8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 3, Title 50, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 50-347, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 50-347. THREATS TO PUBLIC HEALTH AND SAFETY. (1) The legislature finds that cities possess broad powers to protect public health, safety, and welfare under the constitution of the state of Idaho and pursuant to the laws of this chapter. It is the intent of the legislature to recognize a city's authority to limit the operation of certain sites that pose a clear threat to the public health and safety and that would unduly attract subversive threats while providing for a reasonable check-and-balance on those broad powers.
- (2) Cities may declare by resolution any site a clear threat to public health and safety if, in the opinion of the city council, any expansion of the current operations on the site would pose such a threat to the public health and safety and would unduly attract subversive threats to the public health and safety. A resolution declaring a site a clear threat to public health and safety may declare a moratorium on any expansion of operations identified in the resolution.
- (3) Approval of a resolution provided for in this section shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the city council at or following a public hearing on the matter.
- SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after July 1, 2024.
