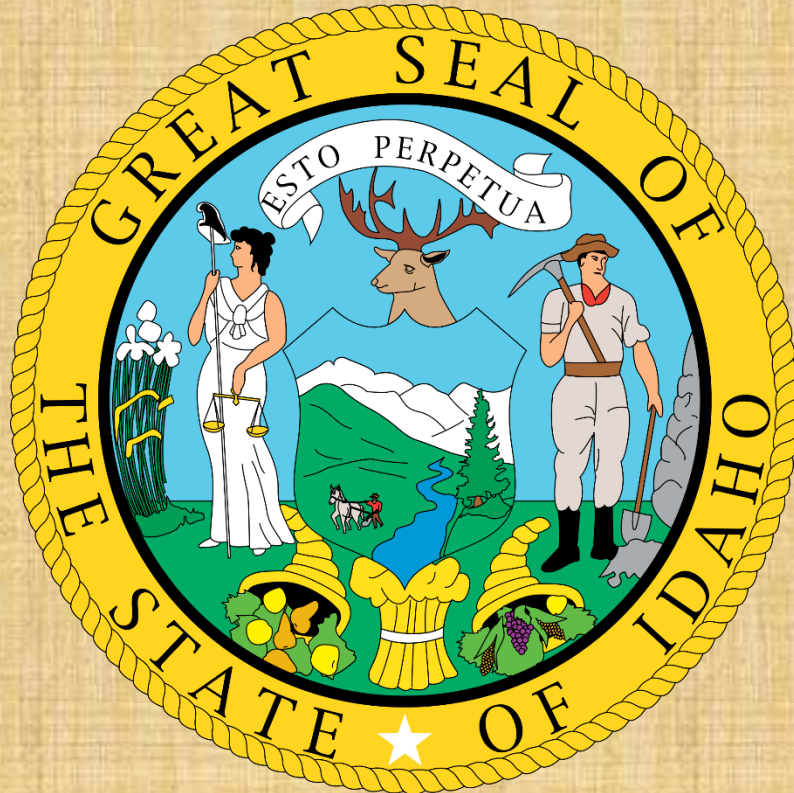
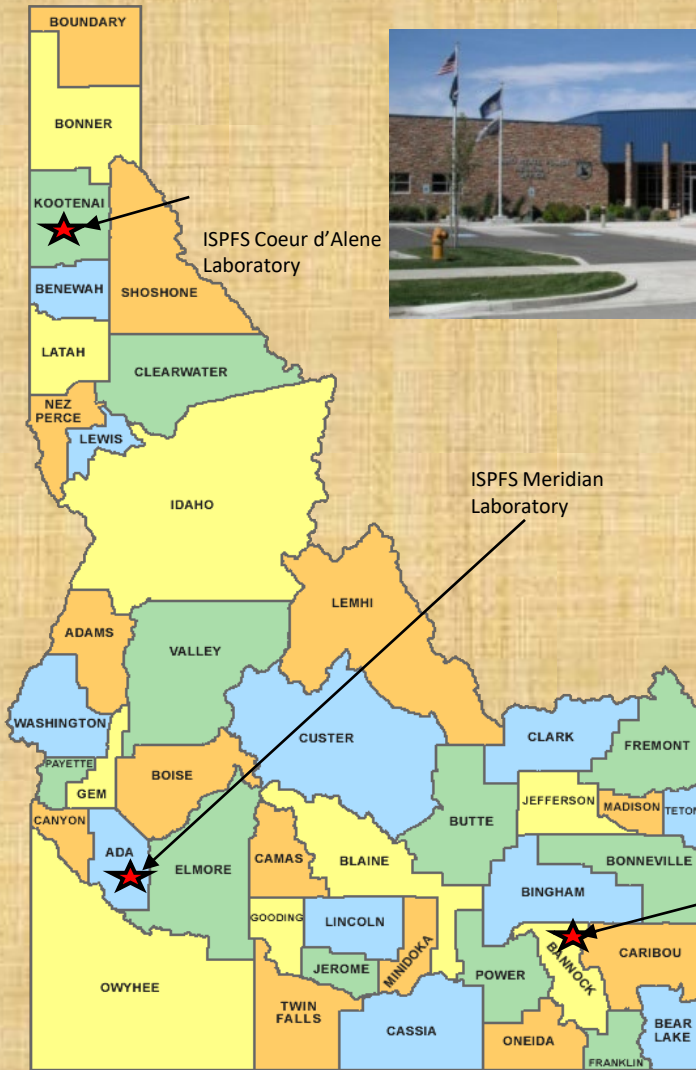

**"Sexual assault evidence kit" means a set of materials, such as swabs and tools for collecting blood samples, used to gather forensic evidence from a victim of reported sexual assault and the evidence obtained with such materials.*

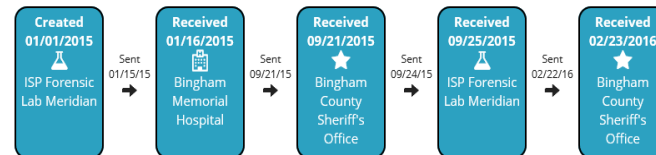

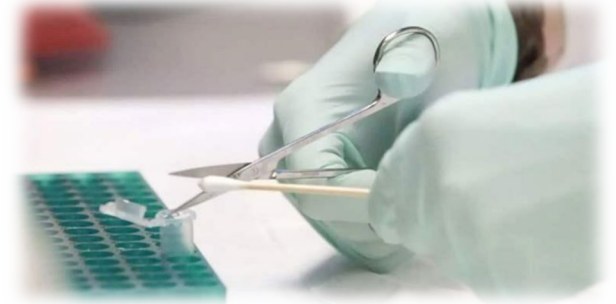

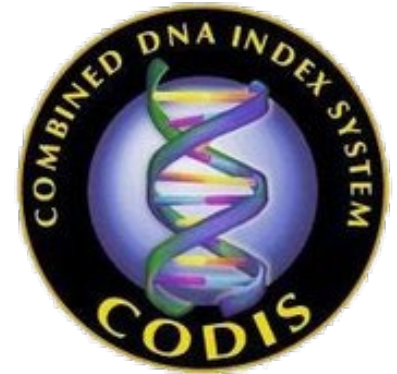

Subject: **Property Crimes DNA Testing Initiative**
Date: April 12, 2022

The Idaho State Police Forensic Services (ISPFS) laboratory offers DNA analysis in felony property crime cases and is encouraging agencies to immediately submit evidence from property crimes for DNA analysis, as part of a property crimes initiative. The intent of this initiative is to perform DNA analysis on evidence from property crimes and enter the resulting evidence profiles into the Combined DNA Index System (CODIS) for comparison to evidence in other cases. CODIS allows for the comparison of these profiles to convicted offender samples and evidence from other cases at the state and national level. The goal of this initiative is to provide investigative leads in unsolved cases.

Another key objective is to prevent future violent crimes against persons. Studies have shown that property crimes are often a gateway crime to more violent crimes against persons such as aggravated assault, sexual assault, and homicide. Violent offenders typically have a criminal history that includes multiple property crimes. If the offender's DNA can be entered in CODIS at the first offense, it will increase the likelihood of preventing future violent crimes against persons, or of more quickly identifying the perpetrator of violent crimes without a known suspect.

Per the Crime in Idaho Crimes Against Property Statistics report, in 2020, Idaho reported a total of 36,165 crimes against property. The resulting monetary loss as a result of these crimes was in excess of 40 million dollars, causing insurance rates for the state to go up. Our hope is this initiative will reduce property crimes in Idaho, thus reducing overall insurance rates for Idahoans. ISPFS has designated separate workflows for this property crimes initiative. In addition, grant funding has been used to purchase instrumentation and fund full time positions to support a high throughput model for this workflow. Submission and testing of these cases will not negatively impact turnaround times for the other cases being submitted to our DNA unit for analysis.
