2201-1900F: **Robert H. McQuade, Jr.**, explained the Idaho State Liquefied Petroleum Gas Safety Board pending fee rule reorganizes and combines sections for clarity, removes redundant language, moves fees into an easier to read tabular format, and adds the phrase "not to exceed" before fee amounts, allowing for flexibility in decreasing and increasing board fees within authorized limits to maintain Board liquidity. In addition, a new fee for re-inspection of liquefied petroleum facilities, to cover the cost generated as a result of a failed initial inspection is added, as the Board felt the facility requiring the re-inspection should bear the added cost, rather than all licensees.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **DOCKET NO. Docket No.** **Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 07-0000-1900: **Anthony Polidori**, (IDF), (CFB), said the rules support the Department's orderly supervision of the offer and sale of securities to Idaho citizens. The rules give authorization to financial institutions to exercise certain powers and conduct business; provide protection to customers of the institutions, investors, and others; support extension of credit to Idaho citizens and businesses; and support supervision of the state's endowment care cemeteries.
MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0000-1900. Motion carried by voice vote.**
DOCKET NO. 12-0000-1900: **Patrick Grace**, (DBS), stated the budget relies upon the existence of these fees and charges to meet the state's obligations and provide necessary state services. Division programs operate from statutorily created dedicated funds providing licensing of persons within the respective professions, and inspection of installations and/or administration of such programs. All operations require collection of certain fees to ensure compliance with applicable standards. Mr. Grace commented that some substantive changes are in the rules regarding logging that were not part of the Omnibus Rule.

Chairman Dixon called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

DOCKET NO. 07-0000-1900: **Patrick Grace**, Division of Building Safety (DBS), explained there were no substantive changes made in the first three chapters. In alignment with the Red Tape Reduction Act from the Governor's office, DBS identified and eliminated obsolete, outdated, and unnecessary rules. These reauthorized rules were discussed at 28 public and board meetings. The result was that many pages and restrictions were eliminated, data was clarified by displaying via tables, and rules were consolidated into fewer chapters.

MOTION: **Rep. Raymond** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0000-1900. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 07-0801-1901: **Patrick Grace**, Division of Building Safety. The changes being made to this docket clarify safety procedures for the operation of swing yarders, correct a typo, and include a requirement regarding the use of sleeve shackles that was discussed during negotiated rule making but was inadvertently left out of the rule making. The last chapter did include some substantive changes, brought by industry suggestion. The substantive changes include mandated First Aid training, rigging inspections, updated cable clamp regulations, updated machinery manual requirements, swing radius regulations updates, clasp regulations, and wrapper number requirements. Mr. Grace and the committee explored the underlying reasoning and supportive operations around regulation.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0801-1901. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 07-0101-1901: **Warren Wing**, Division of Building Safety, reviewed docket changes, most of which were not substantive. Most substantive change surrounded electrician certification processes and apprenticeship requirements to help electricians to be able to work. Specific concern was brought up around journeyman to apprentice ratios.

MOTION: **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0101-1901** but reject in part section 105.09 parts a and b; and reject section 152.02.

The committee discussed processes of changing statutes vs. changing rules, and how removing the subsections will affect the burden of workers. They wrestled with the idea of who establishes ratios in each work sector and whether or not this is something that should be decided in committee. The argument against a higher ratio centers around safety and effective training.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION:

Rep. Berch made a substitute motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0101-1901**. Roll call vote was requested.

Committee discussed the structure of both motions and how to best correct the docket.

AMENDED SUBSTITUTE MOTION:

Rep. Andrus made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0101-1901** but reject section 105.09 subsection a and b.

Marty Durand, legislative council for Idaho Building Trades, represents thousands of electricians across the state, objected to removing ratios from the rules. There is legislation proposed to adjust this ratio in residential instances, which would address many concerns discussed today. She requested the industry players sort this out through legislation, not through the rules process.

The committee debated whether rejecting this subsection will force the industry board to make a change or simply shut out other industry stakeholders from the legislative process.

VOTE ON AMENDED SUBSTITUTE MOTION:

Roll call vote was requested. **Amended substitute motion carried by a vote of 12 AYE, 5 NAY. Voting in opposition** to the amended substitute motion: **Reps. Barbieri, Furniss, Smith, Berch, and Green.**

Chairman Dixon called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m

DOCKET NO. 18-0000-1900: **Director Cameron**, (DOI), introduced **Wes Trexler** Deputy Director, DOI, and **Knute Sandahl**, Idaho State Fire Marshall. Director Cameron explained in preparation for adopting the pending rule, rules were sorted into categories and re-numbered in more logical ways. Omnibus rules were then revised to remove redundancies and clarify existing language. Director Cameron also clarified that any removal of restrictive language had no legal ramifications. Re-adoption of the international fire code was also contained in this Docket and no substantive changes were made to the code as it had been adopted the previous year. Fire Marshall Sandahl explained all interpretation of the fire code is up to the State Fire Marshall.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 18-0000-1900. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 18-0000-1900F: **Director Cameron** explained this Docket has two pending fee rules and no substantive changes. The changes to these pending fee rules were limited to the removal of redundant and restrictive language. This Docket was also reorganized for clarity regarding annual licensing fees for insurance companies. Two fees were eliminated which have not been in use or previously collected.

MOTION: **Rep. Raymond** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 18-0000-1900F. Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27205: **Director Cameron** presented **RS 27205**, proposed legislation repealing the Idaho Hospital Liability Trust Act. No hospital liability trusts are currently registered in the state of Idaho nor have any trusts applied since 1999. The removal of this act due to disuse is part of the Governor's Red Tape Reduction Act. Director Cameron also explained there has been no money held by this trust, nor any access to the trust since 1999.

MOTION: **Rep. Clow** made a motion to introduce **RS 27205. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 18-0408-1901: **Director Cameron** said this rule provides standards for various individual disability and group supplemental disability policies. Changes to this rule provide standardized and simplified terms of coverage to allow greater public understanding and comparison of coverages. The changes included removal of confusing pre-existing condition language, removal of medical expense coverage types, and restructuring of sections in order to clarify which standards apply to which type of coverage.

MOTION: **Rep. Raymond** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 18-0408-1901. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 18-0416-1901: **Director Cameron** explained **Docket No. 18-0416-1901** added a new section of Idaho Code to define and provide for the purchase of enhanced short-term health insurance plans. Enhanced short-term plans will have an initial period of less than twelve months, but may be renewed up to 36 months. This rule will offer choices to consumers for individual health insurance and define the consumer protections required to offer such plans. This rule also covers the traditional short-term health insurance plans.

DOCKET NO. 07-0501-1901: **Patrick Grace**, Regional Manager, Division of Building Safety (DBS), explained this rulemaking confers a benefit to public works contractor licensees. Licensees will collectively pay \$122,040 less over the course of the year to renew their licenses and provides a twenty percent reduction in renewal fees for public works contractor licenses. The Idaho Public Works Contractors License Board (Board) has been monitoring a steady increase in the balance of the Public Works Contractors License Fund. The fund increase is a result of efficiencies in the processing of public works licenses at the Division of Building Safety (Division). The Board and the Division are satisfied that the renewal fee reduction will benefit the industry while leaving the Public Works Contractors License Fund adequately funded.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0501-1901. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 07-1101-1901: **Patrick Grace**, DBS, said this rulemaking implements the provisions of the Idaho Code, and provides processes, criteria, or both to accept military education, training, or service from military members, former military members discharged under honorable conditions, veterans, or their spouses (Military Applicants) toward the requirements for a professional license with the Division of Building Safety; and issue licenses by endorsement to Military Applicants.

MOTION: **Rep. Crane** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-1101-1901. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 07-0000-1900F: **Patrick Grace**, (DBS), stated the rules are necessary to ensure properly qualified persons continue to practice in the professions over which the Division exercises regulatory authority, installations made in the various trades and professions related thereto, and other applicable construction work is performed safely and in accordance with laws, codes, standards, and processes that protect the safety and welfare of the public. Included are: Rules Governing Plumbing; Building Safety; Modular Buildings; Manufactured/Mobile Home Industry Licensing; Manufactured or Mobile Home Installations; Safety Rules for Elevators, Escalators, and Moving Walks; Rules of the Public Works Contractors License Board; Installation of Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning Systems; and Rules Governing the Damage Prevention Board.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0000-1900F. Motion carried by voice vote.**

DOCKET NO. 48-0101-1900F: **Brenna Christison**, Operations & Finance Manager, Idaho Wine Commission, stated this rulemaking does not impose a fee or charge, or increase a fee or charge, beyond what was previously approved and codified in the prior rules. The rule specifies the amount of grape and wine tax to be levied in accordance with statute, and adopts a late payment penalty in accordance with statute.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 48-0101-1900F**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS: 27230: **Gary Barnes**, Manager, Industrial Safety Program, presented **RS 27230**, legislation clarifying the correct titles of several standards in Idaho Code and the definition of a Qualified Elevator Inspector (QEI) as "a person who is currently certified by the National Association of Elevator Safety Authorities International (NAESA International) accredited certifying organization as meeting the requirements of the NAESA International QEI-1 standard." The state of Idaho currently regulates over one hundred wind turbine tower elevators and that number will continue to grow. Without adoption of A17.8 Standard for Wind Turbine Tower Elevators, the state will not have standards to use in regulating these units. The guide states, "This guide is intended to assist qualified inspectors performing routine inspections and witnessing periodic and acceptance inspections and tests. It is not intended to serve as a basis for government regulation."

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27230**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27242: **Anthony Polidori**, Department of Finance, (DOF), introduced the new Director of Finance, **Patricia Perkins**, and presented **RS 27242**, a proposal allowing collection agencies to collect incidental charges included in the contract between the creditor and the debtor. The proposed legislation makes the licensing process for collection agents, debt counselors, credit counselors, and credit repair entities similar to other entities licensed by the Idaho Department of Finance by requiring the use of a nationwide system of licensing and allowing for reinstatement of expired applications. Branch registration requirements are removed, licensing requirements are extended to branch locations, license and renewal application fees are increased, and quarterly agent reporting requirements and the associated fees for quarterly reporting are eliminated.

MOTION: **Rep. Green** made a motion to introduce **RS 27242**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27247: **Anthony Polidori**, (DOF), presented **RS 27247**, proposed legislation making the licensing process for regulated lenders and payday lenders similar to other entities licensed by the Idaho Department of Finance by requiring the use of a nationwide system of licensing. The legislation modifies provisions related to administrative and civil remedies applicable to persons offering consumer credit in Idaho and reduces licensing requirements applicable to regulated lenders and payday lenders.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27247**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27248: **Anthony Polidori**, (DOF), presented **RS 27248**, proposed legislation to amend the definition of mortgage lender to include entities engaged in mortgage servicing activities, and to eliminate duplicative licensing and compliance requirements for the activity of servicing residential mortgage loans. Definitions are revised to exclude commercial construction lending from applicable licensing requirements. **RS 27248** would expand an exemption for de minimis lending activity conducted for investment purposes. Licensing requirements for licensees and applicants would be reduced, would eliminate associated prohibited practices, and grant temporary authority to originate residential mortgage loans to covered persons who have applied for a license as an individual mortgage loan originator.

MOTION: Rep. DeMordaunt made a motion to introduce **RS 27248. Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27221: **Ron Whitney** ,Deputy Administrator, Idaho Division of Building Safety, presented **RS 27221**, proposed legislation allowing the Division of Building Safety and Factory Built Structures Advisory Board to pass permit fee savings on to modular building manufacturers through a reduction of the permit fees provided in rule. The factory-built structures' dedicated fund balance has been growing at a greater rate than is necessary to administer the modular building program. This legislation will allow the Division and the Board to curtail the ongoing buildup of funds in the factory-built structures' dedicated fund while retaining a reserve balance that is sufficient to fund the modular building program in excess of two years.

MOTION: **Rep. Collins** made a motion to introduce **RS 27221**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27227: **Salvador Cruz**, Financial Institutions Bureau Bank Examiner, IDF, presented **RS 27227**, purposed legislation to amend provision of the Idaho Bank Act to allow banks to act as a custodian or fiduciary for the purpose of offering tax-advantaged savings plans. The amendment will clarify the authority of banks to offer all tax-advantaged savings plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code and the Idaho Income Tax Act, and clarify that banks may act as a fiduciary for the limited purpose of tax advantaged savings plans specified by the Idaho Income Tax Act. The amendments clarify and expand the authority of Idaho state-chartered banks to offer all tax-advantaged savings plans qualified under the Internal Revenue Code and the Idaho Income Tax Act. Additionally, these changes will reduce the regulatory burden on Idaho state-chartered banks, modernize this section of the Idaho Bank Act, and expand availability of financial products to Idaho citizens and has the support of the Idaho Bankers Association.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27227**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

- RS 27206:** **Patricia Highley**, Senior Securities Analyst, DOF, Securities Bureau presented **RS 27206**, proposed legislation regarding regulatory oversight for Idaho's endowment care cemeteries. Presently, there are 11 endowment care cemeteries that are under the jurisdiction of the Idaho Endowment Care Cemetery Act (IECCA). The proposed legislation will amend the IECCA to maintain the fee for registration and renewal of endowment care cemeteries.
- MOTION:** **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to introduce **RS 27206**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27239:** **Patricia Highley** Senior Securities Analyst, DOF, Securities Bureau, presented **RS 27239**, proposed legislation regarding The Securities Bureau regulatory oversight for investment firms and their representatives and for oversight of companies that raise capital through the offer and sale of securities. This will allow continued authorization to require and accept agent filings and fees associated with those agents that offer and sell securities under Federal Regulation, and retain the ability to identify who is soliciting into the state.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27239**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27246:** **Director Packer**, IBOL, presented **RS 27246**, proposed legislation to implement recommendations identified by the Board of Morticians' report to make things easier on licensees and ensure a certificate of authority in place with those who manage trust funds. In response to committee questions, Director Packer clarified the changes reflect alignment with board and gubernatorial requests to remove subjective requirements.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27246**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27255:** **Director Packer**, IBOL, presented **RS 27255**, proposed legislation to bring IBOL with audit findings. In addition, fees weren't going to the correct account, so this legislation would correct that mistake.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27255**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27271:** **Director Packer**, IBOL, presented **RS 27271**, proposed legislation is for the driving business board. This reduces some of the requirements for the public driving instructors while maintaining public safety.
- MOTION:** **Rep. Collins** made a motion to introduce **RS 27271**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27289:** **Director Packer**, (BOL), presented **RS 27289**, legislation removing the registration requirements and references to the Bureau of Occupational Licenses, while leaving in place protections for student athletes and Idaho's education institutions.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27289**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27301:** **Director Packer**, IBOL, presented **RS 27301**, proposed legislation to fine tune changes to the 2018 Barbers and Cosmetologist Act by reducing redundancy, streamlining all licensees' benefits and removing barriers.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27301**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27253: **Sean Schupack**, Director of Public Policy, Idaho Associated General Contractors presented **RS 27253**, legislation to allow registered contractors the option to place their registration on inactive status, relieving the registrant from the requirement to maintain insurance during this period. The proposed legislation would require a registrant to provide proof of current insurance to return to active status. Additionally, the removal from the grounds for discipline of gross negligence and reckless conduct intends to eliminate a provision which is difficult and costly to establish, as well as enforce, and ultimately only bans bad actors from holding a registration, not from working in the contracting industry.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27253**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27625: **Rep. Monks** presented **RS 27625**, proposed legislation providing transparency in the billing process for individuals receiving health care and evens the playing field on the fee side. This would encourage collection agencies to send bills out in a timely manner, with line item charges, and a final bill.

MOTION: **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to introduce **RS 27625**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

Docket No. 07-0301-1901: **Jeff Egan** (DBS) said this pending rule adopts and amends for Idaho the 2018 editions of the International Building Code (IBC), International Residential Code (IRC), International Existing Building Code (IEBC), and International Energy Conservation Code (IECC). The 2018 editions of the IBC, IRC, IEBC, and IECC provide revisions and clarifications that streamline the codes and make them easier to understand and apply. Adopting the 2018 editions of these codes will bring Idaho up to date with the latest building industry standards. Mr. Egan reviewed the specific changes made.

Jason Blais, Idaho Building Co. Board, Idaho Association Building Officials, testified **in support** of **Docket No. 07-0301-1901**, testifying specifically of the unified effort to come to these decisions.

Patrick Sullivan, Director of Building Safety and Facilities Development, City of Nampa, spoke **in support** of **Docket No. 07-0301-1901** and expressed outstanding support from all stakeholders for these changes.

Andrew Bick, Architect, Chair Idaho Building Co. Board, testified **in support** of this code, saying this is the best so far in the construction industry for serving all stakeholders.

MOTION: **Rep. Green** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0301-1901**.

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to approve **Docket No. 07-0301-1901** but reject in part subsection 04.04. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

Chairman Dixon called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

H362: **Rep. Furniss** presented **H362** repealing the Idaho Hospital Liability Trust Act. No hospital liability trusts are currently registered in the state of Idaho nor have any trusts applied since 1999. Rep. Furniss explained there has been no money held by this trust, nor any access to the trust since 1999.

MOTION: **Rep. Collins** made a motion to send **H362** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Monks** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

RS 27622: **Rep. Scott** presented **RS 27622**. This proposed legislation removes the Idaho Department of Transportation's (ITD) ability to suspend registration for any registered vehicle that doesn't have insurance on it. It also removes the ITD's ability to charge a \$75.00 fee to re-instate the registration. While the ITD may continue to send notices of financial responsibility status up to two times a year, the legislation removes the ability to send notices related to a thirty-day suspension and final notices of registration suspension. This eliminates the parts of code regarding suspension communications between the citizen and the ITD, as well as where the fines would be directed. The legislation requires Insurers to update the vehicle verification system at least monthly in efforts to keep the database current. This legislation raises the fines for driving without insurance from \$75 to \$225 and directs 50% of funds directed to administration costs and 50% going to county dispatch centers (PSAPs) of the county in which the driver. **Rep. Scott** asked **Senator Woodward** to continue the presentation.

Senator Woodward continued on **in support** of the presentation of **RS 27622**.

Committee debated the intent to collect an increased fee from drivers if they couldn't afford insurance and the comparative costs of insurance in other states.

MOTION: **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to return **RS 27622** to the sponsor.

RS 27535: **Rep. Armstrong** presented **RS 27535**, proposed legislation ensuring uniformity and certainty to home builders of 4 units and under, nullifying the need to install a sprinkler system. Currently in Idaho most counties allow this, but the position differs from the International Building Code and some local policies, which require sprinkler systems in personal dwellings larger than 2 units. The intent of this legislation is to provide Statewide consistency in the bidding process. **Reps. Crane, Furniss, Palmer, and Nichols** declared Rule 80.

MOTION: **Rep. Furniss** made a motion to introduce **RS 27535**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27250C1: **Richard Sherrick** presented **RS 27250C1**, proposed legislation to grant authority to the Director to issue enforcement actions directly to a credit union, provide for confidentiality of examination reports and other confidential information, and authorize credit unions to act as a custodian or fiduciary for tax-advantaged savings plans. Amendments are proposed to reorganize and update provisions relating to examinations and investigation reports, and to authorize the director to examine and investigate the affairs of a subsidiary of a credit union, credit union service organization, and third-party service providers. A new section is added to provide for the confidentiality of examination reports and confidential communication; provide for circumstances where disclosing confidential information is authorized; imposing penalties violations; authorizes the Director to issue cease and desist orders and suspension or removal orders directly to a credit union or affected person; and to prohibit future employment by a credit union. Provisions authorize the Director to appoint a receiver, outline the powers and duties of a receiver, and amend the act to allow state-chartered credit unions to act as a custodian or fiduciary to the same extent as a federal credit union for the purpose of offering tax-advantaged savings plans.

MOTION: **Rep. Green** made a motion to introduce **RS 27250C1**. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Reps. Nichols, Palmer, and Kiska** requested to be recorded as voting **Nay**.

RS 27609: **Rep. Monks** presented **RS 27609**, proposed legislation to eliminate phantom insurance and reduced payments for benefits paid by others. When a citizen purchases motor vehicle underinsurance coverage, the purchaser receives the stated benefit on the declarations page. This prevents insurance companies (which receive a premium for underinsured coverage) from taking credit for benefits paid by other insurance companies. It further limits the benefits recoverable to the purchaser's actual losses or the amount of coverage purchased, whichever is less. Some motor vehicle insurance companies voluntarily provide this type of coverage and their premium rates are competitive with companies who do not adhere to this policy.

MOTION: **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to introduce **RS 27609**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

RS 27629C1: **Rep. Green** presented **RS 27629C1**, proposed legislation to honor sick leave offered to employees without penalty, such as an absence subject to discipline, discharge, demotion, suspension, or any other adverse action.

MOTION: **Rep. Kiska** made a motion to introduce **RS 27629C1**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

- RS 27513:** **Rep. Syme** presented **RS 27513**, proposed legislation to eliminate a section of the code which requires a broker's physical presence in the office at certain intervals. Brokers are required to properly supervise their sales associates, regardless of their location. As technology advances have made it possible for brokers to supervise contracts electronically, the physical presence requirement created unnecessary restrictions for the business models of some brokerage companies. In order to protect the consumer in a real estate transaction, language was added to clarify the broker's responsibility to be reasonably available to answer questions and complaints
- MOTION:** **Rep. Crane** made a motion to introduce **RS 27513**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27243:** **Rep. Syme** presented **RS 27243**, proposed legislation seeking an amendment clarifying that all sales associates must provide copies of signed real estate transaction documents to their broker by the end of the next business day. This update benefits consumers by increasing broker supervision of their licensees' activities.
- MOTION:** **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to introduce **RS 27243**. **Motion carried by voice vote.**
- RS 27288:** **Rep. Syme** presented **RS 27288**, proposed legislation to reduce barriers to licensure and burdens on current licensees of the Real Estate Commission. The changes would reduce the minimum number of hours required in individual accredited courses, eliminate unnecessary requirements to mark rejected offers, and have a written agency office policy. H 477: **Rep. Syme** presented **H 477**, explaining The Commission seeks an amendment clarifying that all sales associates must provide copies of signed real estate transaction documents to their broker by the end of the next business day. This update benefits consumers by increasing broker supervision of their licensees' activities. Rep. Syme declared Rule 80.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to send **H 477** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Syme** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 478: **Rep. Syme** presented **H 478**, and turned the time over to **Michelle Bird, REC**. Consistent with the Governor's Licensing Freedom Act, this bill would reduce barriers to licensure and burdens on current licensees of the Real Estate Commission. The changes would reduce the minimum number of hours required in individual accredited courses, eliminate unnecessary requirements to mark rejected offers, and have a written agency office policy. The proposed legislation also clarifies language about calling meetings of the Commission and removes a citation to a rule that was allowed to expire. Rep. Syme declared Rule 80.

MOTION: **Rep. Raymond** made a motion to send **H 478** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Syme** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 399: **Rep. Green** presented **H 399**, and introduced Bureau Chief **Anthony Polidori, IDOF**, who explained the legislation to add a provision to allow collection agencies to collect incidental charges included in the contract between the creditor and the debtor. Additionally, the legislation makes the licensing process for collection agents, debt counselors, credit counselors, and credit repair entities similar to other entities licensed by the IDOF by requiring the use of a nationwide system of licensing and allowing for reinstatement of expired applications. Further, the legislation removes branch registration requirements and extends licensing requirements to branch locations and increases license and renewal application fees. Finally, the legislation eliminates quarterly agent reporting requirements and the associated fees for quarterly reporting.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to send **H 399** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.**

SUBSTITUTE MOTION: **Rep. Berch** made a substitute motion to send **H 399** to the floor with no recommendation. **Motion failed by voice vote.** **Rep. Berch** requested to be recorded as voting **AYE.**

The purpose of this legislation is to make the licensing process for regulated lenders and payday lenders similar to other entities licensed by the IDOF by requiring the use of a nationwide system of licensing. Additionally, the legislation modifies provisions related to administrative and civil remedies applicable to persons offering consumer credit in Idaho. Finally, the legislation reduces licensing requirements applicable to regulated lenders and payday lenders.

MOTION: **Rep. DeMordaunt** made a motion to send **H 400** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Berch** is recorded as voting **NAY.** **Rep. Armstrong** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 401: **Rep. Green** presented **H 401**, legislation to amend the definition of mortgage lender to include entities engaged in mortgage servicing activities, and to eliminate duplicative licensing and compliance requirements for the activity of servicing residential mortgage loans. The legislation revises definitions to exclude commercial construction lending from applicable licensing requirements. Further, the legislation expands an exemption for de minimis lending activity conducted for investment purposes, reduces licensing requirements for licensees and applicants, and eliminates associated prohibited practices. Finally, the legislation grants temporary authority to originate residential mortgage loans to covered persons who have applied for a license as an individual mortgage loan originator. **Rep. Green** turned the time over to **Anthony Polidori**, IDOF. The proposed changes reduce unnecessary burdens on licensees and license applicants and supports reasonable supervision of residential mortgage activities.

H 419: **Rep. Lickley** presented **H 419**, and introduced **Director Kelley Packer**, IDOF, and **Steve Gordon**, Board Member of the Idaho Mortician Board. This legislation will implement recommendations identified by the Board of Morticians' report regarding education, remove the outdated secretary position, fully merge fee setting authority into board rule, and add failed inspections as a potential ground for discipline. The legislation includes moving the individual licensing requirement for a certificate authority from individuals to establishments with the resident mortician being responsible for the certificate.

Committee questions regarding hours required and age were answered by **Mr. Gordon** and **Director Packer**, who explained eighteen year old people are allowed to be an apprentice, however an associates degree from a morticians school is required.

H 422: **Rep. The Act encourages medical providers to be timely and transparent and provides for fair and reasonable cost and fees related to medical debt collection.

Those speaking **in support**; **Jim Jones**; **Matt Andrew**, ITLA; **Kim Blough**; **Jeremy Jones**, Doctor of Physical Therapy; **Alex Warner**, Idaho Medical Debt; **Deana Young**; **Byron Wilkinson**; **Bradley Bell**; **Carlos Hernandez**; **Doug Farr**, Attorney; **Frank VanderSloot**, Melaleuca; **Aaron Eddington**, Melaleuca. Testimonies were heard regarding bills never received going to collections, and receiving bills from providers patients were unaware they even owed money. Patients have the right to know to whom they owe money and to receive the statements in a timely fashion. Collection fees become overwhelming very quickly, and can devastate an individual or family.

Those speaking **in opposition**; **Bryan Smith**, Attorney; **Greg Ferch**, Chiropractor; **Sky Ipson**, Attorney; **Katie Davenport**; **Jack Lassetter**, MD; **Pamela Denson**, MD; **Shaun Bonney**, Attorney; **Carma Ferrar**, Collection Agency Owner; **Rep. Those testifying expressed concerns with time constraints in billing, the ability to collect from non-paying patients, and providers wondered if there would be any recourse to recover payment for services rendered. James Adams; Maureen Moran; Evan Mortimer, attorney; **Rick Frost; Jasmine Rhodes; Russ Johnson**, attorney; **Kelby Monks**, attorney, are of the opinion that customers aren't receiving the benefits they believe they have paid for from insurance plans, and spoke **in support** of **H 474**.

Mike Kane; Bob Ricketts; Steve Thomas spoke **in opposition** to **H 474**, saying this bill will increase costs and needs to be held in committee to work on wording.

MOTION: **Rep. Palmer** made a motion to send **H 474** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Barbieri** requested to be recorded as voting **NAY**. **Rep. Monks** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

H 526: **Rep. Furniss** presented **H 526**, legislation applying to the section regarding indexed annuities which asks the agent to maintain disclosure records for a time certain and insurance companies to surrender charges over a 10 - year period. Installers must make connections in accordance with the same standards as plumbing licensees, there is no need to require installers to obtain a plumbing or specialty license to make connections. **Rep. Nichols** declared Rule 80.

MOTION: **Rep. Furniss** made a motion to send **S 1259** to the floor with a **DO PASS** recommendation. **Motion carried by voice vote.** **Rep. Lickley** will sponsor the bill on the floor.

S 1260: **Rep. Lickley** presented **S 1260** legislation allowing HVAC apprentices to renew registration and continue working as apprentices by showing completion of eight hours of continuing education for each year of the prior registration period. The legislation changes the apprentice registration period from five years to one year, the fee from \$50 to \$10, and makes tracking continuing education easier.

John Nielsen, (IDBS), explained that this is not another pathway to licensure, but allows people to stay in the trade while not pursuing journeyman.
