## HOUSE BILL NO. 76

4	CORRECTION; AMENDING CHAPTER 32, TITLE 55, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION
5	OF A NEW SECTION 55-3212, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING
6	HOMEOWNER'S ASSOCIATION RESTRICTIONS ON GROWING AND RAISING FOOD; AND
7	DECLARING AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the Legislature to permit and encourage programs and policies that sustain greater local food security and to improve access to healthy foods. Farming is a natural right. The purpose of this act is to protect the inherent rights of citizens to sustain themselves on their own property by growing and raising food and to encourage the protection of sustainable cultivation of fresh produce and protein at all levels of production in Idaho, including properties contained within the jurisdiction of homeowner's associations.

SECTION 2. That Section 55-3203, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

55-3203. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter:

- (1) "Accessory buildings" includes but is not limited to:
- (a) Structures for plant protection, such as hoop houses, greenhouses, high tunnels, low tunnels, caterpillar tunnels, shade structures, and insect netting; and
- (b) Operations buildings, such as sheds, farm stands, garages, and outbuildings.
- (2) "Apiculture" means the keeping or propagation of honeybee colonies for the collection of honey or other bee products.
- (3) "Aquaculture" means the cultivation and keeping of marine or freshwater organisms, such as aquatic plants, fish, and other aquatic animals, under controlled conditions for use as a food source or in the use of aquaponics plant production.
- (4) "Backyard domesticated homesteading food animals" includes but is not limited to:
  - (a) Poultry, such as chickens, ducks, geese, guineas, and turkeys;
  - (b) Meat animals, such as guinea pigs, rabbits, goats, swine, and cattle; and
  - (c) Dairy animals, such as goats, sheep, and cattle.
- $\underline{(5)}$  "Board" means the entity that has the duty of governing the homeowner's association and may be referred to as a board of directors, executive board, or any other such similar name.

(6) "Composting" means the mixing of organic matter, such as leaves, garden waste, and animal manure, for the production of compost for use in the growing of food.

- (27) "Financial disclosure" means the accounting records of the organization that are kept, disclosed, and made available for inspection in accordance with part 11, chapter 30, title 30, Idaho Code, and the governing documents of the homeowner's association.
- (8) "Garden" means any plot of ground or elevated soil bed on residential property where vegetables, herbs, fruits, flowers, pollinator plants, leafy greens, or other edible plants are cultivated.
- (39) "Governing documents" means a written instrument by which the homeowner's association may exercise powers or manage, maintain, or otherwise affect the property under the jurisdiction of the homeowner's association. "Governing documents" includes but is not limited to articles of incorporation, bylaws, a plat, rules of the homeowner's association, and any declaration of covenants, conditions, and restrictions.
- $(4\underline{10})$  "Homeowner's association" means any incorporated or unincorporated association:
  - (a) In which membership is based upon owning or possessing an interest in real property; and
  - (b) That has the authority, pursuant to recorded covenants, bylaws, or other governing documents, to assess and record liens against the real property of its members.
- (511) "Member" or "membership" means any person or entity owning or possessing an interest in residential real property or a lot within the physical boundaries of an established homeowner's association.
- (12) "Vermiculture" means the cultivation of earthworms, mealworms, or other organisms for use as animal feed or to convert waste to nutrient and beneficial microorganisms for use in soil compost.
- SECTION 3. That Chapter 32, Title 55, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a  $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$ , to be known and designated as Section 55-3212, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
- 55-3212. GROWING AND RAISING FOOD. (1) No homeowner's association may add, amend, or enforce any covenant, condition, or restriction that prohibits or has the effect of prohibiting an owner of property within the jurisdiction of the homeowner's association from engaging in apiculture, vermiculture, aquaculture, the growing of gardens, composting, the raising of backyard domesticated homesteading food animals, or constructing or using accessory buildings, if performed according to the provisions of this section and if otherwise permitted by state law and local ordinances, on any part of the property owned by him. An owner may also delegate the rights quaranteed by this section to his tenant, agent, or contractor.
- (2) Animals must be appropriately housed on the property, protected, and contained by animal-appropriate fencing.
- (3) A person exercising rights set forth in this section may perform operations and activities necessary for raising, growing, washing, packaging, and storing fruits, vegetables, other plant products, and food or dairy animals.

(4) A homeowner's association may prohibit the construction of accessory buildings, as defined in section 55-3203, Idaho Code, that occupy more than sixty percent (60%) of the area of a required backyard, less any setbacks, for homes located within its jurisdiction inside city limits.

SECTION 4. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2023.
