## **S 1025 – Marriage License**

### **What S 1025 does.**

In 1967's unanimous decision in *Loving v. Virginia*, the court declared that marriage is one of the 'basic civil rights of man,' fundamental to our very existence and survival. Idaho Code states that marriage is a civil contract between two qualified individuals. A lawful marriage is currently executed through 5 steps:

- 1) Two qualified individuals decide to marry.
- 2) They visit the county clerk's office in the county in which they intend to marry, pay a fee, attest to their qualifications and identity and receive a marriage license.
- 3) They take their license to a qualified officiant who verifies their identity and qualifications and performs the marriage solemnization, or ceremony.
- 4) The officiant is responsible to return a marriage certificate to the county recorder, and the recorder records and files it.
- 5) The county recorder sends a copy of the marriage certificate to the department of health and welfare to be kept as required by the vital statistics act.

After passage of S 1025:

- 1) Two qualified individuals decide to marry.

~~2) They visit the county clerk's office in the county in which they intend to marry, pay a fee, attest to their qualifications and identity and receive a marriage license.~~

3) They take their license to a qualified officiant who verifies their identity and qualifications and performs the marriage solemnization, or ceremony.

4) The officiant is responsible to return a marriage certificate to the county recorder, with fees, and the recorder records and files it.

5) The county recorder sends a copy of the marriage certificate to the department of health and welfare to be kept as required by the vital statistics act.

### DOMESTIC RELATIONS

### CHAPTER 3

### SOLEMNIZATION OF MARRIAGE

32-309. MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE AS EVIDENCE. The original certificate, and record of marriage made by the judge, justice or minister, as prescribed in this chapter, and the record thereof by the recorder of the county, or a copy of such record duly certified by such recorder, must be received in all courts and places as presumptive evidence of the fact of such marriage.
