S 1002 **BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE** AN ACT

RELATING TO ABORTION; AMENDING SECTION 18-622, IDAHO CODE, TO REMOVE PROVISIONS REGARDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO REVISE A PROVISION REGARDING AN AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE, TO REVISE AN EXCEPTION, AND TO MAKE

A TECHNICAL CORRECTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

S 1003 **BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE** AN ACT

RELATING TO PURCHASING BY POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS; AMENDING SECTION 67-2802A, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE THAT A PUBLIC WORKS BIDDER, OFFEROR, CONTRACTOR, OR SUBCONTRACTOR SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO A MULTIPLE-OCCUPANCY RESTROOM, SHOWER FACILITY, OR CHANGING ROOM ON ANY BASIS OTHER THAN BIOLOGICAL SEX; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

S 1004 **BY STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE** AN ACT

RELATING TO SELF-DEFENSE; AMENDING CHAPTER 2, TITLE 19, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 19-202B, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR IMMUNITY FROM CRIMINAL PROSECUTION WHEN FORCE IS USED IN CERTAIN INSTANCES, TO DEFINE TERMS, TO PROVIDE FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR A DEFENDANT IN CERTAIN INSTANCES, TO PROVIDE THAT OTHER DEFENSES TO CIVIL AND CRIMINAL LIABILITY SHALL NOT BE IMPAIRED, TO PROVIDE FOR A SPECIAL VERDICT IN CERTAIN INSTANCES, TO PROVIDE FOR A PRETRIAL IMMUNITY HEARING, AND TO PROVIDE FOR A BURDEN OF PROOF; PROVIDING SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

[S 1002](#), [S 1003](#), and [S 1004](#) were introduced, read the first time at length, and referred to the Judiciary and Rules Committee for printing.

On request by Senator Anthon, granted by unanimous consent, the Senate advanced to the Fifteenth Order of Business.
