RELATING TO EDUCATION; AMENDING SECTION 33-6401, IDAHO CODE, TO LIMIT EXTENDED LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES TO FULL-TIME STUDENTS; AMENDING SECTION 33-512D, IDAHO CODE, TO LIMIT SELF-DIRECTED STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES TO FULL-TIME STUDENTS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE
AN ACT

RELATING TO PURCHASING BY POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS; AMENDING SECTION 67-2802A, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT A PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO A MULTIPLE-OCCUPANCY RESTROOM, SHOWER FACILITY, OR CHANGING ROOM ON ANY BASIS OTHER THAN BIOLOGICAL SEX; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
