	Chairman Weber called the meeting to order at 12:43 p.m.
MOTION:	Rep. Dixon (1) made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 17, 2023 meeting. Motion carried by voice vote.
MOTION:	Rep. Blanksma made a motion to introduce RS 30713 and RS 30725 and recommend they be sent directly to the Second Reading Calendar. Motion carried by voice vote. Rep. Mitchell will sponsor RS 30713 and Rep. Hawkins will sponsor RS 30725 on the floor.
RS 30742:	Rep. Pickett presented RS 30742 , relating to herd districts. Idaho is a fence out state. The purpose of the proposed legislation is to remove civil liability for damage created when livestock stray from open range into a herd district.
MOTION:	Rep. Manwaring made a motion to introduce RS 30742. Motion carried by voice vote.
RS 30747:	Rep. Manwaring presented RS 30747 , regarding judicial salaries. It sets the salary for the Supreme Court justices at a three percent increase and changes the differential between the levels of judges within the state court system. The total fiscal impact is \$1,965,700, but there was a remaining fund balance from the previous year, so the budget reflects an overall increase of approximately \$800,000.
	A discrepancy between the SOP and RS regarding the amount of the Supreme Court justices salary was noted.
MOTION:	Rep. Blanksma made a motion to introduce RS 30747. Motion carried by voice vote.
ADJOURN:	There being no further business to come before the committee, the meeting adjourned at 12:50 p.m.
