## HOUSE BILL NO. 232

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Section 18-2318, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. That Chapter 23, Title 18, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a  $\underline{\text{NEW SECTION}}$ , to be known and designated as Section 18-2318, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 18-2318. POLLING PLACE PROHIBITIONS. (1) On the day of any election and on any days during which early voting is taking place, no person shall engage in electioneering messaging in or on the property of a polling place or any other building in which voters are casting votes or within three hundred (300) feet of the property line of such location where votes are being cast or where absentee ballots are being deposited. A voter must remove or cover any electioneering messages before entering the area where electioneering messaging is prohibited.
  - (2) (a) "Electioneering messages" means communications or attempted communications by a person designed to influence the vote of another person. Electioneering messages include oral communications, written communications, electronic communications, or any other form of communication, including campaign posters, signs, unofficial voter guides, banners, flags, and personal apparel.
  - (b) "Electioneering messaging" means soliciting, greeting, or approaching a voter with a visual or audio message to influence his vote.
- (3) Election officials shall post in a conspicuous place at any location where electioneering messaging is prohibited pursuant to subsection (1) of this section at least one (1) sign provided by the secretary of state that delineates the property line from which electioneering messaging within three hundred (300) feet is prohibited. The area where electioneering messaging is prohibited shall include:
  - (a) The building in which votes are being cast or absentee ballots are being deposited;
  - (b) Any parking lot adjacent to such building that is routinely used for parking at that building;
  - (c) The routes of access between the building and any parking lot;

- (d) Any route of access between any public right-of-way and the building in which votes are being cast or absentee ballots are being deposited; and
- (e) Any area at a building in which votes are being cast or absentee ballots are being deposited that is designated for voters waiting to vote.
- (4) No person shall obstruct the doors or entries to a building where votes are being cast or absentee ballots are being deposited or prevent free access to and from any polling place. No person shall engage in any practice that interferes with the freedom of voters to exercise their franchise or disrupts the administration of the polling place.
- (5) Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be guilty of an infraction and shall be punished by a fine of at least one hundred dollars (\$100) but no more than five hundred dollars (\$500) for a first violation.
- (6) Any person who persists in violating the provisions of this section after being cited for an infraction pursuant to subsection (5) of this section may be arrested and convicted of a misdemeanor and be subject to a fine not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000), confinement in the county jail for no more than three (3) months, or both such fine and confinement.
- SECTION 3. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2023.
