- RELATING TO PREVENTION OF PUBLIC OFFENSES; AMENDING SECTION 19-202, IDAHO
 CODE, TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEFENSIVE DISPLAY OR DECLARATION OF A FIREARM
 AND TO PROVIDE THAT THE DEFENSIVE DISPLAY OR DECLARATION OF A FIREARM
 SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED IN CERTAIN INSTANCES; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY
 AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

8 SECTION 1. That Section 19-202, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby 9 amended to read as follows:

10 19-202. RESISTANCE BY THREATENED PARTY. (1) Resistance sufficient to 11 prevent the offense may be made by the person about to be injured:

(a) To prevent an offense against his person, or his family, or somemember thereof; or

(b) To prevent an illegal attempt by force to take or injure property inhis lawful possession.

(2) The defensive display or declaration of a firearm by a person is 16 justified when and to the extent a reasonable person would believe that 17 physical force is immediately necessary to protect the person or another 18 person against the use or attempted use of unlawful physical force, includ-19 ing deadly force. The provisions of this subsection do not apply to someone 20 who intentionally provokes another person to use or attempt to use unlawful 21 22 physical force or deadly physical force. For purposes of this section, "de-23 fensive display or declaration of a firearm" shall include:

24 (a) <u>Verbally informing another person that the person possesses or has</u>
 25 available a firearm; and

(b) Exposing, displaying, or placing a person's hand on a firearm while
 the firearm is contained in a holster, pocket, purse, or other means of
 containment or transport in a manner that a reasonable person would un derstand was meant to protect the person or another against an unlawful
 use or attempted use of physical force or deadly physical force.

31 (3) The provisions of this section do not require a defensive display
 32 or declaration of a firearm before the use of physical force or deadly physi 33 cal force, or threat of physical force or deadly physical force, by a person
 34 who is otherwise justified in the use or threatened use of physical force or
 35 deadly physical force.

(2) (4) A person acting pursuant to this section may use such degree and
 extent of force as would appear to be reasonably necessary to prevent the
 threatened injury. Reasonableness is to be judged from the viewpoint of a
 reasonable person placed in the same position and seeing and knowing what the
 person then saw and knew without the benefit of hindsight.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after

July 1, 2023.
