



To coordinate policy and programs related to drug and substance abuse in Idaho


Programs & Activities

What is primary prevention of substance misuse?


Strategies that shift focus 'upstream' to educate and support individuals and communities to prevent drug misuse and the development of substance use disorders.



FY23 Appropriation Update

FY23 Appropriation

COVID-19 Response & Relief Funds

- \$1,600,000 appropriated
- \$1,200,000 expended to date
- Deadline to spend: March 2023

American Rescue Plan Act Funds

- \$1,381,900 appropriated
- \$65,000 expended to date
- Deadline to spend: September 2025

FY24 ODP Budget Recommendation

FY23 Supplemental – Strategic Prevention Grant Funds

- Strategic Prevention Framework Partnership for Success (PFS) Grant
- Spending authority of federal funds to utilize \$1,607,600 previously awarded funds that were unused by sub-grantees
- Deadline to spend: October 31, 2024

FY24 Line Item – American Rescue Plan Act Funds (ARPA)

- Reappropriation Authority for Unencumbered/Unexpended FY23 ARPA Funds
- Deadline to spend: September 2025



FY23 Summary - Spotlight on Idaho Youth

Native America Hear Our Voice Arise (NAHOVA) Youth Board

The Lapwai NAHOVA Youth Board was recognized as the 2022 Outstanding Youth Group during the annual Idaho Conference on Alcohol & Drug Dependency. The award highlighted their involvement in primary prevention activities designed to increase awareness about substance misuse among youth and young adults on and around the Nez Perce reservation.



CADCA Youth Leadership Initiative

ODP partnered with Community Anti-Drug Coalitions of America (CADCA) for a two-part Youth Leadership Initiative that brought together approximately 50 teens from rural areas across Idaho to strengthen their skills and capacity to influence positive change.
