


AGENCY OVERVIEW

## **Agency Summary & Statutory Authority**

The Division of Idaho State Police enforces federal and state statutes, prevents and detects crime, regulates traffic, and executes and serves warrants. ISP has Seven budgeted Programs. Director's Office, Capitol Protective Services, Investigations, Patrol, Law Enforcement Programs, Support Services, and Forensic Services, Statutory Authority can be found in Section 29, Title 67, Idaho Code.



- The Division of Idaho State Police was authorized 561.34 FTP and appropriated \$101,065,800 for FY 2023.
- For the FY 2023 original appropriation includes 42% from the General Fund, 45% from dedicated funds, and 13% from federal funds.
- There are no current audit findings.
