Chairman Weber called the meeting to order at 8:30 a.m.

MOTION: Rep. Dixon (1) made a motion to approve the minutes of the February 28, 2023

and March 2, 2023 meetings. Motion carried by voice vote.

RS 30419: Rep. Ehlers presented RS 30419. This concurrent resolution relates to the

approval of fee and non-fee rules of the Department of Insurance.

MOTION: Rep. Dixon (1) made a motion to introduce RS 30419. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 30535: Rep. Furniss presented RS 30535, which repeals the fee for release of liability

statements when the transaction is filed electronically. This legislation fixes the VIN matching bill passed four years ago. It is expected to reduce the number of notices

sent by 30 to 50 percent and focus on catching real violators.

MOTION: Rep. Necochea made a motion to introduce RS 30535. Motion carried by voice

vote.

RS 30572: Rep. Dixon (1) presented RS 30572, relating to initiatives and referendum

signature gatherers. It will require paid signature gatherers to register with the

Secretary of State and complete training.

MOTION: Rep. Blanksma made a motion to introduce RS 30572.

Responding to a question from the committee, **Rep. Dixon (1)** stated the registration and training requirements are intended for paid signature gatherers only, but he would be amenable to changing the training requirement to include all signature gatherers if the committee suggested doing so. The committee declined.

VOTE ON Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Burns requested to be recorded as voting

MOTION: NAY.

RS 30561: Rep. Boyle presented RS 30561. This memorial solidifies Idaho's opposition to

proposed Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) water quality standards based on 19th century tribal treaties. The proposed rules will circumvent Idaho's scientifically

established water quality standards previously approved by the EPA.

Rep. Blanskma requested the fiscal note be updated to ensure it meets Senate

scrutiny.

MOTION: Rep. Blanksma made a motion to introduce RS 30561. Motion carried by voice

vote. Reps. Necochea and Burns requested to be recorded as voting NAY.
