



AGENCY OVERVIEW

### **Agency Summary & Statutory Authority**

Psychiatric Hospitalization is organized into four budgeted programs: Community Hospitalization, State Hospital South (SHS), State Hospital North (SHN), and State Hospital West (SHW). All the state hospitals provide short and long-term 24-hour residential care and treatment for persons who are not able to remain safely in the community setting. In order for an individual to be committed, three steps must occur. First, a law enforcement official or emergency room worker determines and individual is: (1) mentally ill; (2) likely to injure himself or others or is gravely disabled because of mental illness; and (3) they lack the capacity to make informed decisions about treatment. A judge files an order requesting a dedicated examiner evaluate the individual. If the dedicated examiner determine the individual still meets the criteria, 48 hours passes and a second senior dedicated examiner does an evaluation. If the second examiner rules in favor of commitment, the judge schedules a hearing and a civil court proceeding takes place.

## Division of Psychiatric Hospitalization: Total Appropriation and Actual Expenditures



Funds are used to pay for patient care once an individual has been committed to state custody, but before a bed is available in one of the state institutions.

## **Community Hospitalization: Total Appropriation and Actual Expenditures**



- S1384, SECTION 10. EXEMPTIONS FROM PROGRAM TRANSFER LIMITATIONS. The Community Hospitalization Program is hereby exempted from
  the provisions of Section 67-3511(2), Idaho Code, allowing unlimited transfers into the Community Hospitalization Program from other programs within
  the Department of Health and Welfare for all moneys appropriated to it for the period July 1, 23 2022, through June 30, 2023.
- In FY 2022, \$200,000 was added as a non-cognizable increase to support the increased costs during COVID-19
- S1327 (2022), added Section 66-327, Idaho Code, to clarify that the counties are not responsible for the costs of pre-commitment and commitment periods for residential psychiatric treatment. \$3,895,000 ongoing from the General Fund was added to address the fiscal impacts of this bill.






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### **Agency Summary & Statutory Authority**

State Hospital South (SHS), in Blackfoot, serves as the major adult psychiatric inpatient facility for the state. The hospital provides intensive psychiatric treatment for acute, chronic, geriatric, and forensic patients in a residential setting. There are 109 beds on four units. Additionally, Syringa Nursing Home is a separate unit and has 29 beds for a nursing home facility.




# State Hospital North: Total Appropriation and Actual Expenditures



### **Agency Summary & Statutory Authority**


State Hospital West (SHW), was established in 2020 with passage of H597. The adolescent unit has a 16-bed capacity and is located in Nampa, Idaho. SHW provides care to medically stable and healthy patients with a primary psychiatric diagnosis that includes one-on-one counseling, social therapy, a medical regime, recreational and occupational therapies, and a continuing education environment.
