2	RELATING TO THE IDAHO DIETARY SUPPLEMENT ACT; AMENDING TITLE 37, IDAHO CODE,
3	BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW CHAPTER 35, TITLE 37, IDAHO CODE, TO PROVIDE A
4	SHORT TITLE, TO PROVIDE THAT THE PRODUCTION, MARKETING, DISTRIBUTION,
5	SALE, AND USE OF DIETARY SUPPLEMENTS IN COMPLIANCE WITH CERTAIN LAWS AND
5	REGULATIONS SHALL BE LEGAL IN IDAHO AND TO DEFINE A TERM; AND DECLARING
7	AN EMERGENCY AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
3	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:
9	SECTION 1. That Title 37, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended
10	by the addition thereto of a $\underline{\mathtt{NEW}}$ CHAPTER, to be known and designated as Chap-
11	ter 35, Title 37, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:
12	CHAPTER 35
13	IDAHO DIETARY SUPPLEMENT ACT
14	37-3501. SHORT TITLE. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as
15	the "Idaho Dietary Supplement Act."
16	37-3502. LEGAL STATUS OF DIETARY SUPPLEMENTS IN IDAHO. (1) For pur-
17	poses of this section, "dietary supplement" means a product that intends to
18	supplement the diet that:
19	(a) Bears or contains one (1) or more of the following dietary ingredients:
20 21	(i) A vitamin;
22	(ii) A mineral;
23	(iii) An herb or other botanical;
24	(iv) An amino acid;
25	(v) A dietary substance for use by a person to supplement the diet
26	by increasing the total dietary intake; or
27	(vi) A concentrate, metabolite, constituent, extract, or combi-
28	nation of any ingredient listed in this subsection;
29	(b) Is intended for ingestion in tablet, capsule, powder, softgel, gel-
30	cap, or liquid form;
31	(c) If not intended for ingestion in any form pursuant to paragraph (b)
32	of this subsection, is not represented as conventional food and is not
33	represented for use as a sole item of a meal or of the diet;
34	(d) Is labeled as a dietary supplement; and
35	(e) Does not contain any component applicable to the prevention, treat-
36	ment, or cure of a disease or condition of Homo sapiens, including any

derivative, allergenic product, protein, or analogous product. (2) The production, marketing, distribution, sale, and use of dietary supplements shall be legal in the state of Idaho in compliance with appli-

virus, therapeutic serum, toxin, antitoxin, blood, blood component or

cable federal law and regulations as of July 1, 2023, notwithstanding any amendment, repeal, or addition made to federal law or regulations applicable to dietary supplements subsequent to July 1, 2023.

SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2024.
