Chairman Weber called the meeting to order at 1:04 p.m.

Chairmain Weber introduced the Committee secretary and thanked **Rep. Dixon** (1) and **Rep. Necochea** for acting as minutes proofreaders. He explained the deadline and approval process for accepting RSs for an introductory hearing.

- **RS 30323: Rep. Boyle** presented **RS 30323**, which will add rattlesnakes to the list of predatory animals.
- MOTION: Rep. Dixon (1) made a motion to introduce RS 30323. Motion carried by voice vote.
- **RS 30355: Rep. Dixon (24)** presented **RS 30355**, which will require homeowner's associations to provide payoff statements to property owners free of charge. No other fees will be affected.

In response to a committee question, **Rep. Dixon (24)** explained that while current Idaho Code prohibits this, the legislation's amendment clarifies that charges for statements of account will be in violation of the Idaho Consumer Protection Act.

- MOTION: Rep. Burns made a motion to introduce RS 30355. Motion carried by voice vote.
- **RS 30356: Rep. Dixon (24)** presented **RS 30356** relating to unfair service agreements in real estate. These agreements are attached to property, can be expensive and can cause problems years later when property owners dispenses of their properties. This legislation defines what a service agreement is and limits the agreements to one year.

MOTION: Rep. Burns made a motion to introduce RS 30356. Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 30379: Rep. Moyle presented **RS 30379**, which will prohibit data center properties, exempt from equipment sales taxes under current Idaho law, from being included in urban renewal district revenue allocations. The intent is to ensure a data center's property taxes go to local taxing districts that provide services to the area where the data center is located.

In answer to a committee question, **Rep. Moyle** stated it was his intent to assign the legislation to a committee.

MOTION:Rep. Dixon made a motion to introduce RS 30379. Motion carried by voice vote.ADJOURN:There being no further business to come before the committee, the meeting
adjourned at 1:16 p.m.
