HOUSE BILL NO. 12
BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE
AN ACT
RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; AMENDING CHAPTER 23, TITLE 67, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 67-2359, IDAHO CODE, TO PROHIBIT STATE AGENCIES FROM DONATING TO OR SPONSORING

A NONGOVERNMENTAL EVENT OR ORGANIZATION, TO PROVIDE EXCEPTIONS, AND TO PROVIDE A PENALTY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

[H 7](#), [H 8](#), [H 9](#), [H 10](#), [H 11](#), and [H 12](#) were introduced, read the first time by title, and referred to the Judiciary, Rules, and Administration Committee for printing.
