What the Opt in does and what it doesn't do!

Opt in

- Leaves the control with the parents.
- Allows for complete transparency - parental rights, parental involvement & parental responsibility.
- Places the responsibility of information getting to the parents in the hands of the teachers.
- Opt in is about consent, not content.
- Continues to empower parents in their role of overseeing their child's education
- Surrounding states of Utah, Arizona and Nevada all have opt in.

Opt out

- Leaves control with the school
- Allows for mistakes to continually occur where children are subjected to objectionable sexual content that the parent wouldn't want.
- Places the responsibility of the information getting to the parents in the hands of the child.
- Opt out does not reveal content.
- Makes the State supreme in the decision-making roles of the child.
- Many more states are running opt in's this year as a means to combat the increasing sexual content in all of our kids' educational materials.
