

Regulatory Scope

This rule governs when, how and where a livestock carcass can be disposed of to minimize the impact to public health and the environment.

When: Within 72 hours of knowledge of the death of the animal

How: Burial, Rendering, Landfill, Composting, Chemical Digestion,

Incineration, Burning, Natural Decomposition

Where: 300 ft from residences/water wells; 200 ft from surface water;

100 ft from public roadways; 50 ft from property lines

Negotiated Rulemaking Meetings

- Public meetings were conducted via video conference
- Multiple industry stakeholders participated in both meetings
- No comments were submitted to the rulemaking record outside of the rule meetings

Summary of Rule Changes

- **IBR Composting Best Management Practices**
- Section 30.02 (pg 3) Animals known to be infected with a prion disease (CWD, BSE, Scrapie, etc) must notify ISDA prior to disposing of the carcass
- Section 30.04 (pg 3) Setback requirements for carcasses buried near surface water do not apply if the water is elevated or up-gradient from the carcass (i.e. – irrigation ditch)
- Red Tape Reduction (multiple sections)
