Chairman Clow called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

S 1046aa: Senator Thayn presented legislation which will enhance student curriculum

through collaboration with teachers, administrators and caregivers. If a group, which numbers a class size or greater, makes a curriculum request to a school district, the State Department of Education will review the proposed curriculum for compliance with standards and the district may implement it. In answer to committee questions, Sen Thayn stated the law currently allows school districts to select their own curriculum, this change involves patron-initiated curriculum.

Rep. Horman discussed the benefits to collaboration between caregivers and school districts. She provided examples of schools which have lost many students to charter and alternative schools which could have been prevented with a pathway

to innovation. In answer to committee questions, she stated the school districts and administrators would decide if they agree and how to implement the change.

Vice Chairman Kerby spoke in support of S 1046aa for its ability to give

caregivers and students a voice and build relationships with the school district while

creating opportunities.

Rep. McCrostie, Rep. Moon and Rep. Marshall expressed concern about funding

the implementation of innovative ideas.

MOTION: Vice Chairman Kerby made a motion to send S 1046aa to the floor with a DO

PASS recommendation.

ROLL CALL VOTE ON MOTION: Roll call vote was requested. Motion carried by a vote of 11 AYE and 3 NAY and 1 Absent/Excused. Voting in favor of the motion: Vice Chairman Kerby, Reps. Boyle, Mendive, Moon, Ehardt, Marshall, Wisniewski, Yamamoto, Shepherd,

Galloway, and Chairman Clow. Voting in opposition to the motion: Reps. Berch, Toone, and McCrostie. Rep. Demordaunt was Absent/Excused. Rep.

Horman will sponsor the bill on the floor.

RS 28220: Rep. Ehardt proposed legislation to require schools to obtain caregiver permission

for student participation in school-sponsored clubs and student organizations.

MOTION: Rep. Mendive made a motion to introduce RS 28220. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 28803: Rep. von Ehlinger proposed legislation which would allow military veterans to pay

in-state tuition rates at public colleges and universities.

MOTION: Rep. Berch made a motion to return RS 28803 to the sponsor. Rep. McCrostie made a substitute motion to introduce RS 28803. Motion carried SUBSTITUTE MOTION: by voice vote. Rep. Berch requested to be recorded as voting NAY. RS 28807C1: Rep. Boyle proposed legislation which will fund optional full day kindergarten and count participating kindergarten students as enrolled full time. Rep. Moon made a motion to introduce RS 28807C1.
