



- 93% of POST's appropriation is from the Peace Officers
 Training Fund; revenue sources include: \$15 court fee and a
 portion of all civil fees and court fees. Starting in FY 2023
 POST will receive a transfer of 1.5% of liquor revenue.
- POST hosts multiple academies per year and verifies that all agencies that conduct their own training use POST certified curriculum. Currently, ISP, Boise Police, Ada County Sheriff, IDOC, Correctional Alternative Placement Program, and Nampa/Meridian Police Departments conduct their own training.
- Four colleges offer POST Certified Programs, they are: North Idaho College, College of Western Idaho, College of Southern Idaho, and Idaho State University.
